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


Getting away from the television and other devices for a day or so and having some quality time as a family unit should be a top of the list item before we enter the hectic holiday season.

Preachers Talk About Christianity. Queen Elizabeth Went Out And Lived It

Christmas lunch, for many British families, has regularly concluded with everyone gathering around the television to hear the Queen's annual message to the nation and the Commonwealth.

About twenty years ago it was widely reported that some of Her Majesty's advisors had suggested to her that, now that Britain was home to many different religious traditions, she might want to play down the specifically Christian aspect of her message.

The Queen's response was robust. That Christmas she was more explicit than ever. The Jesus whose birth we celebrate, she said, and his teaching, have been my companion and guide throughout my life, and with his help we can go forward into another year. Or words to that effect.

I remember staring at the television in surprise and delight. She had preached the Gospel to an audience of millions. She had completely outflanked the fussy, compromised political correctness of the time, both by what she said and by how she said it.

The second is just as important as the first. Her Majesty spoke with calm, humble assurance. She wasn't talking about herself, but about the Jesus she knew and served. She cherished and valued the millions around the world – people of very different cultures and traditions – who looked to her for leadership. But her own leader was Jesus, and she wasn't shy about saying so.

And it is crystal clear, as we look back with gratitude on her extraordinarily long life and reign, what it meant for her to follow Jesus. It didn't mean bombastic dogmatism, laying down the law. It meant humility, faithfulness, steadfast commitment, selfless service to others.

She gave of herself to people of all sorts, with genuine interest and concern, with humor and grace. We sometimes speak of "a long obedience in the same direction". Well, how long is "long"? Will seventy years of unswerving devotion do? I should say so.

Her own personal spirituality was deep and heartfelt, unfussy and unshowy. She got to know Billy Graham on one of his early visits to the UK, and it wouldn't surprise me if he helped to draw out into more explicit form the personal faith which she had from her early days.

Later, in the 1970s and 1980s, one of her "chaplains" – clergy on whom she would call for advice



and spiritual wisdom – was the Reverend John Stott, perhaps the best known evangelical leader of that time. But, as in political life, Queen Elizabeth stood well back from church parties and controversies.

Her own preferred style of worship was that of the traditional Anglican – neither "high-church" nor "low-church," but focused on the Bible, especially the Psalms and the Gospels, and on the Prayer Book.

I remember her expressing surprise when, at a large service in Westminster Abbey, most of the congregation received communion standing up. For her, kneeling was a vital sign of her humble devotion to Jesus.

I suspect that many forthcoming obituaries will list her interests and achievements and then add, as a kind of footnote, something about her personal faith. That's how many like to see Christianity: an added extra, a little religious hobby, off on the side. But that would be profoundly untrue to Queen Elizabeth II.

Everything else she did, including her vibrant love of life, of horses and dogs, of the countryside, of family and friends, was shaped and colored by her being first and foremost a follower of Jesus.

To follow Jesus is to affirm and celebrate the goodness of God's creation in all its aspects, even while grieving – as she often had to do – over a world groaning in travail, awaiting God's ultimate new creation. And the sheer hard work of the Head of State – all those red boxes, all those meetings, official occasions, endless streams of people to see, people to be encouraged, congratulated, consoled, advised – that work was her faithful service, not just to her people – though she loved them, and that was obvious, which is why we loved her back – but to her Lord.

Many years ago I heard a sermon explaining why, in Jesus' parable, the workers in the vineyard all got paid the same wage, despite their very different day's work. They all alike, said the preacher, came when they were called; they went where they were sent; and they did what they were told.

Queen Elizabeth found herself called, at a young age and a challenging time. She offered herself, her life, in response. And she did what she was told, following Jesus' command and example into a life of humble, faithful service.

We preachers talk a lot about Christianity. She got on and did it. Thank God for Queen Elizabeth.

Grace is the most outrageous lavish gift a human being could receive and it's ours for the asking. While I highly recommend everyone seek the medical treatment, godly counsel, and support we need here on earth, nothing compares to the power of GRACE. Grace covers

Can What I Say On Facebook Cause Me Legal Problems?

"I can't believe I was fired from my job over simply expressing my personal views about the outcome of the election," exclaimed a client who recently called our office to inquire whether her employer could really get away with this. Presently our firm represents several individuals in five states, all of whom were terminated from



career-long positions over comments they posted on their private Facebook pages. We could never have predicted such an influx of cases even three years ago.

Platforms like Facebook, Twitter and other social media have become the modern public square in which individuals freely express often diverse views on public issues affecting their local communities and the nation. The Supreme Court, in Packingham v. North Carolina, recognized that social media, like all forms of free speech is protected by "a fundamental First Amendment principle" that all persons have access to places where they can speak. But Packingham addressed whether government may restrict access to social media. What about private employers? May they impose such restrictions on their employees who seek to exercise this right during off-duty time?

Many employers today have social media policies that broadly proscribe certain types of expression by their employees, even during their off hours. Unwary employees are increasingly finding themselves ensnared by these policies, particularly when their comments run counter to the prevailing mainstream narrative on a given issue. The following are just a few examples of employees whom we are representing that lost their jobs over Facebook posts: A nurse in North Carolina commented "All lives matter and BLM is a political trick to upset a group of people to riot and terrorize!" An anesthetist in Florida remarked on her Facebook: "These acts [referring to Antifa] are not all about injustice and racism. The devil incarnate is out in the form of rioters and assaulters." A state employee in Tennessee criticized a state policy calling for the early release of drug offenders in response to the Covid-19 crisis by stating: "The Governor is forbidding parole officers to put parolees in jail for unlimited drug abuse." The director of a library in Kentucky was fired for posting: "The concept of race is not biblical. There are not higher races and lower races of people. There is only ONE race, the human race."

In many of these cases, the employer would never have known of the employee's Facebook post had others, who negatively reacted to it, not contacted them. The practice of attacking another on the basis of one's disagreement with their social media remarks is called "doxing". Doxing is defined as the act of searching for and publishing private or identifying information about a particular individual on the internet, typically with malicious intent of bringing about their termination.

A New Season

I recently celebrated a birthday and with a new year, I have been meditating on the following scripture: Psalms 92:12-14 (TLB) "But the godly will flourish like palm trees and grow like the cedars of Lebanon. For they are transplanted in the Lord's house. They flourish in the courts of our God. Even in old age, they still produce fruit; they will remain vital and green".



Upon further study, I found deeper truths, so I have made this my banner for my new year! The godly are compared to two amazing trees. The first tree is a palm tree. Did you know that every part of the palm tree is useful?

The palm leaves can be used for the treatment of cancer, cardiovascular disease, kidney disease and wound healing. The sap contains healing properties as well. The palm oil is the most popular produce from the tree and can be used for frying and cooking. It can also be used for the manufacturing of cosmetics, soaps, toothpaste, and more. Because the wood is fibrous, it can be pulled apart and woven together to produce thatched roof coverings, and logs for bridges. The fiber can also be woven to make carpet, wall coverings, practical household items, and furniture. Not only are palm trees a vital resource, but they are also beautiful to look at. 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Medicare Open Enrollment Starts Soon

Yes, it has come around again and soon your mailbox, email, and TV commercials will be telling you that open enrollment is here! So, let's take a look at what Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) is all about. If you have a Medicare Advantage Plan or a prescription drug plan (PDP) this is the time of year you get to review how those plans have done for you. You will be receiving from your plan's carrier toward the end of September a letter called the ANOC letter (annual notice of change). It will tell you what the changes on your plan will be for 2023. Remember to open this letter from your carrier and not put it in file 13!

If you don't do mail, then hop on your computer beginning October 1st you will be able to log on to Medicare.gov and check out your plan there. You may also see your plans info in the 2023 Medicare&You that will be mailed to you. It's available

on their website but does not have local information on plans/carriers.





The open enrollment

signing period is October 15th through December 7th. If you decide to make any changes your new plan will start January 1, 2023. If you don't make any changes then your current plan will roll into 2023 and you don't have to do a thing!

Suggestion – call your Medicare Rep and dis-

cuss next year's plan with him or her! Every year we must get recertified with Medicare and the carriers to be able to offer suggestions as to what would be the best route for you in 2023. We are blessed to have such a great healthcare system in middle Tenn. and that attracts many companies that want to do business here. I believe there will be several new carriers/plans available. Remember this is about your healthcare coverage for next year. It's worth taking a look! And this time next year – we get to do it all over again!

A "Chosen" Profession: Trevecca Graduate Helps Bring Groundbreaking Series To Life

The Chosen is what many in the entertainment industry might describe as an unlikely success story. It's a streaming series about the life of Jesus and those who encountered him during his years of ministry. What's remarkable is how the show has steadily raised unprecedented funds while also accruing a massive fanbase, becoming the largest crowdfunded TV series project in

history. Working behind the scenes on The Chosen is the show's first assistant director, Trevecca Nazarene University alumnus Adam Drake. "Trevecca is where I discovered what I really enjoy," said Drake. "It was the perfect community to help me find what I wanted to do."

As an undergraduate student at Trevecca, Drake began acting and eventually landed roles in music videos and commercials. Through an internship he learned how to shoot and edit videos. Later, through Trevecca, he took advantage of an opportunity to study at the Los Angeles Film Studies Center. There, he discovered he wanted to be part of the film industry. His interest in film became more than just a creative outlet or passion. At Trevecca, he discovered it was a calling. "When I was a junior and really getting into film, the Lord spoke to me and said, 'This is your mission field," said Drake. "There is nothing that has a bigger impact on our culture than television and media.



I want to be an example of Christ to the people on set and I knew that space could be a mission field just like if I was going overseas." After years of acting and filming, he discovered that the position of first assistant director fit well with his natural talents. In that role, his task is to keep

the production running smoothly. "I'm

basically an on-site producer for logistics. I keep everything moving efficiently because in this business time is money and everything is very expensive," said Drake. "It is my job to limit those expenses and make us as successful and safe as possible."

By 2021, The Chosen viewers had contributed upward of \$40 million to its filming and production. The show has garnered 300 million views internationally, with 30 percent of those views coming from outside the United States. However, Drake was a part of the show since its inception and was integral to its production from day one. "I was there from the very beginning before anyone knew what it was. I read the scripts and was impressed," said Drake. "I remember wondering, 'This is incredible, but can we actually pull this off?' I knew that if the acting wasn't there or the production design wasn't there, it wouldn't work." It did work, but at times it has been difficult to film a production of this size. This is especially true with scenes involving large

groups in an expansive setting—like



the recent filming of the feeding of the 5,000 which will air in an episode of season three. "That was the most challenging week we have ever had for The Chosen. We had thousands of extras and it was 105 degrees in Texas, where we were filming. People were passing out from heat exhaustion," said Drake. "It is my job to handle all of those logistics and to keep everyone safe. It was probably one of the biggest challenges I've ever had as a first assistant director."

Despite the difficulties, Drake finds his work rewarding. The Chosen has proved to be more than just a good story—it has touched people around the world. "The show aligns with my beliefs as a Christian, which is huge. Being able to be a part of something that is changing lives is more rewarding than just making a great show," said Drake. "It has a dual impact. It is well done and well produced and it's also really speaking to people and impacting the world. That never gets old."

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Preventing Falls: 5 Warning Signs of Mobility Issues with Older Adults

When an older adult takes a fall and breaks a hip or develops a health condition like Parkinson's disease, it's clear that they'll be dealing with mobility issues – even if they're temporary. But it's not just disease or injury that leads to difficulty standing and walking. The natural effects of aging like muscle loss, balance issues, and joint stiffness all contribute to loss of mobility. However, your older adult doesn't have to wait for a fall to find out that they're developing mobility issues.

There are warning signs that can indicate potential or developing mobility problems. Being aware and noticing these signs helps

you take steps to improve your older adult's balance and strength before something happens. This helps them stay as mobile and independent for as long as possible.

Here are 5 key mobility warning signs to watch out for. 1. Falling

Even if your older adult seems to have bones of steel and never seriously hurts themselves when they fall, they could still be having mobility problems that need to be addressed before they get worse. Even as few as two falls in a year could indicate that something other than uneven walkways or cluttered environments is a problem. People fall when they trip and stumble on something, but also when their feet are slow to keep up (and drag on the floor) or when they get off-balance and can't correct their body position in time. Frequent falls increase the risk for injury, hospitalization, and life-threatening complications. So even if your older adult hasn't been seriously injured (yet), fall-proofing their home with grab bars, handrails on stairs, non-slip tub mats, etc. is highly recommended. It's also important to ask their doctor to evaluate their

mobility. The doctor can check for health conditions that could be causing problems, look for negative medication side effects, or recommend physical therapy to build balance and strength.

2. Avoiding the stairs

Is your older adult quick to say "Let's take the elevator" when you encounter even a small staircase while out and about? Do you notice them spending more time than usual downstairs in their home? Stairs are can be extra tough for seniors to travel up and down because they require extra strength, balance, and energy. If your older adult seems to walk around fairly easily, but goes out of their way to limit their use of stairs, you may want to start talking with them about whether they need extra help or a mobility aid.

If they don't have any physical difficulties that are making stairs challenging, it could be that a fear of falling is holding them back.

Finding ways to address those concerns will have a positive impact on their long-term mobility.

3. Having difficulty with sitting and standing

Is standing up from the couch a struggle for your older adult? How about





lowering themselves into bed? Having trouble with sitting and standing is a strong indicator of potential mobility issues. It's an essential movement in daily life – used when eating a meal, using the restroom, upon waking and sleeping, and more. Try the quick and simple sit-to-stand exercise with your older adult and notice if they have any difficulties. Do they need to hold on to furniture for support? Are they slow or unsteady? Being aware of a seemingly harmless warning sign like these tells you that it's necessary to talk with their doctor. You may want to ask about issues like lightheadedness or dizziness that happens when they stand up or sit down or ask about

strength and balance exercises.

4. Having trouble with balance

Dizziness and having trouble with balance can be caused by a variety of factors including medication side effects, low blood pressure, or inner ear issues like vertigo or Meniere's disease. In addition, issues associated with normal aging like impaired vision, joint stiffness, slower reaction times, and muscle weakness reduce the body's ability to stay balanced. They can make walking, standing, and exercising difficult. To improve mobility, your older adult's doctor can test their balance and treat underlying problems. Mobility aids like canes or walkers and targeted exercises can help an older adult with balance issues and allow them to get around more safely and confidently.

5. Skipping exercise

Exercise isn't everyone's favorite activity, but it's a necessary lifestyle habit that helps prevent chronic diseases and unhealthy weight gain, especially for seniors. But if your older adult is skipping exercise more and more because

they're tired, sore, or simply don't have the energy, they may soon be dealing with mobility issues as well. Weakness, exhaustion, and other symptoms that keep them from exercising will make it increasingly difficult to walk or stand as much as they once did.

Super Bowl winning coach Tony Dungy and his wife Lauren believe that anyone can find a meaningful purpose and make a difference in other people's lives through God's direction.

It may seem like that's something easy for Dungy to proclaim. After all, he had great success as head coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Indianapolis Colts, went on to a prolific career in broadcasting, and was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. He and his wife stress, though, that all Christians have a life purpose, whether their sphere of influence

is large or small. The Dungys share their wisdom on the topic in the just-released *Uncommon Influence: Saying Yes to a Purposeful Life* (Tyndale House Publishers), a book that presents practical and spiritual tactics to create lasting change in a Christian's life, career, ministry, and family.

Living a Life of Purpose. Most people, according to Dungy, don't think they make a real difference in life. "People think, 'I could never have an impact on people,' but we began to think about other people who've had an impact on our lives and it made us realize that they may have never known what they did for us," he said. "We had this idea to inspire people to think about what they can do." The couple wrote the book, which they describe as one with a "mixed voice" based on their different experiences and expertise, with several goals in mind including:

• To demonstrate the importance of saying yes when God places opportunities in your path.

• To provide counsel on being available to the possibilities that come from God (which leads to fulfillment and contentment).

• To share stories of their path of service, specifically in the areas of adoption and foster care.

• To teach that the only way to know a life of true fulfillment is to give that life away.

"We wanted to share our life experiences from the more than 40 years we've been married," Lauren Dungy said. "We share about our experiences with kids, fostering, and adoption and how we've used that platform. And then we stress that everyone has a platform. Some are small and some are large, but you have to use it to glorify God." She stressed that a Christian's platform "doesn't have to be in front of 50,000 people or on television." It can be in a community or in a family. Part of their knowledge, she added, comes from guiding people to find out how to discover what their platform may be-since many people are starting at ground zero. Prayer, she said, is integral. "You have to pray about it, and wait to hear from God," she said. "We prayed and communicated with God about our desires, and we heard the answer that this is where God wanted us."

Additionally, Tony said, those who want to find their areas of influence should consider where their interests, talents, and passions lie. "What do you enjoy? What is your passion?" he advised people to ask themselves. "God gives us the desire of our heart, but we need to know what that looks like."

In writing the book, they each focused on topics and experiences they had special knowledge of; they each point to favorite chapters. Lauren points to her chapter on prayer, which recounts her understanding of prayer from an early age. "That chapter's powerful to me because I learned at an early age that praying for wisdom and direction are so important," she said, "My mother was injured in a terrible grease fire when I was young, and I learned from that how simple prayers can help in even terrifying experiences." Tony points to his chapter on "going against the grain," which he said can be especially powerful for Christian men. "Society tells us what masculinity is all about," he said, "but you must be yourself and not follow the crowd. As a Christian we have to go against the grain of what our culture may tell us to do."

A Shared Faith and Passion. Tony and Lauren both came to faith at an early age and were already believing Christians when they married. At the time, Tony coached for the Pittsburgh Steelers and Lauren was a teacher. They quickly realized that their platform was more than they'd imagined. "I had 30 players, she had 30 students, so we had a built-in influence," he said. "And as we grew in our experiences with the Lord, we

began a beautiful, lifelong journey that included experiences with children, foster children, and adoption," she added. "We know that nothing is a coincidence and that God brought us to this place."

Today Lauren uses her teaching background in her work as an early childhood educational specialist and vice president of the Dungy Family Foundation. Tony became the Buccaneers' coach in 1996 and led the team to four playoff appearances in six seasons, then served as head coach for Indianapolis for seven seasons (making the playoffs each year and winning the Super Bowl in 2006); he was the first black coach to win the NFL championship. He retired after the 2008 season, served as an analyst for NBC's "Football Night in America," and was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2016.

As each of their careers changed, the couple prayed about where their focus needed to be. "We were looking at our lives. I'd retired from the NFL, was working some in television," Dungy recalled. "We asked ourselves: What is our purpose now? What can I do in my community to make a difference?" Lauren said that it's important for Christians to realize that platforms and

opportunities can change over a lifetime, depending on what stage of your journey you're in. "We have different seasons of life, and our platforms can change. And you can have more than one," she said. "Tony retired, I stopped teaching, and we believe our influence is with children."

The Dungys have 11 children (three living biological children, seven adopted children, and their oldest son who committed suicide in 2005); they also currently have five foster children. They originally learned about the fostering opportunity from their church and have fostered children since the beginning of their marriage. It's an experience, they both agreed, that can truly change a child's life. "We look at these children and we don't know where they came from or what their background is. We don't know what their fear is," Dungy said. "But in ten minutes they expect you to help them, and you realize that you can help them."

The fostering experience–and the years of parenting their own sons and daughters–has taught the Dungys a variety of lessons about what children want and need. "All children want love," Lauren Dungy said. "They want to be poured into and listened to. They want to be given the gift of time. And you have to be intentional about it. You have to ask yourself: Did I give them the time they needed? Did I support them? Did I listen to them?" Ultimately, she said, much of their efforts came down to prayer. "All children need to be prayed over and prayed with so that they can have their own faith and develop their own relationship with God," she said.

Sharing Their Faith. The Dungys' faith has become well known and documented over the years, as they have both been comfortable in sharing their convictions with the public. Their Dungy Family Foundation is designed to "meet the physical, educational, and spiritual needs of their community," and they both serve in various Christian ministries and at their Tampa Bay area church.

Their testimony, though, is something they say they've grown into-as it's become easier to share their faith as the years have gone by. Dungy said that he can speak from a faith standpoint when it comes to sharing his opinions-whether it's while doing football analysis or speaking to a large audience-and Lauren stresses that a Christian testimony should be natural. "We can incorporate our faith into everyday life," Lauren Dungy stated. "We don't become a Christian once the TV turns off or we come home from work. We want to live our lives, and for our faith to be integral in every part of it. It needs to become natural."

Ultimately, that witness intertwines with a Christian's platform or sphere of influence to make a real and tangible difference in others' lives. "We may not even realize what a difference we can make," Dungy said, "but as Christians, we must say yes to the opportunities God puts in front of us."



They're at the stage where they need answers to their questions, especially as peers, teachers and employers challenge their childhood beliefs. Christianity and science start to seem more opposed to each other than they are in agreement.

To help your teens better understand and defend their faith, tell them about three mind-blowing scientific discoveries of the 20th century that strongly point to an intelligent designer. These discoveries will affirm and support their belief in God.

The good news? Your teens don't have to ditch science to follow God! By pursuing the evidence for God, they will be "*prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks [them] for a reason for the hope that is in [them]*" (1 Peter 3:15)

The Universe, Christianity, and Science

In Return of the God Hypothesis, geophysicist Stephen C. Meyer tells the story of a group of astronomers and physicists who discovered the universe had a beginning. By studying the light from distant galaxies, they established that the universe was expanding, like a gradually inflating balloon. This also suggested a finite universe with a beginning.

Some people had difficulty accepting this revolutionary idea. The famous German physicist Albert Einstein was one of them. Einstein was committed to an eternal, self-existent universe model. So he chose an arbitrary value for his cosmological constant (one that had no physical justification). However, evidence and analysis by other mathematicians and physicists (Willem de Sitter, Aleksandr Friedmann, Georges Lemaître) would force his hand and cause him to acknowledge the necessity of a "beginning." He later said that his arbitrary value for the cosmological constant was the greatest blunder of his professional life.

That is, Einstein eventually owned up to his error and accepted the reality of an expanding universe that began with a sudden explosion of energy. The idea quickly became known as the Big Bang theory. Today, this theory is still the most widely accepted explanation our universe's origin. Despite the lack of evidence, the Big Bang Theory presents a unique opportunity for conversations about Christianity and science. In fact, many Christians also say it lines up well with the account in Genesis 1:1: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth."

A Carbon Problem

After scientists realized the universe had a beginning, they soon discovered that it was also finely tuned for life. Many properties of the universe are set within extremely narrow parameters that prove essential for life and our existence. Scientists also noticed that the initial distribution of matter and energy at the birth of the universe was just right to make life possible.

Astrophysicist Sir Fred Hoyle discovered many of these finely tuned factors as he tried to figure out how carbon, the life-essential element, became so abundant. Hoyle realized how unlikely it was that carbon would arise naturally in a growing universe, given the limitations of chemistry.

His work eventually forced him to reject his atheistic belief. As he put it, "A common-sense interpretation of the facts suggest that a super-intellect has



monkeyed with physics." Culture offers countless creative ideas to explain away this remarkable fine-tuning. But none of them explains the evidence pointing to an intelligently designed planet.

The Digital Code

It's undeniable. The universe had a beginning. Moreover, its beginning communicates a creative, divine consideration for human life. But there's more! In 1953, scientists made a third breakthrough discovery that supports belief in God.

Two molecular biologists—James Watson and Francis Crick—discovered that DNA stores information in digital code. Then, they found that this code transmits precise instructions to cells for building important cellular stuff (aka proteins). The information in DNA isn't simply mathematical. Scientists call it specified because it has a precise message sequence that cells can decode. The million-dollar question: Where does this information come from? Many scientists believe an evolutionary mechanism is responsible, but the simple "sorting" process of natural selection has its limits. DNA sequences that create functional proteins are very rare, so the chance of mutation and selection producing one randomly is slim.

Let's apply a little reasoning to this evidence. In our everyday experience, we know of just one cause that can produce digital code or specified information: intelligence. So we have good scientific reasons to believe that an intelligence added large amounts of information into our biosphere at key points in the history of the universe, including at the beginning and as new biological life began.

Final Thoughts on Reconciling Christianity and Science

This only scratches the surface of faith-science discussions you can have with your teens. Help your teen know compelling scientific evidence sustains belief in God. Finally, you can help strengthen your children's faith through your consistent support and love. Commit to giving your teens the confidence they need to defend their faith.

How To Clean an Ice Chest or Any Cooler With Stains

Most cooler stains result from food labels and packaging getting soaked by melting ice. This can cause ink and dye to leach out and stain the inside of your cooler. The best way to clean a stained cooler is to use vinegar. Here's how to do it:



- Rinse your cooler with a hose or sink hand sprayer.
- Mix a solution of one-part white vinegar to two parts water in the cooler.
- Use a rag to scrub the stained area.
- Empty the cooler and rinse inside and out.
- Leave the cooler open to air-dry outdoors.

You may need to repeat this process a few times to remove the stain completely. You might also consider trying lemon juice instead of vinegar if the stain hasn't improved. The acidity of the lemon may be more effective against certain types of colors.

We do not recommend cleaning your cooler with bleach unless it's absolutely necessary. Bleach can be dangerous to use in any setting that may expose it to food stored in your cooler if it's not completely rinsed away.

How to Get Rid of a Bad Smell In a Cooler

If your cooler smells like fish, mildew, or rotten food, you're not going to enjoy your picnic. The easiest way to remove a strong odor in your cooler is to put baking soda to work! Here's how.

- Rinse your cooler with a hose or sink hand sprayer.
- Mix a solution of ¼ cup baking soda and one cup water.
- Scrub the inside of the cooler with a rag or sponge using the baking soda solution.
- Let your cooler sit with the solution inside for 1-3 days.
- Rinse your cooler thoroughly and leave the cooler open to air-dry out-doors.

It can be a good idea to clean your cooler if you've been storing any kind of meat or fish in it. This can prevent harmful bacteria from growing in your cooler and possibly contaminating foods the next time you use it.



In the course of doing a daily radio show, a lot of information comes across my desk, much of it having to do with diet, health and exercise. Here's just a sampling of some recent reports.

Fitbit Doesn't Bite

If you can't seem to find the motivation to get up and move, new research out of Australia in the Lancet Digital Health, reports it may be worth investing in a fitness tracker, smart watch, or pedometer. There's a connection between wearable activity trackers, exercising more, and losing weight. The study finds these tracking devices encourage people to walk up to 40 minutes more per day (roughly 1,800 more steps).



This results in an average weight loss of 2.2 pounds over the course of five months.

Crunchy Fat Blaster

Want to lose weight an easy way? Munch on cucumbers daily. You can shed up to 4 pounds without dieting. According to India's Phytochemistry Research Lab, scientists say compounds in cucumber steady blood sugar and kills hunger pains and cravings.

Plastic Purge

Plastic water bottles are not good for the environment. And now we find that plastic water bottles aren't good for you, either. According to an article in *Woman's World* magazine, swapping your plastic water bottle for a glass or metal one prevents exposure to compounds that can make you gain weight.

A Simple Framework for Healthy Kids

I believe that one of the main reasons many of us have struggled with health is that we never built a foundation when we are young. During the most important years of brain development, no one taught us how to create healthy habits in health.

We may have been taught how to throw a ball in gym

class or play a sport. But those things were centralized around someone else. A sport you had to show up for. A class you needed to complete to graduate. But after that season was over you weren't prepared in any way with habits that apply to any season of life. Don't get me wrong, I love sports and games in school. I believe it is crucial to building character and hard work habits, BUT it is just one piece of health. In order to change the health trends in the church and in America, we must equip the next generations with simple habits they can use throughout their whole life.

We have a very simple system that breaks down health into 4 main areas. By helping our kids understand each of these areas of health we can help to raise them up to better serve God and others. They may even impact you as well.

Pillar 1: Functional Fitness. Our bodies were made to move. If we partner with how our bodies were made by getting functional movement several times each week our bodies will function in the way they were designed. This may be a sport, a workout, or a walk. Whatever it is, just have them get up off the couch and get moving.

Pillar 2: Optimal Nourishment. Food is for fueling our bodies. But it is also for enjoying some of the time as well. If we can help our kids hunger for the right things when it comes to nutrition, they will continue to hunger for

those things throughout their adult life. This means eating whole, natural, and quality foods most of the time. In our F.O.R.M. curriculum, we have a simple framework for what you need to get with each meal for it to be complete. 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


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Dr. Ming Wang: A Common Ground Seeker

The film *Sight* describes the fascinating life story of Dr. Ming Wang (Harvard & MIT (MD, magna cum laude); PhD (laser physics), a world-class laser eye surgeon, philanthropist and a community activist. It is based on Dr. Wang's autobiography *From Darkness to Sight* and co-stars Greg Kinnear.

Wang grew up in Hangzhou, China. The Cultural Revolution (1966-1976) caused the closure of all universities across the country and ended Wang's education. The government deported the country's youth to labor camps in rural areas. Over 10 years of Cultural Revolution, they sent away 20 million youth for a lifetime of poverty and hard labor. In 1974, as a 14-year-old 9th grader, Wang had to leave school with no hope of ever being able to return. Attempting to avoid deportation by getting a job with the government's song-and-dance propaganda troop,

Wang learned to play the erhu, a Chinese violin, and practiced dancing.

The Cultural Revolution ended in 1976, and the government began to reopen universities. To have a chance of entering a university, Wang had to jump 3 years ahead and re-enter the school as a 12th grader, having never studied in the 10th, 11th and 12th grades, and had to compete against other 12th graders for the 1% chance of getting into college (only 1% of the 12th graders could get into college in 1976, the first year that China reopened its university after 10 years of closure). Wang's parents did everything that they could to help him. Wang studied hard and passed the university entrance exam in the top 0.01%, and was accepted into the prestigious University of Science and Technology of China, and in 1982, Wang stepped off a plane in Washington, D.C. with only \$50, a student visa and a Chinese-English dictionary. Since then, he has earned two doctorate degrees, one in laser physics and one in medicine, and graduated magna cum laude with the highest honors from Harvard Medical School and MIT.

Wang came to Nashville in 1997 as the founding director of Vanderbilt's Laser Eye Center, and he founded the Wang Vision Institute in 2002. He performed the world's first laser artificial cornea implantation and has performed well over 55,000 procedures (including on over 4,000 doctors). He published an article in the world-renowned journal *Nature*, as well as more than 100 other scientific papers and 10 textbooks. Dr. Wang holds several U.S. patents for his invention of a biotechnology to restore sight, was chosen to be NPR's Philanthropist of the Year, and received the Honor Award from the American Academy of Ophthalmology and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Association of Chinese Amer-

ican Physicians.

Dr. Wang founded a non-profit charity, the Wang Foundation for Sight Restoration, which to date has helped patients from over 40 states in the U.S. and 55 countries, with all sight restoration surgeries performed free-of-charge. He was named the Kiwanis Nashvillian of the Year for his lifelong dedication to helping blind orphan children from around the world.

Wang is also passionate about another type of vision as well, i.e., helping people find common ground in a polarized world. With Dr. Rice Broocks (the author of the *God's Not Dead* book series, which has been made into a film series, in which the Chinese student's story is inspired by Dr. Wang's life story. Dr. Wang established a non-profit "Common Ground Network", to study and teach the methods of how to find com-

mon ground an unprecedented polarized and divided nation today. They have published two common ground books:

The *Common Ground Bible Study* describes the 5 STEPS how to find common ground, i.e., S(ee) the common ground, T(rade) places, E(mpathy), P(erseverance) and S(eek) common ground. The common ground-seeking STEPS have been inspired by the life and teaching of Christ.

The *Sight Bible Study* describes the 5 "seeing beyond" messages from the film *Sight*, i.e., seeing beyond our pain, our circumstance, ourselves, our own cultures and polarization.


Later this year, Dr. Broocks and Ming will publish their 3rd common ground book, *The Common Ground Mandate*, which says that as Christians, we have a mandate from Christ to be the common ground seekers. The Bible says: "Blessed are the peace-makers"!

Dr. Wang believes that faith and science also have common ground. The film *Sight* tells the story of the invention of the amniotic membrane contact lens (AMCL). AMCL has now been used by tens of thousands of eye doctors around the world in nearly every nation and millions of patients have had their eye sight restored.

National Hispanic Pastors Alliance Gathers in DC

September 21 and 22 in Washington DC over 300 Hispanic leaders gathered to discuss critical matters of the day. Leaders came from eight states to meet at



the Museum of the Bible Conference Center. The event theme was "Standing for our Values." Sponsors included the Family Research Council, Betterman, Philos Project, Alliance Defending Freedom, InPeace, Christian Center for Public Life and the Museum of the Bible. He worked for Promise Keepers for over 12 years, reaching and serving the Hispanic community across the country. In 2007, he founded Hombres de Palabra. He was the Washington DC Chapter Director and a board member for the National Hispanic Christian Leadership Conference, representing and advocating for over 30,000 Hispanic churches and organizations. He is an Honorary Board member of the Year of the Responsible Fathers Initiative and a board member of the Volunteers for America of the Chesapeake Area. For the last 20 years he has worked with the churches of Washington DC and has served as the Executive Director for the Evangelical Association of Hispanic Ministers. Carlos gave a NAHPA Leadership Award to John Mendez "for being a pioneer for the Hispanic Christian Church of the United States of America." He also honored Rev. Rafael Guevara, President Iglesias Pentecostales El Shaddai Internacional for being a pioneer in leading pastors to be unified for the Gospel.

Students for Life was one of the many organizations that were present, and they shared about how they are on over 1500 college campuses and how they truly connect with young women and men who are facing an unplanned pregnancy decision. Their organization is very passionate about the choice for life and helping walk alongside women and men by providing friendship, tangible support, connecting to mentors in the community and making sure no college student feels she is alone during this experience. I was very inspired by their passion to speak up and to not shy away from a hard topic that many are afraid to address in our nation. 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




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
