
"Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger by the way you treat them. Rather, bring them up with the discipline and instruction that comes from the Lord." (NLT)



KIDS KORNER

Five Keys to Promote Reading this Summer

"I don't like to read." "Reading is boring."

As a writer and avid reader, these comments by my son wounded my literary soul. We struggled to get him to read, and he stayed below average in his


reading level throughout his elementary school years.

One summer, though, I took my kids to a bookstore and let them pick out whatever they wanted. One of my son's friends had read Where the Red Fern Grows, so he selected that book. A few days later, I heard him crying in his bed. When I asked what was wrong, he showed me that book cover and told me the heart-wrenching ending. I knew we had a breakthrough. Isn't that what we want for our kids—to read not just for knowledge but for pure enjoyment?

Key #1: Make reading fun. What are your child's

interests? Find biographies about people who do those same things. Consider nonfiction on topics of interest. Create cozy nooks, crannies, and hammocks for leisurely reading. As your kids' age and the required reading becomes more strenuous, encourage them to read books for pure delight.

Key #2: Make books accessible. For younger kids, keep books in several places and easy to reach. Place a basket of stories suitable for bedtime next to the bed or on a shelf with books at eye level. Consider giving your teenager a budget for books.



Key #4: Read together. My youngest daughter and I read the Anne of Green Gables and The Little House on the Prairie series. When my son read The Help in school, I read it along with him. We were able to talk about racism and current affairs. Our family would listen to audiobooks on long car rides. We'd ask questions like, "What do you think will happen next?" "How do you think the book will end?" "What do you like or not like about the book?" Without your kids knowing it, you aid reading comprehension and promote critical thinking.



reading. Show interest in the topic. Remember reading a newspaper, magazine, devotional or the Bible is still reading, so ask them what they like about an article or story. Most importantly, cheer them on when they finish a book.



Have You Ever Had a Life Changing Moment?

As she picks up her coat Sue begins to sense a drawing of the Holy Spirit. She felt deep in her heart that God wanted her to start attending this particular church. Sue obeyed the nudge. After she started attending the new church her young daughter met a new friend. That new friendship developed into a lifelong friendship. To this day, as adults they do life together. This lifelong friendship all started with Sue forgetting her coat.

As it turns out Sue's daughter isn't the only one whose life was forever changed by a forgotten coat.



Are You Ready for the Battle?

"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil."

Ephesians 6:10-11.

Can you imagine waking up in a war zone every day knowing the only way to survive the next 24 hours is to fight for survival? Fortunately, we live in a country where that's not a reality. Or do we?

The Bible tells us that we fight against powers and the evil forces of Satan that are relentlessly trying to destroy us (Ephesians 6:12). Many American Christians either don't like to talk about the spiritual warfare that surrounds us or are oblivious to it. But think about this, if the spiritual battle wasn't the most significant war in world history, then there would have been no need for the most significant event in world history: The birth, life, death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The sole reason Jesus entered this world was to defeat our greatest enemy: sin resulting in death. Jesus

advanced on the enemy to claim souls that belong to Him, and He's commanded us to advance in His name to continue that fight.

Are you ready for the battle today? Have you put on the full armor of God? Are you equipped to withstand an assault from Satan against you or your family? Pause now and take a few moments to "be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might." Put on the whole armor of God. Then, wake up and do it again tomorrow and every day after that. That way, you will "be able to stand against the schemes of the devil."

Father's Day: A Reason for Celebration

The first national commemoration for fathers took place in a Sunday sermon at William's Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church South, a small church in Monongah, West Virginia, on July 5, 1908. The sermon was a solemn dedication to 362 men who had perished in the worst coal mining disaster in the nation's history. Over 1,000 children, most of them from immigrant families, lost their fathers in the massive explosion in the Fairmont Coal Company mines on December 6, 1907.

The next year, in Spokane, Washington, a woman named Sonora Smart Dodd, inspired by a Mother's Day sermon in her local church, pushed to establish an official equivalent to Mother's Day for fathers. Raised as one of six children, Sonora held deep admiration and respect for her father. A civil war veteran, he was a single parent to Sonora and her five brothers after her mother died during childbirth. She went to local churches, the YMCA, shopkeepers, and government officials to drum up support for her idea, and was eventually successful: Washington State celebrated the nation's first statewide Father's Day on June 19, 1910. Slowly, the holiday spread. In 1916, President Wilson honored the day by using telegraph signals to unfurl a flag in Spokane when he pressed a button

in Washington, D.C. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge urged all state governments to observe Father's Day.

For those fortunate enough to have been blessed with a loving father, this holiday is a special opportunity one day a year to honor them or their memory. For those less fortunate, who perhaps never had a loving relationship with their father or a father figure, or worse, have only troubling memories of a harsh or abusive father, there is still a reason to celebrate this day.

Have you ever stopped to think about why the Lord's prayer begins with the phrase "Our Father which art in heaven"? Many pagan religions in the world have female deities. For example, Shakti is one of the most powerful Hindu goddesses and is referred to as "The Great Divine Mother." Celtic, Egyptian, Greek and several other cultures all worshipped female deities. Why is the Christian religion different?

The Bible refers to God "the Father" simply because that is who He is: He is the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ (Ephesians 1:3). In John 5 Jesus refers to himself as "the Son," and he also

talks of his "Father" (5:19-23), a reference to God (5:18). Throughout scripture, God's nature as the creator and giver of life is cast in the context of an all-knowing, all-loving, all-forgiving, all-powerful Father. The imagery of a welcoming father is perhaps best illustrated in the parable of the prodigal son in Luke 15. Who has not been prodigal or felt lost or separated from God? As Christians, Paul reminds us that we are no longer slaves, but are adopted sons and daughters, joint-heirs with the Son

We can call God "Abba Father", a phrase that Jesus himself used in his Gethsemane prayer as he cried out for strength to face the coming day's crucifixion. The word "Abba" in Aramaic signifies a close, intimate, endearing relationship between a child and their human father. But ponder for a moment this word in the context of our relationship with our heavenly Father. One who knows all there is to know about us; who formed us in the womb, and yet pursues a close, intimate relationship with us. What a privilege it is for us to be able to run to his arms and cry "Abba Father!"

Trevecca's MBA Program: Preparation for Public Service

As register of deeds for Davidson County—and the first African American and woman to hold that position—Karen Johnson has proven her ability to effectively campaign for political office and succeed as a key member of the county's leadership. She attributes much of her success to her time in Trevecca's MBA program, which not only provided the tools and support to thrive in the political arena, but helped separate her from other candidates to get elected.

In fact, it was Johnson's MBA classmates at Trevecca who first inspired her to consider running for public office.

"I thought my trajectory was ultimately going to be in a corner office as senior vice president of human resources for a Fortune 500 company. That was my dream, but God saw otherwise," Johnson said. "Many of my classmates said, 'we see you as mayor.' Before that I never saw myself in the political arena, especially at the level where I am now."

In her first foray into politics after receiving her MBA, she was named to the Board of Zoning Appeals, the Metro Greenways Commission and the Board of Parks and Recreation. The experience from those appointments has continued to serve her to this day. However, it hasn't all been easy. At one point she ran for an office and lost, but the resilience she had learned at Trevecca kept her going.

"I had learned from my master's program that I had to be relentless and look at failure as an opportunity to improve," Johnson said. "Trevecca taught me that when I didn't do well, I should look at it as a chance to learn and grow, and that is what has propelled me to where I am now, to every level within the political arena."

That relentless spirit served her well, and even when her goal of becoming county register seemed elusive, she was able to fall back on the reputation of her degree and years of service to the community to garner the trust of voters.

"With this election, it was an uphill battle. I had no money, all I had was my MBA and my history of service," Johnson said. "My education was a deciding factor for voters. People saw that I had the background necessary to do an excellent job. That higher education in business made me stand out, no one else who was running had that. The voters put their trust in me to manage this operation and be service-minded, and that came from the knowledge I acquired at Trevecca."

The importance of ambition and education was instilled in Johnson at an early age. It was taught, and lived, by her parents.

"My father had a doctorate and was the chief financial officer at Fisk University and my mother was a librarian with a master's," Johnson said. "I grew up with the idea that the more education you could obtain, the more opportunities there would be available to you. My parents also taught me that no matter what you do in life, the one thing that can't be taken away from you is your education. That always stuck with me."

When she was searching for an MBA program, she explored a range of options and settled on the one that best lined up with her needs. Trevecca met all of her requirements for a school where she could thrive.



"I was looking at multiple universities like Cornell because of their programs in human resources, but when I saw Trevecca's program, I knew that is where I needed to be," Johnson said.

She appreciated that Trevecca was a smaller school that still offered the resources and technology she needed to succeed. Ultimately, her time at the University offered classes and a community that she values to this day.

"I really loved my experience at Trevecca. I loved my classmates, I still keep in touch with many of them," Johnson said. "Many of them have gone on to get their doctorates but I went into the political realm so a master's was perfect for me. I wanted to learn to look at finance and economics and that's what the program gave me."

As register of deeds, Johnson is the custodian of legal documents pertaining to property, but her job extends further. The property attached to those documents reflects the lives of real people, and she is determined to work for the good of all of her constituents, armed with years of public service experience and a degree that has transformed her views on business and service.

"I am very passionate about everybody being able to access a good quality of life. It's my experiences, the support of the people around me and my passion for community and helping people that have ultimately led me here," Johnson said. "In this political space, it is really important to have people who are instilled with that sense of service, and that's something Trevecca does: instill service to others in their whole curriculum. That helped me to grow more than anything."

An Encouraging Word

Asbury Revival Is A Christian Wake-Up Call: Listen To The Holy Spirit And Expect The Unexpected

I pray that all Christians will be open to spiritual realities like what we're seeing at Asbury University and pray for more revivals around the country. "My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I too am working"--Jesus (John 5:17).

I was thrilled to see the Asbury University revival spark chatter on a national level—even NBC News and The Washington Post have done write-ups about this phenomenon. While many Christians, like myself, are overjoyed and inspired by the events that took place at this small college in Kentucky, it is not lost on me that it has also stirred skepticism among non-believers and even many Christians.

As someone whose capacity to accept and embrace the supernatural has grown gradually over time, I understand those people who are on the fence— who want to believe what's happening at Asbury is real, but who have never experienced something like it firsthand and therefore can't fully get their head around it. My prayer is that all Christians, whether on the fence or not, will open their minds and hearts to these spiritual realities and pray for more revivals like this to ignite across the country, so that each of us might have an opportunity to see what they're all about firsthand. After all, some aspects of the Holy

Spirit really do come down to how we experience Him on a personal level.

People constantly quote that "God works in mysterious ways," but I'm not convinced we as the Body of Christ have collectively accepted this as a fact, especially when it comes to the Holy Spirit. I often think about the Day of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit was first gifted to Jesus's disciples. While they were consumed by tongues of fire and speaking in different languages, certain members of the crowd outside laughed and accused them of being drunk. As believers, our response to the manifestation of the Holy Spirit might not be as brash as this example, but I think it's fair to say that many of us have shied away from the very things that occupied the majority of Jesus's earthly ministry such as healing the sick, and especially the casting out of demons.

I will be the first person to admit that the thought of casting out a demon makes me extremely uncomfortable—but Jesus did it and He commissioned His disciples to do the same through the Holy Spirit, so, realistically, why shouldn't I believe He would want His modern-day Church to embrace the spiritual authority He bestowed upon us? These gaps in our faith as "believers" are the very reason we need revivals like the one taking place at Asbury University.

The brokenness in our society is beyond repair on a strictly human level. We need God more than ever to intervene in ways only He can. I've seen testimonies of people who have been amazed and mystified by things they've witnessed in the past week at Asbury–and while God will always do more than we could ever hope or imagine (Eph 3:20)--part of me longs for a day where the majority of Christians will see God's direct actions in our world today and respond with less shock and more expectation for "even greater things" (John 14:12).

In the hit series portraying Jesus's ministry, "The Chosen," the character of Jesus often says to His followers, "Get used to different." As I continue to



watch the events at Asbury unfold, this phrase comes to the forefront of my mind. Just as Jesus presented Himself very differently from the Messiah the Jews long expected, so too the Holy Spirit often surprises Christians in the way He manifests and works.

His moves might not always feel "comfortable," at least, from the outset, and He might touch people who we never imagined He would. But we must never try to put our infinite God in a box of our finite expectations. The key things we must remember are that where He is, there is freedom (2 Cor 3:17), and such freedom brings the fruits of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

It is important to be wise as serpents, testing the fruit of said "moves of God" so that we are never led astray by any demonic influence, but let us also remember Jesus's warning that "unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt 18:3).

We must remember God's call to come to Him in humility, seeking to know every aspect of His nature. And we must also have faith that God can, and does, want to use His Holy Spirit in powerful ways in each

of our individual lives. In his book "Hearing God," Christian writer Dallas Willard speaks on the nature of gatherings in the first-century church and how we can look to them as our example today.

Noting 1 Corinthians 14, he writes, "we see that they assumed that numerous people in the congregation were going to have some kind of communication from God which they would be sharing with others in the group....the ancient prophecy of Joel was fulfilled in the early church: "Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams" (Acts 2:17, Joel 2:28-32).

The wish of Moses that "all the Lord's people were prophets, and that the Lord would put His spirit on them" (Num 11:29) is substantially granted in the church of Jesus Christ when it functions as its Lord intended."

There you have it. When the church of Christ moves in faith-filled expectation, we operate in the fullness and reality of His Spirit living and working inside of us. Whether you are a fiery revivalist or someone who is still on the fence about the Asbury University Revival, I pray that you will ask God to show you how you can be more open to the Holy Spirit manifesting in your life. It all starts there.

It is only when the child becomes older and knowingly "feeds" off the father's generosity, to the point of his detriment, does this affiliation become a negative situation.

As the child matures into adolescence the relationship should become one of Commensalism. The child should benefit from the father support and developmental guidance while the father is made whole through the results of these efforts. From the father's perspective it is enriching to be able to be a part of the fulfillment of their child's personal development and the rewards are great on many levels while the disadvantages are minimal.

Once the child has matured into an adult, the relationship should have reached a healthy state of Mutualism. The child and the father both benefit from the others existence without harm to either. It is here that the father can observe the start of a new cycle of relationships and the continuation of



his legacy. The child takes the lessons of the father, applying them in their lives while passing them along to the next generation. The one time parasite now becomes

host to their children; the cycle of life continues and thrives.

Science proves once more the Power of the Wisdom of Three. It is our God, the Father, through the Wisdom of Three, who gives us the blueprint we need to solve our problems in raising our children. The term symbiosis, "together life", is His explanation of the steps Solutionaries should take in order to teach others the truth.

MATT MARKINS: TOUGH BEGINNINGS FOR AWANA INNOVATOR

Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed

Much like other children, Matt Markins began a relationship with the Lord at a young age: "One of my earliest memories is the day my father walked out of the house. He had five different marriages that I'm aware of. I remember sitting on the floor with my older brother who had a Little Golden Bookthe kind with the gold spine—and he was trying to distract me from the violence of my father's behavior. It was a rough beginning, but that was part of what propelled me into ministry. Not long after that and not surprisingly, my mother found her way into a local church. One evening the sun was reflecting through the stained-glass windows, and a man with a guitar was singing 'Jesus Loves Me.' Even

was singing 'Jesus Loves Me.' Even at that young age, I knew that what he was demonstrating was different to what was in my home. I wanted that." Earthly father walked out, but Heavenly Father walked in. "After my mother married a church-going man, my life pretty much revolved around children's church, Sunday school, flannel-gram lessons, and youth groups. That very first exposure to Jesus was followed by pursuing Him with adult mentors, kids' pastors, youth pastors, and people invested in discipling me."

Markins grew up in the corn fields of central Indiana with his mother, step-father, and two older siblings until he moved to Nashville for college in 1994. For a short stint, he worked with Awana in Chicago until the board approved his moving back to Nashville in 2020. Awana is a world-wide non-profit ministry focused on providing Bible-based evangelism and discipleship solutions for ages 2-18. As the global leaders in child and youth discipleship, Awana gives children the opportunity to know, love, and serve Jesus, no matter their background. The Nashville office opens in 2023.

Today, Matt and wife Katie have two college-aged sons, Warren and Hudson, who attend Welch College, a private four-year college in Nashville and Gallatin, Tennessee, affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists. The mission of Welch College is to educate leaders to serve Christ, His Church, and His world through Biblical thought and life. Markins holds a bachelor's degree in Intercultural Studies and Theology from Welch College.



Matt and Katie Markins live in Nashville and have two college-aged sons, Warren and Hudson.

Matt and Katie have been involved in children's ministry for more than 25 years and spend their time in Nashville with their two sons. The boys grew up under the tutelage of parents engaging in conversations and actions surrounding child discipleship, a mainstay in their family and later in their business and ministry association through Awana. As a leading researcher in child discipleship and children's ministry, Matt has commissioned nine research projects since 2013, including a study, Children's Ministry in a New Reality, conducted by the Barna Group. He is the co-author of three books, most notably Resilient: Child Discipleship and the Fearless Future of the Church. Markins is also the co-founder of the Child

Discipleship Forum and the D6 Conference. Enjoying travel is a plus for Markins since his missional work with Awana requires much travel nationally and internationally. He serves as President and Chief Executive Officer of Awana.

Matt fell into the publishing world through Randall Publishing House via Welch College and then into Thomas Nelson where he "got a lot of knowledge and then came back to Randall House and founded a family ministry, D6 Conference, based on Deuteronomy 6." The ministry is now 15 years old and is in several countries. D6 focuses on the church and home working together to disciple children.

When Pastor Robert J. Morgan of Donelson Fellowship brought Awana into the church along with D6, Markins developed professional and personal experience with both. He was invited into the Awana environment as Vice President of Marketing, Strategy, and U.S. Publishing. Awana's vision is that every child would come to know, love, and serve the Lord Jesus Christ. Currently, Awana is happening in 133 countries worldwide through almost 70,000 churches, reaching over 5.3 million kids equipping them toward lasting faith in Christ. No matter where they live, all children need the life-altering hope found in Jesus.

Primarily an innovator, Markins now focuses on "updating and energizing

Awana's somewhat antiquated material bringing it into the twenty-first century with full assurance that it is still founded on the gospel and rooted in scripture." Matt describes Katie as "the most influential, non-paid contributor of the Awana organization for sure; she's my partner in ministry. In all my writings, she's my think partner and has a brilliant mind and a great heart. On the Myer-Briggs Indicator (MBTI), Katie and I are thinkers. This mode serves us well as we dive into options in our life, ministry, and business decisions. We call it mental gymnastics. It's almost like Katie is on the front lines—more so because I travel a great deal—and I'm on the supply lines in the back working in the research space. We're always swapping stories and practical anecdotal information and encounters to help each other.

"We're a good team. We like each other, and we love each other, and we make a pretty good couple. And by the grace of God our two sons are faithfully following Jesus. We're very grateful they love Him and are growing in their faith. We realize they are about to break the family huddle, so this summer we're taking them to one of our special places, Norway, where Katie and I co-founded Awana.

Using life skills, along with on-the-jobtraining with Katie's dad teaching his carpentry and other skills. Matt appreciates art and carpentry and design. Over the years, he and Katie have renovated their homes, and in 2004-5 even built a house. Matt himself contracted it and says, "we had no clue, no business doing that, but it was the best experience of our lives. Essentially, it taught us how to run an organization and helped prepare me to do what I do now. Then, in 2010, all that area flooded. "Another of our projects was an 1890s house in Chicago where we lived in 2013. Home renovation

and building have been a part of our story. Currently, we're working with an architect and have 90 percent renovated our historical home in Gallatin. The theme of building art and craft and beauty has long been in our lives. We think about the parallels between the craftmanship of discipling a human life and the craftsmanship of building a home. We have poured our lives into both." Add persistence to these thinkers' characteristics.

The Parable of the Hidden Treasure is one of Matt's guiding biblical verses: The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy, went and sold all he had and bought that field. (Matthew 13:44 NIV) "The human side of me likes that verse because it's a movie all in one verse. The call to follow Jesus is most valuable because He is that treasure. There's nothing in our lives that we couldn't or shouldn't give up to pursue Jesus Christ and the Kingdom of Heaven."

Markins familiarizes that parable with "selling out to Jesus and being totally committed to Him. The major desire of my heart is to be a faithful disciple of Christ regardless of what's happening in the world around me." To that effect he dedicates his life to discipling kids to stand firm in their Christian convictions regardless of their surroundings.

Prayerfully consider meeting with great minds in this year's think tank for the future of discipleship for our children.

Since there's so much fighting for our kids' hearts, the battle to anchor those hearts to Jesus in a culture that puts everything else first is sometimes exhausting and lonely. Our children are worth it. God's Kingdom is worth it. Whether we're ministers, parents, or volunteers, our kids are looking to us to help them walk in His ways."

This generation is not the first to be challenged in its faith; throughout the Bible and Church history, men and women have courageously followed God even amid persecution. What was different about them? More pressing, how can we rear children with a spirit like that?

There remains the challenge to our greater community to make a decision, to get involved, to actually do something with our concerns for our children. Daily, we hear and see turmoil—even evil—in our schools, libraries, and social encounters. Can we not explore these avenues with some of the greatest minds coming to Nashville? Will we take a step to deal with two prominent questions:

- 1. What are the dominant cultures today and how are those cultures shaping our children (anything that's pressing in on our children: technology, AI, DEI, gender dysphoria, LGBTQ, etc.). Articulating those things is crucial so that parents and church leaders gain insight into how to help children.
- 2. What primary factors lead to lasting faith in children?

Engage in Child Discipleship Forum 23 to hear from Bible-minded leaders in child advocacy and learn to cultivate a different spirit in our kids—one of conviction, courage, compassion, and commitment.

Engage with this year's most intentional conversations about child disciple-ship—the challenges, the joy, and the hope that inspire us to seek better ways to serve the children God places in our lives.

Become equipped and encouraged by thought-provoking content as you process, pray, and worship with others whose hearts are set on shaping kids with lifelong faith in Jesus Christ.

Perhaps this equipping is a step in Jesus' calling you to—or deepening you in—ministry with His children.

Summertime, and the livin' is easy
Fish are jumpin' and the cotton is high ...

Can you hear Ella Fitzgerald singing her song "Summertime" in your head? I can. Ella, this month I would alter those lines to read

Summertime, and the temp is too high The AC is calling, and my exercise routine gone by Is it me, or is it too hot to exercise?

My family moved to Tennessee 25 years ago, from Northern California and I've always struggled with weather being an excuse for exercising. It's either, too hot or too cold – with just a few days in Spring and Fall being optimal for sweating but exercise is still something we all need to do – year round – so I'm encouraging myself, and you, to get out and move.

Doing a daily radio show, I'm connected to a lot of information and much of that has to do with being healthy and losing weight. Here's a few interesting reports I found for us to consider.

Most & Least Addictive Foods

The most addictive foods are highly processed, according to a study published in PLoS ONE, a research journal, of what people find hardest to resist. Here's the list (in order): pizza, chocolate, chips, cookies, ice cream, French fries, cheeseburger, non-diet soda, cake, and cheese. Which foods are the hardest to get addicted to? Strawberries, corn (no butter or salt), salmon, banana, broccoli, brown rice, apple, beans, carrots, and cucumbers (no dip).

No Standing And Eating

One of the easiest ways to lose weight? Don't stand up when you eat. Accord-

ing to a report in Men's Health, try to always eat meals and snacks off a plate, at a table, seated in a chair. It helps you pay more attention to what you're eating instead of simply standing in the pantry and snacking while you decide what to eat.

Not To Scale

This should put a shudder into everyone that's dieting, according to a report in Obesity Research, a scientific journal, one-quarter of all scales are off by as much as three-and-a-half pounds, and up to half of all scales in doctor's offices are wrong by at least a pound or

two.

What Kind Of Ant Is This?

Have you ever been in your kitchen and suddenly spotted a tiny black ant crawling on your counter? Or have you ever felt a sting while sitting outside and realized a small, red ant was responsible? These pesky ants can disrupt the dog days of a summer afternoon. Unfortunately, in our humid environment, ants have the potential to become a nuisance and multiply quickly, so it's crucial to identify them to take the correct preventative measures. Here's how to recognize common ants and how to keep them from becoming a nuisance.

Carpenter Ants

Identification: Carpenter ants are typically red, black, or a combination of both, and their length ranges from 0.5 to 0.625 inches. They bore through the wood to build nests, so you may notice sawdust, small holes, and insect parts near damaged wood. Prevention: Carpenter ants are attracted to moisture, so eliminate all sources of standing water. They can enter through small openings, so seal any cracks and holes. Avoid storing firewood near your home.

Odorous House Ants

Identification: Odorous house ants are tiny, ranging from 0.0625 to 0.125 inches, and brown or black. They prefer water sources indoors and wood sources outdoors. They have a sweet tooth, with honeydew being their favorite. These are quite common in the South, where you'll often find them hanging around your bathroom sink or near windows after a storm. Prevention: Odorous house ants use tree branches to enter homes, so trim any tree limbs that hang over your home. Seal any small openings they may use to enter, although they'll find their way in after a rain shower. Keep firewood away from your home.

Sugar Ants

Identification: Sugar ants are a catch-all phrase for ants that like sweets. Whether they are attracted to the piece of dessert left on your counter or a sweet houseplant, such as an aphid, they can become pests quickly. Prevention: Sugar ants have an advantage in our Southern climate with a long growing season and our love for sweet tea and sweet treats. Make sure you are keeping foods properly sealed and select your houseplant carefully.

Fire Ants

Identification: Fire ants are easy to recognize due to their red color, with a length ranging from 0.125 to 0.375 inches. They build large mounds and sting rather than just bite. Fire ants are among the most despised because their sting hurts both humans and dogs. Prevention: Avoid disturbing fire ant nests and seal any cracks in your home's structure to prevent them from entering. You can pour boiling water or insecticides deep into their nests to try and kill them.



How to Deep Clean Your Floors

Cleaning Hardwood Floors and Keeping the Dirt Out

Unless you adopt a strict no-shoes policy in your home, dirt will get tracked in and onto your hardwood floors. And even if the humans in the house take off their shoes at the door, your pets can't do the same. Follow these simple steps to clean dirty floors, then learn a few easy tricks for keeping as much dirt as possible off hardwoods during the muddy spring season and year-round.

Sweep, Then Vacuum

Start the cleaning process by sweeping your hardwood floor with a high-quality broom with rubber bristles; these bristles prove less abrasive than straw, which can scratch the finish on your floors. Start at one end of the room and move backward, getting into every corner and as far under furniture and appliances as you can. Gather the dust and debris into a pile. Use a vacuum without a beater bar to suck up the pile, then clean the floor again with the vacuum, paying special attention to gaps between

boards. Sweep then vacuum at least once a week and spot clean dirty floors when accidents, or muddy footprints, happen.

Clean Only as Necessary

If you regularly sweep, then vacuum your hardwood floors, only spot cleaning should be required. Use a professional cleaner made for hardwood floors and a soft cloth to clean up marks from shoes and toys. Clean sticky messes with a damp sponge or soft cloth. Whatever you do, do not use excessive water, as it can cause the boards to expand and splinter, and do not use wood soap, as it will dull the finish of your floors. If you have laminate floors and not real hardwood, follow the cleaning directions provided by the manufacturer or installer.

Stop Dirt at the Door

Lay down a floor mat at each entry point in your home, both inside and out, and encourage everyone to wipe their feet. Choose a heavy-duty mat that can withstand the elements, such as rubber, for the outside. Opt for a natural-fiber floor mat for the inside; rubber-backed mats can lead to dirt trapped underneath scratching your hardwood floors. Shake the rugs outside when you clean your dirty floors each week.

Keep Your Pup's Feet Clean

Before allowing Spot into the house, give his paws a quick cleaning with a towel or pre-moistened doggie wipes. Keep the towel or wipes in a basket by the door and make paw care part of his walks by cleaning him up outside before taking off his leash. If you live in an area that lends itself to muddy messes year-round, consider investing in a portable paw bath. These canisters have soft bristles inside that you dip each your dog's paws into before letting him inside.

Provide Additional Protection

Prevent other types of damage to your hardwood floors by installing floor protectors on furniture, both heavy and light pieces, and by using window treatments to protect the floors from harsh sunlight during the day. Also, don't forget to trim your pet's nails regularly.





How to Clean Grout: Get the Grime Out of Your Tile Floor

Although grout cleaning isn't the most glamorous topic, it is a vital step in keeping a clean home. Because it is a task that isn't a part of your weekly cleaning routine, it can be easily forgotten. But trust us, there is nothing to fear when it comes to cleaning your grout — well, other than the potential build up of dirt and bacteria your grout might be accumulating. Typical grout needs to be cleaned every four to six months, but can stay clean longer with proper technique and sealant.

There's an assortment of options in getting the grime out of your grout. Homemade solutions include baking soda, hydrogen peroxide, and even shaving cream! Any common household grout cleaner should do the trick as well. But if you have small children or pets, we recommend using oxygen bleach. Oxygen bleach is a non-toxic, fume-free alternative to chlorine that will kill bacteria and brighten your tile at the same time.

Using a spray bottle filled with water, wet your grout. Next, spoon your oxygen bleach along the grout to create a paste-like consistency. If your grout seems particularly stained or dirty, try using lemon juice in the place of water for a natural whitener that will make your grout sparkle! After your oxygen bleach and water paste is on your grout, practice the art of patience. Spend fifteen minutes on something else: meditate, run around the block, make a pot of coffee, or even cut coupons. The point is let the oxygen bleach work its magic. After fifteen minutes or so, come back with an old toothbrush or grout brush and you'll be amazed at how easy the dirt and mildew wipe away. Rinse the now brown, possibly black, oxygen bleach solution away with a damp cotton cloth and your grout should now be as good as new. You could even find your grout a color you've never seen it! To keep your grout mildew and dirt free for longer, make sure you treat your tile floor with a grout sealant once a year. Keep in mind, however, that sealed grout will still need cleaning about every six months.

Your now sparkling white grout will brighten up your room and the rest of your day!

A Simple Filter For What We Do In Health



Knowing what we should do to live a healthy lifestyle can be a challenge. There is so much information out there. Should we do keto? How many times should we work out per week? Weight lifting or running? And how do we add a solid Biblical worldview to what we are doing? These are all questions we are asked all the time. In this article, I

will give you a very simple framework that can help you have confidence in your health.

Many people we work with felt like in the past they had to sift through information or go on YouTube to find content they hoped was correct. So as we develop resources for our F.O.R.M. curriculum we wanted to have a simple filter to run all of the content through to ensure we are getting the best information so they can put that information into practice immediately. Let's dive into that framework.

We must look at the topic through three main lenses: historical evidence, Biblical principles, and current evidence-based research. Without all 3 of these filters, we only get a partial picture of how to understand a particular topic in health. It is only when we look through all three of these lenses that we see the full picture.

Biblical- What are the motives and mindsets behind the topic? How does it line up with biblical principles? Is this topic consistent with the Word of God and/or the proven character of God? Are we THINKING rightly about the topic?

Historical- When and where did a topic originate? What are its results throughout history? Looking at the past reputation of a topic is crucial in determining its validity today. Many times we get so stuck in our current day and culture and we don't look back to see what people have done over the years and how that has changed into practices today.

Current Research- Do current scholarly studies provide evidence to support the topic? What are the cold, hard, objective facts about the topic and its effects? What is the truth about how the body is made and how we can partner with our body to steward it well?

Take a look at your current health plan. Does it check all the boxes in this filter? If it doesn't, that's ok! Now that you have this filter you can find resources that check all of these boxes so you can build a lasting foundation in your health.

Why Christian Prayers for Israel Matter

There's an incredible, phenomenal, global phenomenon taking place with millions of Christians fasting and praying for Israel this month. While the phenomenon of Christians praying for Israel is not new, this may be the first time that there has been a formal organized effort to garner Christian support for Israel, all at the same time, over a period of three weeks.

Known as the Isaiah 62 Fast, the effort has been spearheaded by Pastor Mike Bickel. If it comes at a time that is monumental historically with Israel celebrating its 75th anniversary of independence, and the 56th anniversary of the reunification of Jerusalem. Jews celebrate Shavuot, the Biblical festival on which Moses brought, and the Jewish people received, the Law, which Christians know and celebrate as Pentecost. It's a redemptive season.

It also comes at a time during which Israel continues to experience violence and terror causing the harm and murder of many citizens and even one tourist from Italy. In the midst of these prayers, Islamic Jihad terrorists in Gaza have fired more than 500 rockets at Israeli communities, putting millions in their crosshairs, canceling public events and celebrations, and creating fear, stress, and trauma. (As of this writing it has neither escalated to a ground operation, nor has there been a cease fire, and we pray that the wanton and evil terrorist fire will cease, and God will change their hearts.)

It also comes at a time when Israel has also been engaged in domestic political strife and division, the level of which is something that Israelis have not experienced in many years, if ever.

While the economy remains strong and tourism has largely rebounded since the pandemic, Israel is also experiencing increases of prices on basic staples, housing, energy, and other items that stretch the hard-earned shekel of millions.

Outside Israel's borders, its enemies in Iran, who make no secret of its goal to annihilate Israel, are churning away at their centrifuges and arming themselves with long range rockets and other weapons that put all of Israel at risk and pose an existential threat. Islamic terrorists in Lebanon and Syria have an estimated 150,000 long range missiles that can strike all of Israel.

This all comes shortly after Israel was ranked the fourth happiest nation in the world, something that if you read the challenges that we face above, it's hard to comprehend but it is the reality. Israelis are happy because our lives have a purpose and destiny. We don't just exist and live for the next day, but rather exist because of our past, because of God's promises and covenant, with all the promises and responsibilities that entails, and mindful of our destiny.

When speaking with Christian friends around the globe, and being interviewed by various Christian media about the significance of the Isaiah 62 Fast, one common theme that recurred in these conversations is a sense that while Christians genuinely love and support Israel and their prayers for Israel are indeed heartfelt and sincere, most Christians have little to no deep connection to Israel or with average Israelis. They may truly love us, but they don't know us.

They don't know about these basic challenges and other facets of life from sending our children to the military, economic issues that make making ends meet sometimes a challenge, or the issues that threaten to divide us, and more.



And they don't experience our joy and pride in having built the incredible society that we have over the past 75 years. Sometimes it is a necessary blessing to have Christian friends to remind us of that because we are caught up in the day today realities of just living in the Land and not contemplating significance or bigger picture all the time.

So, when Christians around the world unite in prayer for our country and our people, it is indeed remarkable, miraculous, and something for which we are grateful. That is why the Genesis 123 Foundation initiated a complementary initiative to help Christians praying for Israel focus on the prayer points that are needed the most. Dozens of Jews and Christians in the Land have already joined us in important conversations about why that's important, and what to pray for. Each video is being shared on its Facebook page and YouTube channel, and praying that these will be shared widely to focus and motivate the millions praying for Israel daily.

Basically, we're looking to flood God's inbox with prayers from those who are devoted to Him, to preserve the wellbeing, safety, and Biblical destiny of Israel and the Jewish people.

2023 Is The Year We Hold Big Tech Accountable

Grace McComas endured torture from a man who had previously drugged and assaulted her. He used social media to make Grace feel isolated, afraid, and worthless. Her parents fought to save her, but there was nothing they could do to force those digital platforms to ban Grace's tormenter. She ultimately ended her life at 15-years-old.

16-year-old Carson Bride ended his life after receiving hundreds of harassing, threatening and sexually explicit messages from classmates who hid their identities with anonymous apps. Carson asked his tormentors to identify themselves so that they could talk things out in person, but no one ever did. The last search on Carson's phone was for hacks to find out who was doing this to him.

Mason Bogard was an adventurous 15-year-old boy who lost his life after attempting the viral "choking challenge."



These are just a few of the hundreds of heartbreaking stories that have become far too common in the age of social media. It has become impossible to deny that our children are suffering at the hands of Big Tech. Meanwhile, dozens of executives have sat before Senate committees unable to explain


what their companies are doing to reverse course. They would much rather deflect and continue raking in profits than make sure their platforms are safe for young users.

If Big Tech cannot hold themselves accountable, Congress must step in. Over the last several years, Connecticut Senator Richard Blumenthal and I, and our teams, have met with countless parents, young people, psychologists, pediatricians, mental health experts, nurses, consumer advocates, faith groups, tech experts, and so many others to hear from them about the harms of social media. In response, we introduced the Kids Online Safety Act last Congress, a bipartisan solution that will require online platforms to put the interests of kids first, creating a duty of care for companies that know their products cater to young users. The bill will give families the safeguards, tools, and transparency they need to protect young people's health and well-being online, and expose Big Tech's pernicious practices by requiring independent audits and supporting access to important data for experts and academic researchers.

Unfortunately, Big Tech's lobbyists were successful in their efforts to obstruct passage of this bill last year, but that won't stop us. Passing the Kids Online Safety Act and holding Big Tech accountable cannot wait. School is winding down and kids will soon be out for the summer, which increases the potential for more device time, more online interactions, and more online harms. Let's get this done for Grace, Carson, Mason, and the hundreds of kids who have been injured or died at the hands of social media companies.

That Small Crack In the Basement Wall, No Problem, Right?

Jeremiah 14: REPENT...be transformed.


