



10 Ways to Beat the Summer Blues

A study showed that after thirteen days into the summer, parents were ready for school to start. The reasons ranged from trying to be the recreation coordinator, planning ahead, reining in excessive screen time, and lacking in finances.

Need help? Here's ten ideas to beat those summer blues.

1. Create a bucket list with

your kids of the things

they'd like to do or learn.

Place boundaries on the cost and distance. You'd be surprised with what they come up with.

2. Visit local sites unique to Nashville such as the zoo, Adventure Science Center, Tennessee State Museum, Sounds Minor League Baseball, or Country Music Hall of Fame.

3. Get your kids outdoors. Walk across the pedestrian bridge in downtown Nashville. The "Greenways for Nashville" website provides maps and trails. Want to get away from the city? Yes, it's hot, but consider going berry picking or attend a county fair. Close to home a sprinkler cools off the kids and provides tons of squeals.

4. Plan for rainy day activities. There's plenty in your house for kids to create, bake or revisit. Suggest they try a recipe from another country, create a craft or art project, form a band, revisit a puzzle, or make a tent. McDonalds and Chick-fil-A provide indoor play places to burn off steam. Invite another mom and her kids to go with you for lunch and playtime.
5. Allow for boredom. Don't think you have to plan every minute of a child's day as unscheduled play works a different part of a child's brain than used at school. Allow them to create, imagine, and dream this summer. It doesn't cost a thing.

6. Communicate clearly on the screen time allowed. Keep screens out of bedrooms and in the open where you can monitor usage. One mom I know turns off the Wi-fi after 11 p.m.

7. Seek free opportunities. Libraries and local bookstores schedule story time (check their websites) for younger kids and may add a craft or activity to go with the book. For teens, find opportunities to volunteer.

8. Cheap is next best. Recreation and community centers offer activities for kids at a low daily fee. Check out the Nashville.gov website for more information. The Brentwood Skate Center and local bowling alleys also offer inexpensive old-time fun.

9. Attend Vacation Bible School. If you haven't sent your child to one, sign up! Some churches still offer VBS in July. Churches rarely charge for this event (unless you want a t-shirt) and offer a fun way to learn about the Bible and hear the Gospel message—an eternal benefit.

10. Eat ice cream! Ice cream always cools off and brightens moods on a hot, steamy summer day.

Answer: Planning for your son's future is admirable. There are a couple things you can do right now so your son has financial resources available. The first is to set up an ABLE Account (Achieving a Better Life Experience) through the state of Tennessee. www.able.treasury.tn.gov/.



The second thing is to establish a third-party supplemental needs trust with an established trust company. www.vistapoints.org/third-party/

The Modern Attack on Our System of Justice

Some of the most dramatic stories in human history have unfolded in the courtroom, many of them more gripping than fiction. The predictable outcomes on Perry Mason pale in comparison to what often happens in real life. But today oftentimes news headlines point to a system of justice that is undergoing attack.

Any fair judicial system cannot come to a just decision without regard to the means. In other words, it must do so using a fair procedure. This has over time come to be known as "due process."

The cornerstone of due process in our court system is the presumption of innocence, which means that a person must be proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt. Unless you have traveled abroad to other countries and observed their judicial systems, it is easy to take for granted this unique and vital aspect of our system of justice.

Another important component of due process in the United States, Great Britain and throughout the British Commonwealth is that the defendant must also be given timely notice of the accusations against him or her. In a criminal case, this is the function of an indictment, which must be very specific as to each element of the offense. In a civil case, it is called a "complaint", and if the draftsman is not careful to plead the facts with sufficient specificity, the court is obligated to dismiss the lawsuit.

Next, judicial systems dating back as far as early Greece have emphasized the need for a fair and impartial trial. As the ancient proverb goes: justice is blind. It is to be meted out impartially and without regard to the identity of the person being tried. This means, at a minimum, the accused must have the right to subpoena witnesses, to cross ex-

amine his accuser, and to be judged by an impartial jury of his peers.

With all of these time-honored safeguards in place, why is our judicial system in America facing such strident criticism today? The answer may lie in the fact that we are witnessing a series of "firsts" in our judicial history. The indictment of a former U.S. president weeks following his announcement as a political candidate; the use of our branches of criminal justice on a national and local scale to investigate and prosecute claims which, in hindsight, were based on scant, or no credible evidence; and accusations of corruption at virtually all levels of our prosecutorial system now seem to abound.

Confidence in our system of justice is a bedrock component of our democracy. Our democracy depends on fair and independent courts to protect against abuses of power, provide checks and balances, and administer justice without regard to outside pressures. When citizens sense that politicians are threatening the independence and legiti-

have also raised concerns about their ability to get a fair and impartial trial given some recent trends in our culture. Recently, a gentleman came to my office who was arrested at a Gay Pride event in a cityowned park for merely bowing his head to pray while wearing a t-shirt that read "Jesus Changed My Life." Two women were forbidden entrance to the same event because they sought to bring their Bibles into the park. The denial of these basic religious freedoms may seem extreme to many


religious freedoms may seem extreme to many jurors who are people of faith; but these clients are understandably concerned that many potential jurors today may not share these views.

We are blessed in this country to have more than two hundred years of precedent upholding the due process protections engrained in our constitution. I frequently invite clients to pray before a hearing and to ask God's protection and guidance for the judge and jury. I also remind them of Paul's teaching in Romans 13:4 that the judge is a minister of God for good.

I can't say I'm a man of my word if my word is sprinkled with what I try to justify as "white lies"

That's why as Christians we must remember to start every day by putting on our H.A.T. and that is to be:

- Humble
- Authentic
- Truthful

Let's look at these. First, humility is the foundational posture we must take if we are to be followers of Jesus Christ. God's expectation is that His disciples be humble. The Apostle Peter tells us to "humble [ourselves] under God's mighty hand" (1 Peter 5:6), and that "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble" (1 Peter 5:5).

Humility leads to authenticity. The Bible says Jesus, "humbled himself by becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross" (Philippians 2:8). The dictionary defines authenticity as, "conforming to an original to reproduce essential features," or as Romans 8:29 puts it, "so that we might be conformed to the image of his Son." We become authentic followers - reproductions - of Christ when we humble ourselves.

Truthfulness in all that we say and do becomes a natural biproduct of our lives when we humbly and authentically conform to the image of God's Son. Jesus is truth. He'd never lie about how far away He was from a restaurant or whether coffee had all the ingredients.

But there is an opposite reality if you're not wearing your H.A.T. If you're not humble, you're prideful. If you're not authentic, you're counterfeit If you're not truthful, you're a liar.

Prideful, counterfeit, liars are not followers of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit taught me another lesson about failing to be humble, authentic, and truthful. It always ends up in my humiliation. I confessed to my wife about the smoothie, and she was livid that I would compromise my integrity over something so insignificant. I went and fixed it the way it should have been done to begin with.



So how about you. Did you remember your H.A.T. today? If not confess, repent and put on humility, authenticity and truthfulness. You'll be glad you did.

Trending@Trevecca: Winchester Helping Major Motion Pictures Succeed as Marketing Manager

From laying out film budgets to leading a strategy team, Laura Beth Winchester, a 2017 graduate of Trevecca, has worked her way up and helped make many Christian movies possible and widely viewed, including the recently released *Jesus Revolution* movie. Winchester's role in *Jesus Revolution* was heavily focused on young adult outreach, and specifically college-age students. "There was a huge initiative on that film to reach the younger audience because that's kind of where that Jesus revolution started all those years ago, with teenagers and 20-somethings," Winchester said.

As a part of Winchester's outreach program, including initiatives like free screenings at colleges and PR boxes filled with disposable cameras, a sweatshirt from a collaboration with a prominent brand and 70's-themed candy, Winchester led the team to promote the movie worldwide. As part of a publicity campaign, Winchester also schedules premieres for films, and was able to be part of the premiere for

Jesus Revolution. "I just was smiling the whole time because

I rarely get to experience people reacting to a project that I've worked on for the last six months," Winchester said. "I think that's one of the most rewarding parts about it, is getting a front row seat to people experiencing a project that you've worked really hard to put out into the world."

Formative Years on the Hill

At Trevecca, Winchester double majored in communication studies and organizational communication, while minoring in leadership. She had many opportunities to gain real-world experience and was heavily involved in events on campus, such as serving as the social life executive on the student government team, helping lead a TNT (Top Nazarene Talent) event and participating in Trojan Idol. "I was dipping my hands in little entertainment moments here and there that I had no idea were all preparing me for a full-time job in the entertainment industry," Winchester said. "It all had a purpose."

Besides equipping her for her career, her time at Trevecca taught her to value her work while also loving people she interacts with every day. "Trevecca prepares you to go into work with such a grateful mindset wherever you are," Winchester said. "Going into it with a grateful heart and with a heart to serve I think are two of the biggest things that I took away from Trevecca."

Marketing Movies

Besides *Jesus Revolution*, Winchester has worked on other faith-based films such as *I Still Believe* and *Redeeming Love*. These opportunities have come through her job as a marketing manager for WTA Media, a branch of Educational Media Foundation, which owns and operates KLOVE Radio, Air One Radio, Access More podcasts, and KLOVE On Demand. "What we'll essentially do is lead the marketing campaign team of digital buyers, content creators, publicists and communications directors. It's a lot of gatekeeping, copywriting, reviewing, so many things," Winchester said. "We're a small team here and we're extremely collaborative, which is something that I really appreciate."

Winchester's responsibilities at WTA Media include being a spokesperson between vendors and producers; creatively strategizing for campaigns; managing film budgets; regulating social media flow; and working closely with major studios like Universal.





"Each film requires a totally different strategy to reach a totally different audience," Winchester said. "So I work alongside the rest of our team working on what's going to work best for this audience. How do we take what we've learned so far in the campaign and adjust it as we continue moving forward and finish out?"

In 2019, Winchester hosted the Nazarene Youth Conference and will be hosting it again this summer. Being on stage and connecting with young adults and students is a passion of hers, and she hopes to incorporate that into her career moving forward.

"Ultimately, I want whatever I'm doing to just further the kingdom and to make people feel really blessed," said Winchester. "Whether that's me speaking directly to them in a microphone or through an Instagram caption or a movie trailer, that's what I want to do."



The Love of God

God loves you so much, no matter how holy you are, you cannot do anything to make him love you more. God loves you so much, no matter how vile you are, you cannot do to anything to make Him love you less. God is love. God loves us because it is His very nature. At the end of the day, it has nothing to do with your actions!

We allow ourselves to relate to God based upon our assumptions of how "good" we are. We believe that if we have done all the "right" things, we have earned enough points to cash them in and get an answer to a prayer or a ticket to heaven. If we have acted the opposite, selfish, ugly, or angry,

we feel as if we do not have the right to ask God for anything. We can also compare ourselves to others when this is clearly not our measuring stick. We try to relate to God based upon our behavior.

The Bible tells us that we are to walk by the Spirit and not by our flesh. The flesh is defined by our five senses – sight, taste, hear, touch, and smell. When we base the love of God on how "righteous" we are compared to others, we grossly misunderstand the very nature of God. When we frame our behavior, whether good or bad upon our flesh, we limit Christ in us. If we reduce our gaze to our flesh only, we miss the most important element of relating to the Lord.



We relate to God by faith - without faith it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6). We walk by the Spirit and live out this journey through faith. We must realize that our Spirit is always perfect and loveable and always ready to communicate with God. This is because of what Jesus did on the cross – not our actions. The Bible tells us to acknowledge everything good in us. "That the communication of thy faith may become effectual by the acknowledging of every good thing which is in you in Christ" (Philemon 1:6), contrary to what our flesh may be telling us.

Therefore, our days on this side of heaven are not

about making our flesh better – it is about renewing our minds so we may understand God's love and the treasure we possess within our Spirit. (Romans 12:2). When our minds are renewed, our actions will follow.

As believers, we should interpret our life through the lens of God's Word, not our flesh and not our actions. We must believe what the Bible states over our circumstances. When we read about how much we are loved by God, and that He gave his only Son for us to have everlasting life, (John 3:16) we must allow ourselves to believe this awesome truth and relish in His love. We must realize that God loves us, not because we are lovely but because He is love!

cells healthy. Think about a typical fast-food burger: two small pieces of bread (the bun) plus a slab of meat. Without cheese or sauce, most burgers like this have about 300 to 400 calories. Those calories come from carbs in the bread (roughly 40 grams), protein in the meat (around 17 grams) and fat (around 10 grams). An order of fries, on the other hand, is just a tray of fried potato. It has a lot of fat and carbs — which give it about the same number of calories as a burger — but very little protein. By swap-

ping the fries for a second burger, you're nearly doubling your protein intake while reducing the amount of fat and carbs you're eating.

Spicy mustard

To burn more calories without moving a muscle, spread hot mustard on your next sandwich. Studies show hot condiments such as cayenne pepper sauce and mustard temporarily pump up your metabolism, so fat melts away 25 percent faster for up to three hours.

When Should You Give Someone the Benefit of the Doubt?



Misunderstandings. Ambiguity. Well intended comments that go awry. When these things happen our personal experiences and expectations tend to fill in the uncertain blanks.

When there is a potential for misunderstanding, it can be helpful to offer the benefit of the doubt. Offering the benefit of the doubt can build and strengthen relationships. So, the question is – how do you know when or if you should offer the benefit of the doubt? Today, I will share a few secrets that I've learned in the studio.

Secret # 1 Decide in Advance

We can't control when uncertainty comes our way, but we can decide in advance to live with a renewed mind. When someone says something that you're not certain about you may want to start with the benefit of the doubt. Let's say you have a new friend that cancels at the last minute citing a family situation. Then later you hear from a third person, that the family situation was fabricated. You might not want to rush to judgment. There may be a valid explanation. If later, you discover with certainty that the excuse was fabricated it might be time to put on the brakes. When extending the benefit of the doubt is your first response, you avoid filling in uncertain blanks with suspicion and negativity.

Secret #2 Trust Your Gut

As believers we know it's the Holy Spirit that gives us that cautionary red flag, or all is well green light. I remember talking with a Bridges guest whose math didn't add up. She said that in 1978 she couldn't feed her 4 children on \$100,000 a year. That math didn't add up for me. She seemed sincere, so I listened and asked more questions. What she meant to say was that in 1978 she was earning \$10,000 per year. With 4 children and looming debt she had trouble making ends meet. She was nervous and mis-spoke. Nit-picking this conversation would have been easy to do. But offering the benefit of the doubt gave room to strengthen the relationship, and offer Bridges viewers a hope filled story.

Secret #3 Holding On & Letting Go

Knowing when to hold on and when to let go is a complex task. Scripture encourages us to hold on to what is good – to think on all things good and noble. Scripture also instructs us to let go of the cares of this world and the weight of things that hold us down. It's a heavy load to carry suspicion and pick apart conversations with the hopes of finding a flaw. Of course, we don't want to live as the naïve or gullible, but with Christ's help we can look for the positive and give the benefit of the doubt unless we see that it is no longer a healthy option.

Today's Secret from the Studio: Offer the Benefit of the Doubt unless you're certain it's not a healthy option.

Shark Tank's Manuel & Geiszel Godoy:

Business Built

When Manuel and Geiszel Godoy appeared on the "Shark Tank" television show to pitch their unique business plan, their excitement exuded through the screen. Their passion for diverse storytelling impressed the show's celebrity judges and increased the visibility of their already-successful business. Today, the Birmingham, Ala. born-and-bred married couple conManuel and Geisel Godoy appeared on an episode of "Shark Tank" in 2022. Although they didn't accept the \$500,000 offered, they credit their increased visibility to appearing on the show.

tinues to follow their dreams, relying on faith to help them do business the "right way."

Diverse Stories. The Godoys' business, Black Sands, tells the stories of African American history in a new and exciting way; it uses comic books, graphic novels, novelizations, and animation to introduce readers to black heroes that have often been lost to history. Husband Manuel is the creative force behind the stories. An avid video gamer, he originally wanted to design games that showcased black characters; the cost of video game production, however, changed his focus. "We decided to go with comic books, and it turned out to be the perfect decision," he said. "There's not enough content out there, especially with historical settings. I wanted to create books that showed African life in antiquity."

His first creation–and still the standard bearer and the company's most popular product–is the namesake Black Sands, which is set in ancient Egypt and features the main character who is a teenage boy named Ausur. His dream is to become Pharaoh over ancient Egypt; ultimately, that dream leads him to save the kingdom from the evil Titans of ancient Greece. "He's trying to prove that he can be the next ruler of the kingdom and he struggles for legitimacy," Manuel explained. "There's a war with Sparta and ancient gods, and he gets in way over his head. But people really like the character, because he stays true to his convictions, and he never walks back from his decisions. He never regrets what he believes in."

Creating a story based on ancient history and myths involved a lot of research, and Manuel stayed true to his conviction to make it accurate even while using poetic license to imagine a new world of characters. He said it was important to follow a "golden rule" of cultural presentation. "I need to be accurate when it comes to societal norms, food, dress, politics, and so forth," he said, "while also making sure that the power given to armies and politics balances well with the heroes and legendary figures." While the comics and books aren't specifically Bible stories, Manuel says he "sneaks" Bible locations and historical Bible characters into the stories. "We throw little hints in there," he said. "We'll mention giants in Canaan and other people and places mentioned in the Bible." Other stories in the Black Sands collection include: "Muntu Warriors" (the story of a South African science professor who becomes a superhero), "Granada's Shadow" (the story of a young Moor "pushed to the brink" in the Crusades), "Madagascar" (the story of a young queen who fights colonial powers), "Mask of the Orisha" (the story of the Orisha mythology in west Africa), and "Lion's Game" (a martial arts story in the black community).





Geiszel Godoy adds her creative spin on Black Sands' products and is the author of *Mori's Family Adventures*, which is the inspiring story of a black family traveling through South Africa. All of the Black Sands creations fill a niche that the Godoys found lacking when they were young parents themselves. "Every child needs to know about their heritage and culture," Manuel said. "We couldn't find those things for our own family, so we made them ourselves. We want to have heroes who reflect their ancestral upbringing." Manuel said he's particularly cognizant of creating "family friendly" products that can be read by kids starting in middle school–but can remain favorites as their readers grow into adulthood. "There are complex storylines, but no sex or violence," he said. "I'm going to make content that's accessible to middle school students, but that parents and grandparents can buy and love too. I've heard people tell me that their dad read one first, then told them about it. It's passed down."

Southern Roots. Manuel and Geiszel now live and operate their business in Delaware, but their roots are in Alabama. Geiszel was born in Birmingham and attended Center Point High School and then Faulkner University in Montgomery. Manuel graduated from Calera High School, and his entire family remains in Shelby County. They were both stationed in the Army in the early 2000s (both in Germany) but met and married afterward. "We met at Salsa Night at Workplay in Birmingham on New Year's Eve," she said. "Six months later we got married." Manuel had a degree in economics, and Geiszel had one in fashion and management that led her to work for Calvin Klein. After having kids, however, they were inspired to start Black Sands. They founded the company in 2016, and one of their first sales strategies was operating a kiosk in the Riverchase Galleria in Hoover. "That was our first time

with a physical place to sell our products," she said. "People really liked it, and it took off." They have since found success through various outlets. They sell their books straight to customers on their website and do special work with school systems. In fact, working with Birmingham area schools holds a special place in their hearts. "We've been working with Birmingham City Schools

and we love driving down to visit with the classes," Manuel said. "We have one book for every sixth grader in every school in the system."

Shark Tank Experience. In January of 2022, the Godoys appeared on an episode of "Shark Tank" to pitch funding for their company from hosts including Mark Cuban and actor Kevin Hart. "We've watched the show since it first aired 13 years ago and we've always been big fans," Gieszel said. "Manuel put together and submitted our proposal, and we were excited to be on stage. I prayed for the whole process." While Cuban and Hart offered \$500,000 toward Black Sands, the Godoys left negotiations and decided to go back to the success they'd already had on their own. "It just wasn't for us," Manuel said. "There's a lot of red tape with celebrities, and I'd already gotten this far through conversations with

my community. It had to be either-or, and we had to go with what we already knew." Still, the Godoys said that their appearance on "Shark Tank" greatly increased their visibility. People suddenly knew about their comic books, their company, and their mission. "It gave us massive credibility," he said. The company is now looking to stand on its own with new investors. Black Sands has started a novel division, has a video game in production, and plans to venture into animation and a televised or streamed series.

Faith-Guided Business. According to the Godoys, their business model is one based on principles they follow as Christians. In addition to including references to Biblical locations and characters in their stories and striving to create family-friendly products, the company's plans are guided by the Godoys' moral and spiritual values. "To be a successful entrepreneur, we believe you have to put God first in your life," Gieszel said. "If you follow Him, He will lead you to the right path." She also said that you must keep and follow a moral compass, recognizing that God desires that you use your influence to help others. "We believe that if much has been given to you, you must be reciprocal," she said. "You have to give back to the community and do positive things." As she and her husband look to the future in their marriage, family, and business life, she said that she'll rely on her favorite Bible verse-Philippians 4:13. She knows that they can do "all things" if they put their trust in Christ. "That's my favorite verse, and I try to keep it always in my mind," she said. 

4 Tips To Get Stains Out of Carpet

Carpets are warm, soft landings for our feet. But the downside is that they collect dirt and debris from our shoes, kids, pets, and everyday life. Spots on your carpet can be distressing, distracting, and annoying but they don't have to be. There are ways to keep your carpet looking beautiful despite daily foot traffic and the occasional spill. Once you have the right information on how to remove carpet stains, you'll be able to tackle them head-on without panic. First of all, every type of stain, whether red wine or mud, should be treated as soon as possible. The faster you remove stains from carpet, the less time they have to settle in and bond with the fibers. So as soon as you see a stain, jump into action with these cleaning pro tips:



1. Blot, Don't Rub

When liquid gets spilled on your carpet, quickly grab a plain white paper towel or white rag. It should not have any writing or designs because you don't want to run the risk of dye transferring to the carpet, which will make things worse. Blot the stains instead of scrubbing or rubbing, as those actions could fray the fibers and change the carpet's appearance. Blot up as much liquid as possible, working from the outside of the spill to the middle to prevent it from spreading. Once the liquid is absorbed, pour a little bit of cold water on the area, and blot it to dilute it. Hot water is not advised because it can cause the stain to set into the fibers.

2. Use Baking Soda, Vinegar, and Peroxide for Extra Help

A tried-and-true cleaning trick is to use baking soda for carpet stains. Baking soda is an excellent cleaning agent because its abrasive nature helps remove dirt and stains. Hydrogen peroxide is also effective, as it helps kill bacteria and mold. And white vinegar is also great for eliminating odors and loosening food stains. These natural cleaning agents are inexpensive and can work wonders on removing stains from your carpet.

You can make a baking soda and hydrogen peroxide solution by mixing one cup of baking soda with two cups of hydrogen peroxide. Apply the solution to your carpet, and blot it with a clean white towel (remember, use one with no print or writing). Let the solution sit for 30 minutes before rinsing it with water. To remove stains with vinegar, mix it with an equal amount of water in a bottle, then spray the solution onto the stain. Dab it off with a white cloth or paper towel. Don't worry if your house smells like vinegar; it will go away in a short amount of time.

3. Grab the Club Soda

When people talk about how to remove carpet stains, club soda is frequently recommended. Using club soda after a spill does work well to lift the stain from the carpet. Start by blotting out as much of the spill as you can. Then pour the club soda directly onto the stain, being cautious not to oversaturate the area. Allow the soda to sit on the stain for at least five minutes before blotting it off. Rinse the stained area with a cloth soaked in water and allow the carpet to air dry.

4. Dab with Shaving Gel

Shaving gel does a surprisingly good job of lifting food and grease stains

from carpet. Put a dab of shaving gel on the stain, let it sit for several minutes, and blot it away. The soapy, foamy consistency works wonders when it comes to removing stains from carpet fibers. So, don't hesitate to try this little-known carpet cleaning hack.

Keep Carpets Clean in Your Home

As you can see, removing stains from carpet is not as overwhelming as you might think. And maintaining clean carpets is easy if you keep up with regular care. Vacuum your carpets at least twice a week, using slow, repetitive strokes. On average, it takes about 15 minutes to clean 300 square feet of carpet.

PARENTING POINTS

Masking My Words, Not Just My Mouth – Filtering My Words To Protect The Children!

Being a divorced parent or a step parent presents us with thousands of opportunities to either "tell the truth" or to filter our words to protect the kids. Many times we have a difficult co-parent (or ex-spouse) who constantly undermines us or tries to make things look bad about us to the children.

I continually remind my clients that the only person you can control is yourself. You cannot make the other parent do the right thing or stop doing the wrong thing. You can't make the other parent show up on time or



stop saying negative things about you... however, what you CAN control is what you let out of your mouth in response.

Like all the facial masks we are wearing right now, they are intended to protect us from what is around us AND they are intended to protect others FROM us (if we have germs that are not healthy). In co-parenting, there are a critical moments we REALLY need to utilize a "mask" - - not a tangible mask but a verbal filter that keeps things from being said that will hurt the kids in the long run.

• If you have a co-parent that is consistently negative about you, be the exact opposite and tell your kids positive things about that person.

• If your co-parent changes the schedule to try and make you look bad to the kids, don't get entangled in the details of trying to explain it to the children – instead, make the most of the time you do have together and address the co-parent privately when the children are not around.

• If your co-parent is jealous of your new partner (the kids' new step parent) try to deflect the situation and remind the kids that they can never have too many people who love them (instead of telling the kids why you are no longer living with their other parent).

•Listen more, talk less: when kids are expressing their pain or confusion about coming back and forth between homes, ask them how they feel and let them talk. Always look for a positive way to give them permission to like and love everyone in their complex family.

Many times it's not what we say, it's what we leave UNSAID that helps protect children the most! They will grow up and remember who was negative and who was nice. Rise above and be nice every chance you can!

To Anyone Who Thinks Christianity Is Hateful Or Bigoted

In 1971, John Lennon wrote a song that captured the spirit of a generation—"Imagine." In it, he invited us to imagine a world with "no heaven above us," "no hell below us," "nothing to kill or die for," and "no religion." The result he envisioned? "Imagine all the people / Living life in peace." Nearly a half century later, John Lennon's vision of religion-less peace is as alive as ever. But the question is: Was he right?

How Did We Get Here?

There is a growing sense in the United States that strong forms of religion—such as Christianity are the enemy of peace and brotherhood. Many Americans have now come to believe that Christianity is inherently hateful or bigoted.

John Lennon didn't invent this view. Historically, it began around the sixteenth century, when many Europeans, tired of their so-called "religious wars," sought to invent a liberal, secular notion of "tolerance" to counter the inherently "intolerant" nature of Christian belief.

Eventually, the growing desire for tolerance evolved into the belief that war and religion were close cousins: Abolish the latter and the former would disappear. Atheistic French philosopher Auguste Comte (1798-1857) was one of the first to make this belief explicit, arguing that human beings are intrinsically good but are corrupted by strong forms of religion.

In the place of traditional religion, Comte proposed an atheistic religion that he called "humanitarian religion" or the "religion of humanity." This religion would retain the Christian emphasis on loving other people, but strip it entirely of belief in God or any type of transcendence. In Comte's view, we must get rid of Christianity if we wish to get rid of the "intolerance" that leads to all manner of evil.

Comte's religion—complete with a catechism and annual calendar of great secular heroes—was rejected and even ridiculed by his contemporaries. Yet, it seems that Comte won the day. Countless intellectuals, such as Marx and Freud, have argued that religion is a plague on humanity. I'm fairly sure John Lennon had never heard of Comte. But what he wrote in 1971 poetically captured Comte's vision.

In our own day, Comte and Lennon's echoes are legion. Consider, for instance, Martin Castro, the chair of the United States Commission on Civil Rights (USCCR), who, in a document entitled, "Peaceful Coexistence," stated that Christians are largely discriminatory, intolerant, racist, sexist, homophobic, and Islamophobic.

Consider the corporate bullies who threatened the state of Indiana for proposing a religious freedom law. Consider the more strident voices on television or in the news. Consider even your own Facebook or Twitter feeds. Everywhere we find people calling Christianity hateful and bigoted.

The question is: Are they right?

Three Responses To The Claim Of Christian Bigotry

In short, No. Christianity does not, by its nature, cause its adherents to possess hateful attitudes or commit hateful actions. Are there instances of Christians—or Christian societies—sinning against others? Of course. But there's a world of difference between arguing that Christians sin and arguing that Christianity causes those sins.

To say that Christianity is the cause of bigotry misses the mark for at least three reasons:

1. Christianity uniquely creates the conditions for tolerance.

Christianity believes in transcendent truths and, subsequently, rejects false ways of thinking or immoral ways of acting. Without this framework, tolerance is impossible. After all, one cannot be "tolerant" of something unless we disagree with it. That's the whole point of tolerance. "I disagree with you, but will live alongside of you. I will seek to persuade you but not coerce you."

2. Christian love is better than tolerance

Christianity does much better than to "tolerate" persons with whose way of thinking or acting we disagree. True religion takes its cues from Jesus, who calls His disciples to "love" persons with whom we differ. Tolerance can be good, but love is stronger. Instead of "I can hold my nose and put up with you," it says "You and I differ, but we both are made in the image and likeness of God. We both are sinners. We both are in need of a Savior." **3. When it comes to intolerance, the bigger danger is not Christianity, but secularism.**

The biggest flaw with the charge of Christian bigotry is historical myopia. Throughout history, it has been the implementation of secular ideology that has led to the most sustained and widespread intolerance and even hatred of other human beings.

The secular movements of the twentieth century were bloodbaths of hatred and bigotry. The French Revolution killed 40,000 dissenters and impris-



oned 300,000 more. The Nazis and their collaborators killed some 6 million Jews. In the Soviet Union, more than a million died in concentration camps and millions more by displacement, assassination, or starvation.

We Christians, too, have blood on our hands. It was Christians, for instance, who reinforced the slave trade in the United States for centuries. But there is a major difference here. The African slave trade was not the result of the Christian worldview. In fact, what overturned the slave trade was a re-commitment to Christian truth, as nearly all of the abolitionists were driven by their Christian faith.

In other words, Christianity possesses within itself the power to overcome hate and bigotry—not with violent retribution, but with selfless love and tireless work toward justice.

The Christian teaching about human dignity about treating others with respect—is grounded in the reality of God. The Bible reminds us that every human being is made in God's image, worthy of incalculable honor and compassion. Not only this, but the Bible also reminds us that the path to peace is not through tolerance, but through death and resurrection. Because Jesus died for us when we were His enemies, we can love others, even if they consider us their enemies.

Until Christ returns to establish His reign of peace, therefore, we Christians must continue to speak the truth in love, even if we are considered hateful or bigoted for doing so. For it this combination of love for people and intolerance of false ideas that characterized Christ's first coming and it is this combination that will characterize His future reign of peace.

Meet My New Co-Pilot In The Doctor's Office: Artificial Intelligence

AI Can Revolutionize the Doctor's Office

The more I learn about the growing uses of Artificial intelligence in health care, the more convinced I become about its essential place in not just the lab or radiology suite but also in the doctor's office. It can help usher in a world where tests and treatments are applied on an individual basis based on a patient's unique history and predicament.

ChatGPT recently passed a radiology board style exam, even as it also informed one of my patients that his hemorrhoids might be from prolonged sitting before I thought to mention that possibility to him. At the same time, AI (a program called Sybil) has recently been found to help with earlier diagnosis of lung cancer by picking up abnormalities earlier than a human eye might detect them. Another study showed that it could be employed to measure multiple factors that predict pancreatic cancer up to three years before usual diagnosis.

AI has the advantage of searching massive data bases for comparison purposes, allowing it to bring this to bear in detecting differences that signals early pathology. Earlier diagnosis leads directly to earlier treatments and cures. Dr. Miriam Bredella, a prominent professor of radiology at Harvard, told me on Doctor Radio on SiriusXM that a crucial purpose of AI in radiology is to rescreen many thousands of studies (X-rays, CT scans, MRIs) that were done for one reason and to use an AI algorithm to find something else, such as the amount of saturated fat in bone, which can correlate to other health problems, including insulin resistance, diabetes and osteoporosis.

A recent article in the journal Nature pointed out

that AI could help primary care providers by combining early diagnoses of certain conditions including osteoporosis with treatment recommendations. AI in this context would serve as co-pilot, helping to inform busy doctors of relevant options. Doctors like me are already used to dealing with patients informed by Google searches. AI-fueled information will be more precise, and as long as it doesn't undermine the



doctor-patient relationship, will prove helpful in guiding patients.

In fact, a new report from the consulting firm Accenture showed that advances in large language AI models could support or augment 40 percent of all working hours in health care. Seminars in AI application in clinical practice are taking place all over the country, from MIT to Stanford to the Mayo Clinic.

This past week on Doctor Radio Reports, Dr. Natalia Trayanova, head of the Alliance for Cardiovascular Diagnostic and Treatment Innovations at Johns Hopkins, described digital twins, a replica of something physical, such as the heart or other organ or an entire patient, a dynamic model based on personalized data that can be used to monitor how a system is aging, providing information of how to replace a part that is wearing out without stopping the process that the part is engaged in. The information can constantly be adjusted with new data, using artificial intelligence to help make predictions in terms of disease. Of course AI technology is still evolving, and it is highly dependent on the quality of the dataset/ health records used to train it, but amidst a huge shortage of healthcare workers AI will clearly be of help in a wide range of areas from preventive healthcare to pandemic preparedness, to drug discovery and development.

Don't get me wrong. I want medical decisions to still take place entirely between a health care provider and his or her patients. But AI, when utilized and vetted properly, can certainly speed and smooth and revolutionize the process.

1 Corinthians 2


IMAGINE...beyond our comprehension.


