Your son will have a printed copy of what types of purchases he can make. If he tries to purchase something that is not permitted, the transaction will be denied.



Happiness.

Everybody wants to be happy, right? I mean, that's what we're all chasing, isn't it? Our culture is obsessed with, "Finding the Thing that Makes You Happy." Magazines are filled with self-helps articles like "10 Ways to Find Happiness," and, "25 Ways to a Happier Life." Even our Declaration of Independence written by Thomas Jefferson in 1776 stated a right to "the pursuit of happiness."



Joy is a person's "internal" state of being whereas happiness is an emotion affected by external factors such as a promotion, a new car, a relationship, a breakup or a death. Happiness comes and goes depending on circumstances. Joy remains even in the most challenging of times.

Why? Because joy comes from God. We know because Galatians 5:22 says, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." Christianity and the Law

There are few areas of the law that present more perplexing questions for courts than the adjudication of church conflicts. Cases that involve controversies over the internal governance of a church, ownership or control of church property, pastoral leadership or financial management of a church can be challenging because they often turn on a question of jurisdiction.

The word jurisdiction is a combination of two Latin words: "juris" which means "of right", and "diction" which means "to speak". Taken together, jurisdiction means the right of a court to speak to, or judge a case or controversy. Over the centuries, and particularly since the sixteenth-century Protestant Reformation, there has been intense debate surrounding the proper role of civil courts in deciding cases involving church controversies. During the settlement of the American colonies there was a great proliferation of several religious sects and denominations, many of which fled Europe because of persecution. When the founders drafted our Constitution and Bill of Rights, one of their first priorities was to provide protection for religious freedom and church autonomy. The First Amendment was the first time in human history that a government carved out an express right of

individuals to worship freely without fear of government reprisal or interference.

The ideal of religious liberty enshrined in the First Amendment is a dual protection which students of the Constitution recognize as consisting of two separate clauses of that Amendment: The "establishment clause" provides "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion. The "free exercise clause" finishes out this sentence with the phrase: "or prohibiting the free exercise thereof." Both of these clauses serve as important protections for both individuals and churches from government intrusion into the affairs of religion.

Christianity is split between top-down Catholic-Orthodox episcopal hierarchies and Calvinist-Evangelical bottom-up congregational forms of church governance. In modern culture, churches do not always consist of merely a sanctuary and a baptistry. Quite often they have complex, corporate structures with branching faith-based affiliations like a church school, college, hospital, healthcare center, retreat or orphanage. Each of these church extensions are inextricably intertwined with the ministry, doctrine, culture and

spirit of their sponsoring church.

Like their secular counterparts, church-run organizations are not immune from internal legal conflicts. What distinguishes them from non-sectarian corporations is that these conflicts often involve doctrine-based issues. In my book *A Call To Order*, I address how churches can better protect themselves against the threat of civil lawsuits, and what to do if faced with a lawsuit over some internal church split or other legal issue. Some careful pro-active planning and drafting of bylaws and a mission statement or other internal governing documents can provide courts with direction and a religious-neutral approach to resolving such church disputes, while insulating churches from costly and unnecessary litigation.





You can reduce the friction in your life so that in the moment, you make the right decision. The less friction you have to make the right decision, the more likely you are to make that decision. Think about the things that tend to get in the way of making the healthy choice. Preparing for your day/week is how you reduce friction in your lifestyle. PARENT WITH PURPOSE

Help for Back-to-School Anxiety

An article in *The Journal of the American Medical Association* found that anxiety in kids ages 3-17 has increased over the last five years. However, there are tools to ease the path toward a less stressful start of the school year.

Reset rhythms and routines. The schedule has probably slid to late nights and mornings. Know that your teenager won't wake up raring to go the first day of school if they've been up past midnight the night before. Start setting alarms to wake up earlier. Work together as a family to set expectations. What are the new screen times? What is the curfew? What is expected of homework?

Re-evaluate how you want to spend time together. Does your teenager need to play two sports and guitar in the praise band? Does your tween need to spend two hours on social media and video games? At the very least, guard family dinner time, especially on weekends. Lots of good conversations happen around the table. Use this time to determine how school is going.

Resume healthy habits. Encourage outside play after school to relieve stress and allow a child to move the large muscles that don't get used much

during the day. Focus on serving healthy fruits and vegetables as snacks and with meals. Decrease sugar in all meals and drinks. Less sweets will keep the body healthy, less hyped, and teachers will thank you.

Remember to pray over your child, staff, teachers,

and school board. Pray for godly wisdom for those in charge. Ask God to protect the comings and goings of each family. Pray that the Spirit would guard your child's heart and mind. Ask God to make your child a bold ambassador for Christ in the school hallways and rooms. Consider joining a prayer group such as Moms in Prayer (www.momsinprayer.com) to keep accountable, share your burdens, and meet other like-minded moms.

Reassess throughout the year. Do you still notice anxious symptoms in your child such as clinginess, trouble sleeping, not eating, or difficulty concentrating? Caris Snider, author of *Anxiety Elephants for Tweens*, offers these tips for kids: practice deep breaths throughout the day, jot down three things



they are thankful for, and encourage them to share their worries. If your child continues to show symptoms, you may want to consider professional help.


Relax the boundaries for your teenager. You can pull back the reins anytime but know they'll make mis-

takes and offer grace when warranted. Practice listening to not only what they say but what they are not saying. Body language and eye contact will clue you in. You're preparing them for college and adulthood.

Through prayer and preparation, you can subdue back-to-school anxiety in your child this year.

MIGHTY WOMEN

Celebrating A Modern Persian Heroine

Marziyeh Amirizadeh, Marzi, is not a Persian queen but when you read her story, you might legitimately get confused with the actual Biblical heroine Queen Esther. Unlike Esther, an orphan in Persia expelled from Judea following the Babylonian conquest and exile of the Jewish people, Marzi is a native of Persia. Today that's Iran. She lives in the United States, her adopted country where, like Esther, she has risen to the occasion "for such a time as this." Like Esther, who put her life on the line to approach the

King to save her people, Marzi also put her life on the line. She did not go before the modern "King," the ayatollahs, to save her people from imminent death, but rather worked stealthily behind the scenes, against the ayatollahs, to affirm her faith, and for the well-being of Iran.

Marzi is an Iranian born Christian who fled the land of her birth, the land in which she came to faith. Just doing so put her life at risk. In Islam, Jews and Christians are granted the status of

dhimmi, a protected second-class citizen. But in Iran, the reality is somewhat less "favorable." Jews and Christians are persecuted, as is anyone who doesn't fit into the narrowly defined version of extremist Shia Islam that's hijacked Iran since 1979. Sunnis, Kurds, Bahais, and other religious and ethnic minorities are all in the regime's crosshairs.

Coming to faith as a Christian in Iran is not something to be taken for granted. As much

as there are morality police guarding how people dress and behave in public, simply being a Christian and affirming that publicly can be dangerous and life threatening. Marzi knows all too well. She was arrested, interrogated, brought to trial, and received a death sentence for what the Iranians called "apostacy."

But Marzi is not just brave like Esther, she's smart too. In her interrogations and even at trial, when accused of converting from Islam to Christianity, Marzi simply said, "No." She was never a Moslem, despite the Islamic practice that a child born of a



Moslem man is a Moslem, and that children born as such in Iran are registered as Moslems. She was forced to study Islam, but never avowed it, never embraced it, so she could never disavow it. Marzi enraged the judge, in whose hands her life was at stake, by recounting how God spoke to her against the judge's (and Islam's) belief that God only speaks to prophets and holy people. Some of her captors admired her faith and standing up to the many forms of intimidation and threats of not renouncing her Christian-

ity, even while challenging the underpinning of Islam.

But she didn't stop there. Marzi shared her faith in Jesus with her accusers, captors, and interrogators. She turned prison into her ministry. She challenged Iranian extremist beliefs. If Allah was really God, why could she not have a personal relationship with him? Why could Allah not speak to her directly? Why did Allah not understand prayers in her native Farsi rather than the required Arabic? If

their god were truly God, he would surely be multi-lingual and receive prayers in all languages. There were many "whys" in her search for faith, and then her affirmation of it.

Marzi was always searching for a personal relationship with God, to find the truth. She learned that their god is distant, with whom you cannot have a relationship, is always ready to punish you, even inflicting torture, for the most minor infrac-

tions. She never accepted Allah, revered in Islam, as the true God.


She understood they were lying, and was thirsty to get to know God. Eventually, God spoke to Marzi in a dream, revealing the true face of Islam, and God's love for her and all people. A God of love was comforting, made sense, and upended their god of fear. After this, God made Himself present in her life, and became her rock.

In coming to faith in the land whose Islamic leaders brand Israel "the Zionist entity" and "the little

Satan," Marzi also had a spiritual awakening about Israel and the Jewish people, how important they were to her faith and very existence as a Christian. This alone could have earned her another death sentence. Even in our conversation for the Inspiration from Zion podcast, she notes dispassionately, would be used by Iranian extremists to demonstrate her "spying" for Israel.

But Marzi does not do anything in half measures. Though Iran is the land of her birth, and the United States is where she's now a citizen and where she has completed two degrees, and even run for elected office, Israel was a dream, always on her radar. This year she fulfilled her dream and visited the Land of the Bible, the Land in which her faith was born, where Jesus lived. Visiting Israel aroused a special love for God's people, and inspired in her own faith. She came to Israel to share a message, that just as she was arrested and sentenced to death, and only a miracle saved her, and the Iranian threat to Israel is very real, God will also protect Israel as He has protected her.

2500 years ago, Esther beseeched the Jewish people to pray and fast for her, that she should be able to use her position to save the Jewish people from the death decree forced by the evil Haman. Today, Marzi represents Esther's bravery and boldness, is very much a bridge between Jews and Christians, an advocate for women's rights, religious freedom, and freeing Iran from the evil of the ayatollahs. We must join her in prayers for Iran, that the Iranian people will be saved from its evil rulers today, just as the Jews of ancient Persia were saved 2500 years ago.



Marzi's most recent book, A Love Journey with God, is an inspiring read, recounting the evil of Islam in Iran, her coming to faith, arrest and imprisonment, and her journey to freedom.



Jay honors his grandmother, Lillian Monroe, as the one who "assured church opportunities every weekend and planted the seeds that ultimately became my faith. Eventually, she suggested I 'might listen to the pastor rather than be occupied with the peppermint candies or doodling.' So, I began listening and wondering about what he was saying. I remember

giving my heart to the Lord during VBS (Vacation Bible School). During my teen years, I fell away from my earlier commitment until interest in a pastor's daughter, Diane, enticed me back. She always invited me to come to church where her father, Oren Nelson, pastored in a little Nazarene church. Finally, this wild-eyed wrestler showed up at the church, and I'm sure no matter what the sermon topic for preaching was that day, he determined it was going to end with a call to salvation. It was a beautiful moment when the Spirit opened my heart with 'Remember? Come on back home. I've been missing you.' I made a home with that young lady and our three children for the next 21 years."

Combining Insights

With over 55% of children living in non-traditional families, the Daughtrys feel it critical to find a roadmap through the complexities of coparenting. Their mission is bringing HOPE where life hurts.

After Jay and Tammy married, Jay decided to pursue a degree similar to what Tammy had just completed: a Master's Degree in Marriage and Family Therapy from Trevecca Nazarene University. They are a blended-family couple that merged with four children in 2009 (Tammy had one child and had divorced in 2001, and Jay had three children and had become a widower in 2006). They have enjoyed the addition of two sons-in-love and five amazing grandkids. Tammy and Jay are sought-after trainers who speak on single parenting, stepparenting, understanding complex families, understanding emotional abuse, co-parenting during the holidays, and protecting the couple bond in a blended family marriage.



In our work with children and teens, we have collected a series of important concerns and comments. Please share this with anyone that is co-parenting between two homes. It is a wonderful list of topics to be intentional and careful with that involve the shared children. Collectively, they have a voice that we try to share with parents around the world:



- **1.** Don't say mean things about my other parent. I want and need to love you both!
- **2.** When you criticize my other parent, it makes me angry at YOU!
- **3.** Don't make me pick who I want to spend time with—it's not fair and I will get hurt if you do that. And don't "keep track" of my time like I'm "on the clock." It can't always be 100% fair. Please just love me when we are together and don't make me feel bad about not spending the same amount of time with each of you.
- 4. Handle your financial conversations in private. I don't want to hear about it, and I don't want to be your messenger.
- **5.** Don't use money to win my love. Be a stable and loving parent, and I will love you no matter who has the "most" money.
- **6.** Don't keep me from seeing the other parent; if you do, I'll grow up to resent you.
- **7.** Get a counselor to help you with your problems. I need you to be strong and stable for my well-being. I don't want to hear about your dating and your disappointments. I don't want to hear about your problems at work or how much we are struggling financially. Talk to someone else. I need you to be my parent – don't make me be yours.
- 8. The harder you make it on my other parent, the harder you are making it on me.
- **9.** Laugh and smile! I want to enjoy my life and your mood impacts my mood. Find a way to be happy and enjoy your life. I need to have fun and enjoyable memories with you.
- **10.** Don't forget—I have a divided heart now. I live between two completely different houses, rules, traditions, and attitudes. Curtain Drain VS French Drain

Curtain drain is at ground level. French drain is at the bottom of footer. If you are having problems with water shed. Water running down hill on top of ground. Ditch or curtain drain may be an option. A true curtain drain should be 2x2 full of gravel. The gravel works as a filter, collecting the water and taking it away form the surface.

But if you are concerned with water in crawl space or basement a curtain drain will not take care of the problem. Water runs downhill, even under ground. In growing areas these problems may also be worse. Development disturbs water's natural and it must find a new path.

A French drain typically sits at least 8 feet below the ground, at or below the footing. The French drain is a pipe covered with filter fabric. Do you know a filter that does not need to be changed? At some point the pipe will clog. Depending on settlement and type of soil is a factor in how long a French drain will work.



This area we have a lot of clay soil so they tend to clog faster. Assume the French drain is a pipe 4" around. Now look a few years down the road and add 1" debris to 4"pipe; you only have 3" pipe for water to flow. Fast forward a little further, 2" of debris now only 2" pipe for water flow. And so on, before you know it you have more water than this narrow drainage canal can handle. Heavy rains, higher pressure - can't handle the flow.

Heartaches of French drains:

- Most common problems with French drains is root intrusion, crush or collapsed drains, and clogging.
- They don't last forever, they cannot be tested or cleaned out.
- Repairs are expensive and messy. Lots of digging. Disruption to outside of home and daily life.
- Dig down to pipe around home, under porches, decks, HVAC units. Etc. https://youtu.be/xZaCzub5ZXw



AN ENCOURAGING WORD

"Did I cry too much on the stand?"

There were many times when I wished I could be more like my daughter. She didn't fret over the details, even the ones that would have made me crazy. Such as, wearing a thin "church sock" on one foot and a thick athletic sock on the other for an entire day at school. Or if her shirt was accidentally inside-out and backwards, so be it. I have longed for that gift, and it has served my daughter well through the years when she couldn't afford to let distracting inconsistencies take her eyes off the big picture.

My over-attention to detail and order sometimes feels like a curse. Having had a restaurant of my own in the past, I cannot walk into one without immediately counting the number of burned-out lightbulbs or straw wrappers on the floor, how many times the phone rings before someone finally answers it, and if there is a misspelled word on the menu, it jumps right off the page and screams at me.

The grocery store often falls short of my expectations. There have been a few unforgiveable moments in the checkout line recently, ones that have been difficult to unsee. For instance, there was the clerk who made the mistake of grabbing too many produce items at one time and somehow thought it made sense to sling my green onions under her armpit until she could get to them. Needless to say, the green onions went into the trash on my way out the door.

So, considering the standard I try to set and maintain at Blue Monarch, one might imagine it would be hard for me to live with the natural clunkiness, chaos, and millions of moving parts that come with serving lots of women and children. I will admit, it is challenging. There is an element of surrender I must exercise every single unpredictable day, which begins with a deep breath and a prayer. I can do this. Big picture, big picture. Nevertheless, even though some details may occasionally fall through the cracks and the day rarely goes as planned, I have discovered this one thing: God acts on his own time and the miracle often happens in spite of us - in a way we never expect.

Take this incredible mother for instance. Jessie waited, and waited, and waited to be reunited with her daughter - a separation that only got more painful with each passing day, not easier. She woke up every morning to a tremendous loss - another day in her child's life she would never get back. No doubt, she must have asked herself a million times, "Should I have worn another outfit to court?", "Did I cry too much on the stand?" She probably exhausted herself, wondering what she should have done differently to get her daughter back. What detail did she overlook?

And as an organization backing her throughout this process, we poured into her circumstances and made multiple out-of-state trips, consulted with professionals, sought the best advice, submitted all the required documents, supplied letters of recommendation, presented all Jessie's accomplishments, educated the court on our

history of restoring families. We checked all the boxes, but her situation continued to drag on with little hope. There were days when this custody case seemed to take one step forward and two steps back as if there was an invisible force working against us. With a bit of weariness, we began to question what we might have overlooked or what we should have done better.

It's times like this when we are tempted to ask ourselves, "Did I not pray enough or use the right words?", "Should I have fasted more?", "Did I not get the God formula right?"



As we have often seen, one day with absolutely no warning, God made Jessie's situation come together by speaking to the heart of someone who could change the tide, someone we least expected. In the blink of an eye, this mother and her little girl were back together again.

Did we pay too much attention to the details? I don't think so because it's our duty to perform our jobs with excellence. That is the standard we uphold at Blue Monarch in everything we do, which honors God and the ones we serve.

But I suspect when God was good and ready to restore this family, it wouldn't have mattered if our socks were matching or not. He finds perfection in our imperfection anyway. Besides, you can't tell me this picture isn't already perfect in every way. Yep, I don't think I would change a thing.

Lord, please teach us to find peace in expectancy of your faithfulness. Amen.

PRAYER

The Next Time You Offer Prayer, Consider This

Most of us have said the words, "I will be praying for you" when our friends or family are going through hardship. But how many times have we genuinely taken those prayer requests boldly to God? What would happen if rather than offering to pray privately for our friends in times of need, we instead asked if we could pray with them?

For a long time the thought of praying in front of other people made me extremely uncomfortable--even with my closest friends. Maybe you can relate. After all, at one point Jesus did chastise religious leaders for praying in public: "And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you" (Matthew 6:5-6).

This scripture admonition shaped my thought process on the importance of praying privately for years. However, at that point in my life I had also never experienced having someone pray for me, with me. My first encounter with this happened after a sermon at church one Sunday. I was telling a friend about an exciting revelation I felt God had put on my heart earlier that week when suddenly she asked if she could pray for me right then and there.

I remember it vividly because not only was she offering to pray for me in the middle of a room filled with people buzzing around us, she was suggesting we pray as a means of celebration rather than supplication. I timidly accepted, worried how awkward I would feel. I could not have been more wrong. The words she spoke over me made me feel so seen and loved by God in that moment. He taught me an invaluable lesson that day about the need for boldness and encouragement within the body of the church.

Though Jesus did preach against public prayer that is rooted in a desire to be admired or perceived as "holy," we cannot lose sight of all the places where He stressed the importance, and truly, necessity for believers to pray together. In Matthew 18:19-20 Jesus taught, "Truly I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything they ask for, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them." Notice how Jesus emphasizes that it is when we gather together, not just pray separately for the same things, that His power fully manifests behind our requests. He reinforces this in Hebrews 10:24-25, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another." Jesus knew more than anyone how lonely and hopeless we can feel at times. This is especially true for His followers, because we have been spiritually attuned to recognize how much darkness exists in this world.

That is why He insisted that we pray and encourage one another together, not out of a need to check off some religious box, but rather so that together we may move His will forward on the earth as it is in Heaven. We need to be spiritually lifted out of our own perspective at times, and the most effective way to do this is to join with other believers in faith, hope and love –through prayer.

If you feel uneasy about the idea of praying out loud in front of other people, I would first encourage you. You are not alone; I think most people feel this way initially. However, instructions from God rarely feel natural to us

initially. Creating these habits takes time and repetition, and God provides us with so much grace as we find our footing.

Ask God to give you courage and to put friends or family members on your heart who you can pray with either over the phone or in person. When we step out in faith and rely on His strength--even as we pray--He equips us and brings beautiful fruit from our lives. Your prayers could be exactly what someone needs right now. Don't miss an opportunity for God to use you!

"Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 4:16).

5. Put Cleaning Supplies Where You Use Them

Keep cleaning supplies where they're needed, so you never have to cart them from room to room. For example, if you have four bathrooms in your house,

FAITH @ WORK Does God Exis/17

As a Christian writer and speaker, I get this question all the time. And while my approach to answering it differs based on the context and the person asking, my answer is always the same: "Yes, God exists. God is real and He has communicated Himself to human beings through mighty acts in history, through the life and ministry of Jesus Christ, and through the Bible."

Also, "If you'd like, I can provide some 'proofs' that confirm His existence. But—and this is important—even when you're not absolutely certain about God, believing in God is still the most reasonable and rational decision you could make." Let's talk about proofs first. What's some good evidence we have for God's existence?

The Cause Argument

One proof has to do with the existence of the universe. How did the universe come into being? This might seem like an obvious question, but philosophers weren't always puzzled by this, since—for centuries—most believed the universe had no beginning at all. But many scientists now believe that the universe came into being very suddenly in what is called

Here's the puzzle the Big Bang introduces: what caused it? Or, rather, who caused it?

This puzzle led agnostic physicist Robert Jastrow, founder of NASA's Goddard Institute of Space Studies, to write, "A sound explanation may exist for the explosive birth of our Universe; but if it does, science cannot find out what the explanation is. The scientist's pursuit of the past ends in the moment of creation." The Big Bang presents a question that atheistic scientists have great difficulty answering. Jastrow's conclusion? Theologians have long known what scientists cannot prove: there must be a Creator, a God who caused the universe to be.

The Design Argument

Another proof has to do with the order in the universe. It's often called the "design" argument because it argues that the universe's complex and intricate design leads us to believe that there must have been a Designer. If you find yourself admiring the Apple watch you purchased recently, complete with a sophisticated electronic infrastructure and sleek cover, you wouldn't feel thankful to the watch for designing itself. But you might very well find yourself being grateful for Steve Jobs, who founded Apple, and for his team of designers who crafted the latest version of the Apple watch.

Lehigh University chemist Michael Behe, Notre Dame philosopher Alvin Plantinga, and many other intellectuals make this point another way, by pointing to the sheer impossibility of the universe achieving order without some external guidance. Even something as simple as the individual cell is so sophisticated that its design could not have evolved randomly.

The Moral Argument

A third proof has to do with the moral order of the universe. Most people believe that there are certain things that are absolutely wrong and other things that are absolutely right. This universal assumption of morality implies some kind of Law Giver.

Think about it. You probably think it is always and everywhere wrong to kill an innocent child in an elementary school. (Hopefully, you do.) You probably also think it is always and everywhere wrong to hate another person merely because of his or her skin color. If so, you

believe in an absolute "moral law."

But here again, we find a puzzle for atheists. If our moral ideas really are laws—not cultural assumptions or merely personal convictions—there must be something objective about them, something that stands "outside" or "over" us. You don't gain moral authority by saying, "Because I said so." If the moral law comes from us—either individually or collectively—it loses its authority. In order for something to be absolute and binding on all people, it must come from Somebody outside of our world. That Somebody is God.

Pascal's Wager

I could go on. But as I mentioned to begin with, even without these proofs, belief in God remains completely rational and reasonable. This point was made, famously, by French mathematician, scientist, and philosopher Blaise Pascal.

Pascal argued that atheists cannot prove for certain that there is no God. Most thoughtful people understand this, which is why people who don't think God exists prefer to call themselves agnostic ("We can't really know") rather than atheist ("There is no God").

Because our decisions about God's existence could never arrive at absolute certainty, Pascal recognized there would always be an element of chance. We have to wager, betting either for or against God's existence.

Pascal argued that betting for God is the only wager that can pay off. If God doesn't exist, then the believer and nonbeliever are in the same boat—everyone loses. But if God does exist, the stakes change dramatically: betting for Him carries enormous benefits; betting against Him carries enormous loss.

Pascal was right. Even if our "proofs" of God's existence don't allow us to see or touch or hear God, there is good reason to wager that He exists. I'm not much of a gambling man, but I can say this: believing in God is the best bet you'll ever make.


