Medicare Open Enrollment Starts Soon

Yes, it has come around again and soon your mailbox, email, and TV commercials will be telling you that open enrollment is here!

So, let's take a look at what Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) is all about. If you have a Medicare Advantage Plan or a prescription drug plan (PDP) this is the time of year you get to review how those plans have done for you. You will be receiving from your plan's carrier toward the end of September a letter called the ANOC letter (annual notice of change). It will tell you what the changes on your plan will be for 2024. Remember to open this letter from your carrier and not put it in file 13!

If you don't do mail, then hop on your computer beginning October 1st; you will be able to log on to Medicare. gov and check out your plan there.

You may also see your plans info in the 2024 Medi-

care&You that will be mailed to you. It's available on their website but does not have local information on plans/carriers.





The open enrollment signing period is October 15th through December 7th. If you decide to make any changes your new plan will start January 1, 2024. If you don't make any changes then your current plan will roll into 2024 and you don't have to do a thing!

Suggestion – call your Medicare Rep and discuss next year's plan with him or her! Every year we must get recertified with Medicare and the Carriers to be able to offer suggestions as to what would be the best route for you in 2024. We are blessed to have such a great healthcare system in middle TN and that attracts many companies that want to do business here.

Remember this is about your healthcare coverage for next year. It's worth taking a look! And this time next year – we get to do it all over again!

May It Please the Court

Since time immemorial, lawyers have used this ritual greeting to open their remarks to a judge or an appellate panel of judges, including the Supreme Court. It's precise origin is unknown. It is used universally, but seems to be more commonplace in courtrooms in the south. I routinely begin my remarks with this introduction, and have done so in courts across the country starting with my earliest days as a trial lawyer.

"May it please the court" is a demonstration of respect and shows appreciation for the opportunity to address the court. It is also a verbal recognition that a courtroom is a solemn place of justice where proper decorum should be observed. For me, it is a subtle recognition of Paul's reminder in Romans 13 that the judge is a minister of God for good.

The Supreme Court takes a formal approach in its Guide for Counsel. The Court opens with the statement after the gavel is struck three times: "The Honorable, the Chief Justice and the Associate Justices of the Supreme Court of the United States. Oyez! Oyez! Oyez! All persons having business before the Honorable, the Supreme Court of the United States, are admonished to draw near and give their attention, for the Court is now sitting. God save the United States and this Honorable Court." Counsel is instructed then to address the Court: "Mr. Chief Justice and may it please the Court . . ." I recall my first time before the Supreme Court. Just as the last words "God save this Honorable Court" were uttered, a gentleman in the back of the courtroom stood and began shouting: "Murderers! Murderers!" The court had just affirmed a death penalty case out of Florida the day before, and this protester had managed to make his way peacefully into the courtroom. Without so much as flinting, the Chief Justice nodded to the courtroom deputies who perfunctorily seized the man removing him from the courtroom. Business as usual. Decorum restored.

Some practitioners argue that the legal profession should abandon this time-honored phrase as anachronistic. Personally, I believe that our profession has lost some of the civility that it had in years past. Perhaps I am a bit old fashioned, but I think we should hold on to anything that maintains a respect for the court and the process, anachronistic or not. It also signals to the clients that this is a serious, somber endeavor, and different from the day-to-day.

Bryan A. Garner, a widely-respected legal author and editor-in-chief of Black's Law Dictionary, recently asked active judges whether they felt the phrase "May it please the Court" was an outdated formalism or a welcome sign of professionalism. The general consensus was summed up by Ninth Circuit judge Susan Graber: "Its absence is always more notable than its presence, so I prefer lawyers saying May it please the Court." Though the phrase is "totally pointless," it's also "largely harmless, so it's a good way to get started," added Ninth Circuit Chief Judge Alex Kozinski. Chief Judge Frank Easterbrook of the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals in Chicago noted, "It may help some lawyers get started; icebreakers have their place." And, said Judge Jon O. Newman of the Second Circuit in New York City, "sometimes it's the only thing a lawyer says that doesn't get immediately challenged."



See the Gospel Story Come to Life

The Thorn is making its way to Tennessee this Fall for its first ever Fall tour. This stage show tells the epic story of God's love for the world and the spiritual battle for all humanity. Often described as cirque meets the passion of Jesus, The Thorn features music, drama, aerial acrobatics, dance, fire, and more. The show first began in Colorado Springs, Colorado, as an illustration to showcase to students what God has done for humanity and over the past 25 years, it has evolved into a national touring show with a cast and crew of over 50 people and has since been adapted into a movie which was released in March 2023.





The Thorn creator, John Bolin, says God called him: "to tell stories on the page, stage, and screen," an assignment he has now completed with the film version of "*The Thorn*." His books include novels (*The Eden Project*) and Christian growth guides (*So Loved, The Two Doors of Heaven*, and *Life Unlimited*). He and his wife, Sarah Bolin, have taken the story of the gospel and transformed it into a creative showcase that has garnered a viewership of over 1 million.

Told from the perspective of John the Beloved, *The Thorn* takes you on a journey from creation to resurrection, bringing to life the story of the gospel. Walk through the garden with Adam and Eve, encounter Judas as he betrays Jesus, and mourn with Mary over the loss of her son. As you are drawn into the story, experiencing it alongside these known Bible characters, you will come to experience the story more intimately.

Parents, be aware that the show is recommended for ages 12+, with some scenes depicting the brutal reality of crucifixion. Children ages 6+ have enjoyed the show, however, the death of Jesus can be intense and takes place in the first 30 minutes of act 2. Parents are encouraged to use their discretion in bringing young children.

Although polls show that U.S. church attendance is declining, interest in Jesus is growing. "As I first saw with my students 25 years ago, people who may have jaundiced views of Christians or churches are more open to learning about who the real Jesus was, how he lived, and what he taught," said John Bolin.

While previous incarnations of *The Thorn* live show have been performed mostly at churches, the 2023 tour makes the show available to everyone at mainstream performing venues. "Jesus believes in accessibility," said Bolin. "He wants everyone to have access to the ultimate story of love and hope. That's why he came to earth in the first place."

Coming off of a successful Spring tour with multiple cities completely selling out, be sure to get your tickets and experience *The Thorn* this Fall. Performances in Tennessee include Chattanooga at the Soldiers & Sailors Auditorium on October 17 and Nashville at the Fisher Center for the Arts on November 4 and 5. Lives Changed Through the Programs of The Salvation Army: Meet Aeron



Aeron was a resident of the Riverchase Apartments in Nashville. After new owners purchased the complex, they gave everyone notice – their leases would not be renewed and they would be tearing down the apartments in several months time. The developer partnered with The Salvation Army to ensure all residents would have assistance in finding new homes before the buildings closed forever. Aeron says, "I'm not from here. I'm from Flint, MI, so I really don't

know Nashville like that...without the Salvation Army, it would have been like quite difficult to find somewhere."

Salvation Army housing navigators worked with Aeron and the other residents to both locate potential apartments and help them with their applications. "The Salvation Army actually had a list of places for me to go like...at least three pages long. Without them, I wouldn't have known where to start looking. I still would have been lost. Everything that we needed or had questions about, they there to assist," he said. It was hard for Aeron to find the time and funds to track down new apartments due to his work schedule, but the Salvation Army was able to take care of so much of the details and fees.

"Without the Salvation Army. I would have been lost. I would just say I recommend anyone that wants to go through Salvation Army...if you have any doubts or questions. Just come up and just talk to them. They're more than willing to talk to you and help you."

Soul Choir Brings Hope To The Marginalized With Its Unique Blend Of Gospel, Soul, And R&B Music!

"What is it that You really want us to be doing?" was a question I asked the Lord after decades of music ministry and becoming dismayed at what I was seeing in churches around the country. It wasn't that I was burnt out. My desire for ministry was just as strong as it ever was. I began to see church services starting to look like rock concerts with lasers and smoke machines and scripted services, and I was caught up in it. I knew that this was not what God had in mind for me. I had to re-evaluate my calling and what God's will for my life was. group developed into a high-energy, elite music ministry group of 12 professional-level singers whose unique blend of gospel, soul, and R&B music, helps to create an atmosphere that breaks down cultural and denomination-

al boundaries and allows God to move in powerful ways. Soul Choir's core

When I was younger in ministry, I heard someone say, "We are called to be fishers of men, not keepers of the aquarium." I realized that I had in a sense been "preaching to the choir." So, I searched the scriptures and God led me to Matthew 25:31-46 where the Lord explains the criteria He will use when separating the righteous from the unrighteous. He says in verses 35 and 36: "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, 36 I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came 2007 to visit me." I then read in James 1:27

"Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world."

And finally, what has become our defining scripture, "*The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound,*" Isaiah 61:1. Interestingly enough, this was the scripture that Jesus chose to read when he entered the synagogue in His own home town towards the beginning of His ministry. He made it his "mission statement."

I realized that I was being called outside the walls of the church. So, after much prayer, counsel, and insight from God's Word, I was inspired to start a music ministry group that would not only provide opportunities for people to use

their gifts for the Kingdom but also share their faith through the powerful catalyst of excellent music. So, in 2002, I started a music ministry group called the Heart & Soul Gospel Choir in Los Angeles. The group was hugely successful in staying true to its mission of bringing the Good News of God's unconditional love and our hope of salvation through Jesus Christ.

Then in 2007, after moving to Nashville, Tennessee, I started a similar group and shortened the name to "Soul Choir." This

ministry is to prison/jail inmates, the homeless, the military, and those who are hurting and feel they have no hope.

We want to restore, revive, and recruit souls for the Kingdom. We want everyone to know that no matter how marginalized they may feel, they have value, God has not forgotten them, and He has a plan for them. Since its debut at the Schermerhorn Symphony Center in October 2007, Soul Choir has shared the bill with, or sung behind many well-known Christian, Pop, and Country artists and has worked with countless ministry organizations throughout middle Tennessee, as well as other states and countries. They have also received "Volunteer of the Year" awards from the Nashville Rescue Mission and United Brotherhood Ministries.

Now in its 16th year in Nashville, Soul Choir is still going strong and continues its commitment to sharing the message of God's great love. They have been blessed to see so many lives changed before their very eyes. The more the group experiences evangelism like this, they grow in their own faith and come closer to knowing the heart of God.

It continues to be an honor for me to have the privilege of giving singers an outlet to use their gifts for God through Soul Choir, and I hope and pray the group will continue for many years to come. Trending@Trevecca: Writing with Loretta Lynn Provides Pinnacle Career Moment for Kim McLean

In a life defined by faith and songwriting, Rev. Dr. Kim McLean will always count her close friendship and co-writer relationship with Loretta Lynn among her greatest and most memorable career moments - and she believes her Trevecca education played a big part in arriving at that opportunity.

Together, they authored a devotional called *A* Song and A Prayer: 30 Devotions Inspired by My Favorite Songs which includes music from Loretta's catalog, hymns and original material written with McLean. The lyrics are each followed by an encouraging devotional.

Meeting Loretta

McLean was first introduced to Lynn by Lynn's daughter, Patsy. After an initial conversation, Patsy called McLean to ask if she would be willing to sit and talk to Lynn about her faith. As an ordained minister, McLean was eager to meet with her, and they read scripture, prayed and took communion together.

"Patsy said, 'Mama needs someone to talk about God with, because that's all she ever wants to talk about. She loves God so much, and she only wants to read the Bible," McLean recalled. "Patsy said, 'Go and pray with her and minister to her. Maybe you guys could write a song because she just loves memorable career moments. to write.' So it was just a match made in heaven, literally."

They began with one country song detailing what was going on in McLean's life, and Lynn invited her to stop by weekly and start writing songs grounded in the faith. "I want you to help me write some gospel songs. I want to tell everybody about my faith," Lynn had said. "She wanted this to be her legacy," McLean said. "She had all these ideas waiting and God was giving her the titles. So we wrote them and she just kept emphasizing, 'I want my name to be used to exalt Christ.""

Wanting to go even further than developing lyrics, the two began writing short devotionals to go with each song, 30 in total. They accompanied songs ranging from the new ones the pair had written together to Lynn's classics such as "Coal Miner's Daughter" to hymns like "Amazing Grace." McLean also recorded an album after Lynn had passed away of all the songs the two had written with this project in mind.

A Three-Time Treveccan

When it came to building camaraderie with Loretta Lynn and co-authoring the devotional, McLean's education and theology paved the way for new opportunities and a friendship that lasted to the end of Lynn's life in 2022. She discovered Trevecca after years of wanting to pursue her bachelor's degree.

"I got married when I was 18 and had my first child, and then I enrolled in a composition program in North Carolina," McClean said "I had an illness and

had to withdraw. Decades later, my children were grown and I had had success in the music industry. I said 'I've got some hits on the radio right now and I don't need a different house. I don't need a jet ski. I want my education."

McLean's first degree was in music business, and she added minors in religion and guitar and piano performance. Later, a calling to ministry led her to complete her master's in religion at Trevecca. She continued her education and received a third degree, completing the Doctor of Education in leadership program in 2018. Throughout these years, she was also leading Trevecca's songwriting program.

The Finished Work

McLean's education, life and songwriting experience and her interactions with Lynn all came together, and this spring A Song and A Prayer was published.

"A Song and A Prayer has gone to number one on three different book charts," McLean said. "It is a devotional book in the style of Oswald Chambers with similar formatting to Jesus Calling, except with song lyrics."

Ultimately, love is at the center of the message that Lynn and McLean hoped could lead readers to encounter God through a fresh lens. "I'm safe

to speak for Loretta in saying we hope that people come away knowing that God loves them beyond anything they could ask or imagine," McLean said. "We hope that they come away seeing the world through God's eyes and they recognize the goodness of the Lord. We hope they find comfort."



Oktoberfest, More Than Fun, A Man Helping Others As Jesus Would

"Thus also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead." James 14:17 NKJV

Dear friends, do you think you'll get anywhere in this life if you learn all the right words but never do anything? Does merely talking about faith indicate that a person really has it? For instance, you come upon an old friend dressed in rags and half-starved and say, "Good morning, friend! Be clothed in Christ! Be filled with the Holy Spirit!" and walk off without providing so much as a coat or a cup of soup—where does that get you? Isn't it obvious that God-talk without Godacts is outrageous nonsense?

We are specifically told in the Bible to help the needy, including widows, orphans, sick, hungry, unclothed, homeless. James, in the New Testament puts it bluntly, if you are not acting like God, taking care of the needs of others, where does that get you? Deuteronomy 15:11 ESV *"For there will never cease to be poor in the land. Therefore, I command you,*

'You shall open wide your hand to your brother, to the needy and to the poor, in your land."

Pastor Jeff Kane in Maury County, not only pastors Westminster Prepetition Church but almost single handedly runs Maury County Room in the Inn ministry. This Room in the Inn is a little different to what many churches participate in in the colder months, helping the homeless with a warm place to sleep for the night, dinner and breakfast before they go out again for the day. Pastor Kane, goes way beyond and helps homeless families find a place to stay, for sometimes months at a time, and helps them get back on their feet and back into society with their heads held high.

Founded in 2016, Room in the Inn Maury County has been working tirelessly to help those in need, helping over 700 people to date. The mission statement is that Room in the Inn offers shelter and support to Maury County residents experiencing homelessness by providing programs that emphasize human development and recovery through education, and self-help and work centered in community and long-term support. For the organization, there is a monthly cost of \$10,000 to cover one room, and donations are the sole source of income currently. The annual Oktoberfest event coming up at Riverwalk Park in Columbia is the largest fundraiser of the year. Obtaining grant funding would be something the organization could greatly benefit from, but grants are hard to get, and that means relying on donations from the community is the only way to survive. Yet, since 2016 they have been helping those who needed a hand up.

A resident manager says, "When people come to us, we will give them a food bag, breakfast items and snacks because most of the time they come to us hungry. We have people who have jobs, a car, a phone – everyday normal people. But then they get evicted after missing their monthly rent thinking they'll get to stay, and then they're left with nothing. We take them in until they get back on their feet. You could not ask for people better; they are so loving and generous with so much faith. They've done wonders for everyone who stays here and works to better their life, there have been ups and downs,



but I've enjoyed it. We have had some who were not suitable for the place, and we do what we can for them and then try to find other resources for them. Overall, Room in the Inn has been a success."

Some of those assisted are individuals while other rooms are filled with families. Room in the Inn Maury County's goal is to make sure those residents are taken care of while they also continue to work on helping themselves. It is about feeding their spirit as well as their body, to help them have faith and confidence again.

More people, working people, are getting left out in the cold by landlords, many times with their children. Pastor Kane, a quiet, gentle man, has done and is still doing a great service, fulfilling this great task Jesus has given us all to the best of his ability. He can use help and donations. Join him at Oktoberfest on September 29!

Meeting Jesus in a genuine faith experience at early ages is not surprising. Several years of life challenges rooted and built them up in their faith and now spills over into their family. However, lots of heartache and growth happened, growing the ABCs into being rooted. Cameron and Lauren voice parts of their story: "While my passion for sharing the gospel began at a Disciple Now weekend at First Baptist Church of Birmingham in 1993, it climaxed in a children's hospital resuscitation room on November 11, 2013. On that morning, my wife called me in utter panic, sharing the horror that our three-year-old son, Cam, had stopped breathing and had no pulse when she checked on him in his bed that morning. I raced from a youth campout to a children's hospital in time for the doctors to tell us they had exhausted all efforts: our baby boy was dead.

"As we went to the resuscitation room to see our son for the last time, Lauren and I recalled our conversation with Cam the previous afternoon. Cam told us that he wanted to 'go visit Jesus,' and he suggested that we hop in the car. We explained to Cam that Jesus was with us now in the Holy Spirit and that we would see Jesus face-to-face when God calls us to heaven. He, with a supernatural focus in his eyes, then asked, 'Will I see Adam and Eve in heaven?' (Pretty impressive for a three-year-old.) Lauren and I discussed and told Cam that, indeed, God appeared to forgive Adam and Eve's sin in Genesis 3. Cam replied, 'I'm not going to eat that apple. I not eat from that tree.' I told Cam that everyone eats from the tree and disobeys God; that's why Jesus came. Cam ended this conversation by saying, 'Jesus died on cross, Jesus died my sins.' The next morning, Cam passed into God's kingdom. "While I have had a passion for proclaiming the gospel of salvation since the seventh grade, never has its beauty and power been so real or palpable as the day we said good-bye to Cam.

Lauren and Cameron continue, "Many parents want their kids to be believers in order 'to be happy and be good people.' They often don't realize the magnitude of eternal salvation. Many think 'oh, kids can't understand spiritual things like God's truths; we'll get to that later.' Realistically, kids can have a

However, mixed in with his young thinking was "what God wants me to do is try really hard. I became a performance junky throughout high school, college, and grad school. I was a faithful Christian but was 100% performance with no concept of how God's grace impacted me as a Christian until I hit crash and burn in my first year out of graduate school. I was teaching inner city students and had about two thirds of a nervous breakdown.

"My pastor told me I was a Christian who had no idea what the gospel of rest is, that Jesus carries the burden, that I never have to prove myself by performance, that I was living my life as if I had to justify myself every day, and that Jesus had already done that once and for all. The pastor's revelations led to a huge transformation where I realized that God's unconditional love for me on the cross was the key to the gospel of rest.

"A greater sense of freedom and peace replaced the extreme stress and performance and ultimately led me into youth ministry. I really like pursuing relationships, studying the Bible, small group teaching, and discipleship. Jesus gave me His calling, equipped me with skills, passion, missions, and community—not the 'entertain 'em with super-fun-all-games-just-to-get- the-kidsin-the-door' mentality—there's serious eternity and the kingdom of God—so much more than the rah-rah. If you do gospel-centered youth ministry, you are a foundation builder, and building takes time. Temptation comes to do



relationship with Jesus, a profound knowledge of His Word, and can even have ministries at very young ages. Discipling them early, particularly in the knowledge of God's Word and truth, builds a firm foundation.

"In Rooted Ministry we try to equip and empower parents to become confident in discipling their kids the whole way in every-day life—not just in formal sit-down teaching sessions.

Cameron remembers being very afraid during a tornado in his third-grade year. He recalls praying with his parents and receiving Christ and knowing he was genuinely born again.

attractional, entertainment-driven youth ministry or behavior modification ministry that gets kids in the door. That's not making disciples. That's not forming a kid who has lasting faith. Kids are exposed to hard things at school and learn hard subjects (calculus, physics, analyzing British literature); they can handle God's Word!

"By far research shows that parents have more spiritual influence over their kids than any other source whether that's church, the media, youth group, or their peers. Thinking contrary to that is mythology—not grounded in science or research.



cringe. Seeing kids screaming for attention through provocative tweets and Facebook messages breaks my heart. Knowing the loneliness and alienation that comes in these years of self-doubt, religious questioning, and parental conflict causes me to lament. The heart of Rooted Ministry is that every child will receive Grace filled, Gospel centered, Bible saturated discipleship at church and at home. Effective discipleship is equipping parents and churches to disciple kids to life-long faith in Christ. Parents need a sense of urgency in their prayers for their children, in their commitment to church, and their willingness to share the Gospel with their children. Our son was healthy and just died mysteriously without

"Of course, some parents abdicate their role

and turn their kids over to the media, peers, and other sources to typecast their kids. It's never too late, however. If parents haven't been equipped and empowered to disciple their kids, they can choose to begin. The Holy Spirit can and will teach and equip a willing parent."

In Greenville, South Carolina, as a young child, Lauren remembers "bedtime prayers with my mom and asking lots of questions. Almost exclusively, I wanted to know about heaven so as not to go to hell. However, as my faith grew during Christian middle school and throughout college, I gained more understanding of the truth of the Gospel that had penetrated my heart: I was not saved just so I would be good. I actively participated in Campus Crusade for Christ, its summer projects, and even worked a year with international missions in Asia. Afterwards, I spent three years working in campus ministry."

Lauren is now a young mother whose three children are school age. She stands with Cameron, fully supporting him in Rooted Ministry and within their church with Bibles studies, young adults, and college graduates. Lauren has the honored position of first hearing the sermon or the teaching her husband is going to present and being the first to read every chapter he writes. Cameron speaks highly of her and depends on her to be his first filter in God's work.

Rooted Ministry. More than a chaperone

Historically, some churches have had a false paradigm for what youth ministry should look like. Churches may hire a youth pastor to be a gatherer—a pied piper. Abolishing that paradigm and helping churches understand that a youth pastor is a leader and a pastor—a teacher of God's Word—is paramount. In the same way that a senior pastor is expected to be a student of God's Word and a person who spends time in exegesis and interpretation, a youth pastor is to dedicate himself to biblical study. His ministry is to a different segment of the congregation, but he is still a leader and a teacher of God's Word. Pastors need to help parents have a vision for discipleship ministry what it looks like to form children into followers of Jesus with lasting, sustainable faith. A youth pastor needs to know how to read, interpret, and teach God's word, focusing on three commitments: Grow personal faith, build relationships, and study-study-study. Kids can tell if a leader is not prepared. A youth pastor is a pastor, a leader, but also a teacher of God's Word. Do it with credibility.

Rooted Ministry: The heart of youth ministry

We long to see God heal, redeem, and free young people as they trust Jesus personally; to see God birth something beautiful and redemptive in this broken world through their lives. We ache at the commonplace sufferings these young people endure. Witnessing the awkward, insecure, acne phases of middle school and the failed fashion experiments of high school makes me explanation one night. Life is fragile.

Rooted Ministry: Word training

Priority for students is increasing their ability to competently read, study, understand, and apply God's Word. Paul's well-known words to Timothy remind us that [Scriptures] are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Jesus Christ. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work (2 Timothy 3:15b–17). God's Word put to work can make Christians competent and well equipped for good works of obedience and ministry.

Rooted Ministry: Discipleship training

Students must not be merely told to mentor younger students; they must be shown how to walk with someone in a gospel-centered, Word-driven, prayer-empowered discipleship relationship. Youth pastors do this by modeling these kinds of relationships to their student leaders by discipling and mentoring them personally. With that foundation laid, youth pastors can explain to their youth leaders why they did what they did, their motivation for it, and how the student can apply those same discipleship principles to a relationship with a younger student.

Rooted Ministry: Evangelism training

Youth pastors and leaders should be training their students to share the biblical gospel fully, clearly, faithfully, and relevantly to unbelievers. Shame on us if we preach at them again and again, 'Share the gospel with your friends,' yet never equip them to do this well! Give them content; train and equip them to share the full biblical gospel, summarizing the story of the Bible—from creation to fall to redemption to the hope of future glory and restoration. They can learn to share it clearly and succinctly! Practice sharing the gospel—first in the safety of the youth ministry, but then in the 'field.' Have conversations with people who are not part of the church. The only way to get better at having these conversations is to start doing it. Youth ministry has a valuable, long-term role in the church. With that said, we do need to have a broader definition and understanding of what role youth ministry plays in the life of the church.

MIGHTY WOMEN

From Death Row in Iran to at Home in Israel

It's not every day that you get to meet a new friend who is an Iranian dissident, much less an Iranian dissident who was sentenced to death by hanging, and lived to tell about it. Two months after hosting Marziyeh (Marzi) Amirizadeh on the Inspiration rom Zion Podcast, she was in Jerusalem, and we became fast friends.

After Marzi came to faith as a Christian, she was branded by the Iranian regime a "filthy infidel," a title reserved for Jews and Christians. But in becoming a Christian, she also realized that despite the regime branding Israel and the Jewish people enemies, if Israel and the Jewish people are special to God, they were to her.

Coming to Israel for the first time is significant all Jews and Christians. "Israel is precious to me as a Christian because Jesus was a Jew, and this is the Land of the prophets and the Bible. God loves Israel and the Jewish people, and I love Israel because God loves Israel." For Marzi, coming to the Land of Milk and Honey was something she dreamt about, a pilgrimage and spiritual homecoming. She developed an intense love for the Land, and people.

I host Christian guests in my home for Shabbat often. But when Marzi came, it was transformative. I was the first Jew with whom she became friends. This was the first time she observed Shabbat. Over our meal, Marzi shared many details of her suffering in prison. When she spoke of her closest friends being tortured and executed, Marzi paused, unable to speak, tears rolling down her cheeks, reliving the horrors.

Her first Shabbat was powerful. "I had never been in a situation where a family gathers together, eats together, prays together and to be committed to that every week. It's honorable as a family and to God."

She was impressed seeing everything closed. On Saturday morning when she walked to the café that she became accustomed to, and realized that it was closed. That impressed her. "Seeing the whole country and people resting was inspiring."

Marzi found herself suffering from a PTSD she had never experienced in a dungeon-like structure under the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, the first time since her imprisonment that she'd been in a place that was nearly identical to her cell in Tehran. Marzi felt her breathing and demeanor change.

Marzi had dreamt about coming to Israel for years. As a Christian, Israel is significant to her in many ways. In every way, her trip was a spiritual pil-grimage. As the Land where Jesus and the prophets lived, it was exhilarating. She felt at home immediately.

On our first day together, Marzi joked about being arrested again. If that were to happen, now she would surely be tried as an Israeli spy. The irony of this was two-fold. Surely the Iranians would do it, but as a woman born in Iran, even with her US passport, her arrival raised eyebrows.

Marzi related how upon arrival she was asked to go to a room off the passport control area. A uniformed woman asked if she had ever been back to Iran since she left, obviously looking for someone with ill intent. Marzi simply stated that she had been tried and sentenced to death by hanging, and that it would not be safe for her to go back.

Immediately after leaving the airport, Marzi went to the Western Wall. "It was hard to believe I was actually in Jerusalem. I was so tired, but it was so exciting. I just started praying." She said, "There's a very good spirit you can feel



surrounded by people also with pure intentions praying. I felt God's presence deeply. The country and people and the history are precious for me."

On her last day in Israel Marzi visited Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Memorial. While trying to comprehend the murder of six million Jews, the evil behind it, and how more Christians didn't protect the Jews, she wept multiple times, choking back tears at others. She was confronted with a reality about her own faith that she never knew: not only did people who called themselves Christian conceive and implement the Final Solution, but tens of millions stood idly by, allowing the Jews to be massacred, even participating. She had no idea of Church history of persecuting Jews. This caused her tremendous distress, adding to the incomprehensible persecution and mass murder of the Jews.

She wept over the terrorist execution of Lucy, Maia, and Rina Dee, murdered during her visit. Driving by the scene of a terrorist stabbing attack in Gush Etzion, she struggled aloud about how and why it is that the Jews, God's chosen people, are endlessly attacked.

As much as Marzi wanted to come to Israel to be uplifted spiritually herself, she wanted Israelis to know that Israel and the Iranian people have the same enemy: the Iranian regime. Through several media appearances she expressed this openly. She says most Iranians do not hate Israel. She prays for the day that warm relations that used to exist between Israel and Iran will be restored.


Marzi is sure that the Islamic regime is on its last legs. One year ago this month, protests began after the killing of Mahsa Amini, spearheaded by women resisting Iran's "morality police" which subjugates women and girls as second class. She is praying that Iranians will take back their country soon.

Marzi emphasize the shared values, culture, and even history, going back to King Cyrus and Darius, "These Persian leaders helped the Jews return to Israel to rebuild the country, and Jewish honor. They understood that the Jewish people were chosen by God. Most Iranians don't know the history, or about Esther and Mordechai. It will take some work to undo the evil brainwashing by the regime, but Marzi wants to be a positive voice and part of making that happen.



MIRACLE MOMENTS Ratification of the 19th Amendment: America at Its Best

It all came down to Tennessee. It was the summer of 1920, and 35 states had ratified the 19th Amendment, guaranteeing women the right to vote. But the approval of one more state was needed to make this single largest extension of voting rights in American history the law of the land. Once the Tennessee State Senate approved ratification, it was up to the House of Representatives to enfranchise millions of American women.

The diverse group of suffragists fighting for passage remained incredibly brave and determined, even when the chances of ratification in Tennessee were slim. In fact, in July 1920, the National American Woman Suffrage Association president Carrie Chapman Catt said, "At this time, I do not believe there is a ghost of a chance of ratification in Tennessee." Who could blame her? Women had been fighting for the right to vote for more than 100 years, even before the 1848 Seneca Falls Convention officially launched the suffrage movement. Thankfully, Tennessee women showed the country that it was time for change.

That August, suffragists and their opponents converged on Nashville and gathered at the Hermitage Hotel to strategize and lobby Tennessee representatives. In what became known as the War of the Roses, suffragists wore yellow roses on their lapels while those against female suffrage wore red roses. The opposition did everything they could to stop the ratification of the 19th Amendment. Anti-suffrage lawmakers even fled the state in order to deny a quorum.

The vote in the House of Representatives was tight. It came down to the youngest member of the Tennessee legislature, 24-year-old Harry T. Burn from Niota, Tennessee. When Burn arrived at the state Capitol wearing a red rose on his lapel, it appeared the pro-suffrage cause was doomed. But little did anyone know that Harry's mother, "Miss Febb" Burn, had one last card to play. Just before Harry cast the decisive vote on August 18, 1920, he found a note from his mother in his suit pocket that read, "Hurrah and vote for suffrage and don't keep them in doubt." His mother's words were enough to convince Burn to vote for ratification. A victory seven decades in the making had been won thanks to heroic suffragists and one very determined Tennessee momma.

On the 103rd anniversary of the 19th Amendment's ratification, we must recognize the importance of that moment, and the incredible progress women have made over the last century. We must remember and honor the Tennessee women who fought valiantly for suffrage, including Anne Dallas Dudley from Nashville, Ida B. Wells from Memphis, and Abby Crawford Milton from Chattanooga. As the first woman to represent Tennessee in the United States Senate, I have a special appreciation for the women who fought this fight, and I've worked to honor their legacy and advance their cause.

But as we remember the suffragists, it's important to recognize that women are still fighting for a seat at the table. However, we have made great progress, and I am confident women will continue to excel as we strive for an even more perfect Union. The future for women will be bright, especially if we work together the way the suffragists did. Women are leaders, changemakers, and pioneers, and we must continue to champion them

so that future generations of girls will believe that they can achieve anything they put their minds to.

Celebrating Step, Bonus & Blended Family Parents

September 16 is National Stepfamily Day and represents many different types of families. Some prefer to be called "Bonus" and others prefer "Blended" while some really don't want to be called anything besides a "Family." No matter the terminology, being in a family with his, hers and sometimes "theirs" is very different than a traditional in-tact family. Different does not mean it's bad or less than, just simply different.

Here are a few ways these families (including my own) are different: **1.** There are biological parents connected to the shared children that do not live with the children full-time. They may have parenting time that is 50/50 or they may only see their children a few weeks in the summer; although every schedule is unique, it's a hard dynamic that exists in these families, both for children and parents.

2. Some blended families are formed after death – someone lost a much-loved spouse and then later marries again, bringing along their children as well as a lifetime of good memories of the one who is missing.

3. Some families don't see their extended families very often, due to divorce and hard feelings afterwards.

4. Kids in stepfamilies can sometimes feel caught in a war between their biological parents; where in a traditional family their bio parents would be together, under one roof, and even if they argue it's a less intense situation for the children. Kids can go to their room or possibly go to a friend's house while parents argue – not the same in a divorced / remarried family. Often kids encounter an emotional war between two homes that can go on for decades.

5. Most stepfamilies have a "handoff" every week or two where kids leave one house and go to the other house. The way parents act at the handoff determines a depth of internal pain or joy for the children. Having a "Happy Handoff" is actually something that is good for kids, and they may it experience 500-1,000 times in their lifetime.

6. A child who loves their stepparent (bonus parent or blended family parent) may often feel they cannot tell their biological parent the truth about all the good things. It may trigger their bio parent and cause stress for children, so many kids just decide early on not to talk about how much they like and love their stepparent to protect their other parent.

7. If a child can enjoy a strong marriage between their biological parent and the stepparent, it can have an incredibly strong impact on the child's view of marriage and their own future family. Research shows that a child in a blended family that is healthy and strong is much more likely to enjoy a lifelong marriage of their own one day.

The last interesting tip about stepfamily life is you get "more credit" for your anniversary than a traditional couple. Take the number of kids you blended, multiply those times the number of years you have been married – that will give you the "anniversary credit" you get instead of a traditional year. Since there is so much happening all at once in bonus family, we believe the parents should get more credit!! Happy National Stepfamily Day to all the blended, bonus, stepparents out there! You matter and your role is very impactful for the children!

Air purifiers combine airflow and filtration to remove airborne particles. The devices use a fan to pull air in and force it through a filter. This filter removes dust, dander, and other impurities. The air is then pushed back into the room. The effectiveness of the air purifier relies heavily on the filter. Use a device with a HEPA filter and replace the filter often to maximize the benefits of your air purifier.

Where to Place Your Air Purifier

Finding the right spot for your air purifier also makes a big difference in how well it works. Some manufacturers include specific placement instructions with their products that detail the precise location each model was designed for, such as mounted on a wall or placed on the floor.



If your air purifier didn't come with instructions, here are four tips for finding an optimal place for your air purifier:

• Place your air purifier close to indoor pollution sources. Those sources might be a dog bed, a wood fireplace, or a room where you experience more pronounced asthma and allergy symptoms.

Make the most of indoor airflow. Placing your air purifier near windows or doors can help increase the rate at which air filters through the device—the more air filtered, the lower the risk of indoor contamination.
Place your air purifier off the ground. We

recommend placing yours on a stool or end table so it sits three to five feet off the ground, as there are fewer obstructions (e.g., furniture, appliances) at that height. Additionally, this position helps an air purifier capture the warm air rising in your home.

• Nobody puts an air purifier in the corner. Corners block airflow on at least two sides, preventing an air purifier from cycling an optimal amount of air.

Tips for Improving Indoor Air Quality

Perhaps the most important way to ensure excellent indoor air quality is to keep a clean house. Cleaning regularly reduces the amount of dust and dander in your home, especially if you're doing these things:



The Attack Out Of Nowhere

This past week I went out the front door to rescue a couple of young fledglings who were stuck on my semi-enclosed front porch. Actually, I was trying to rescue them from my almost 8 lb service dog. Had he been any bigger, the rescue mission for one bird would have become a recovery mission. The dog had managed to remove a few feathers. In the process, I got attacked, out of seemingly nowhere, by a couple of wasps. I did not see them coming until one brushed my face and one nailed me on my right hand. I don't care how much you flail your arms around and holler, neither are very effective weapons against angry wasps!



I looked under the kitchen sink - I really thought that's where a wasp and hornet spray lived but it was MIA. I was not prepared for battle. I did have to go to a couple of places, so I closed the doggie door to protect the remaining little cackle. Yep, the wasps attacked me again.

After a trip to the store that included a pair of wasp and hornet spray cans bound together with a plastic sleeve, then helping my neighbor get her groceries inside, I carefully made my way up my porch steps with one wasp killer can open and ready to fire. Again, the wasps attacked and I started firing back. Then I saw where the reinforcements were coming from. My husband had hung one of his baseball caps on a broom handle with the bill facing away from me. When I returned fire, including at the wasp nest inside the cap, peace and order returned to my front porch. But, not without significant injuries on my part. 5 to 6 full-on wasp stings that not only caused pain but also messed with some medical conditions that I already have. (There are legitimate reasons I have a service dog!) The baby bird eventually managed to escape the prison he put himself in.

By my bed, I have a large, museum quality canvas that I designed sometime back. It's a way–larger-than-life baby duck swimming on a dark greenish pond. He looks peaceful on top but I guarantee you he's paddling like crazy underneath. The verse I put on that is Matthew 11:28. "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." Even at night, when I have to get up, I can make out a light blob (the baby duck) against the dark blob (the pond) on my white wall. I know the verse by heart and have it deep inside my soul.Normally I pray, "Lord, I'm paddling to You as fast as I can."

You see, enemy attacks seem to come out of nowhere. The Bible tells us: "The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." John 10:10. We get hurt and there is no getting around that!

However, we have this promise from 2 Corinthians 10:4: (For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;) And, this promise from Zechariah 4:6, "Then he answered and spake unto me, saying, This is the word of the LORD unto Zerubbabel, saying, Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts." "Casting all your care upon Him; for He careth for you." Not only for your own self, but who else are you keeping from harm?

I don't want to even think about what might have happened had my hubby plopped that hat on his head without looking. But I am certain it would not have been very nice. Not to mention

what the stings might have done to my small but very highly skilled service dog. And what about the poor baby bird that needs to learn to read a map? See, those attacks are going to come. You need to paddle to the Father as fast as you possibly can and be ready for those attacks!

Be blessed in the Name of Jesus. I know I am!

Be Happy, Be Healthy, Be Whole

A monthly column on diet, exercise and my weight loss journey.

Hydration – an important part of good health and good weight loss. One of the many healthy habits I have acquired on my weight loss journey is to drink plenty of water. Personally, I drink at least 100 ounces a day. In addition to water, I'm now reading about another liquid that can help us lose weight. According to research journal, Medicine and Science in Sport and Exercise, drinking a glass of fat-free milk each day can double weight loss. People sometimes steer clear of dairy because they believe it is fattening — actually, the reverse may be true. Milk contains both vitamin D and calcium, which have both been linked to weight loss.

And while, we're at it - you might want to switch from coffee to tea. Black and green tea can be an effective way to increase weight loss, according to studies in Naunyn-Schmiedeberg's Archives of Pharmacology. Drinking between two to four cups per day has been linked to weight loss in multiple studies. People in the studies

lost weight without making any other dietary or lifestyle changes, apart from drinking tea.

And one more nugget about what we put in our mouth as it relates to weight loss. According to the Journal of General Internal Medicine if you want to lose more weight, ditch the steak and pick up a carrot. Vegetarian diets produce the most weight loss, research finds. Diets that do not contain meat are



linked to significantly more weight loss. Vegetarian dieters typically lose around 4.4 pounds more than those following diets that include meat.
