

PARENT WITH PURPOSE

Master Healthy School Lunches

A healthy back-to-school lunch is as important as a good night's sleep. The CDC (Center for Disease Control and Prevention) discovered key findings about students making higher grades: They ate breakfast daily, ate 1-2 servings of fruits and vegetables per day, and drank milk or water instead of soda or pop. These eating habits help with immediate focus and alertness and contribute to your kids' overall health and academic performance. Dietician Abby Cressman specializes in pediatric nutrition and has some advice on mastering those school lunches.

Creating a balanced school lunch is more straightforward than it may seem. Every school lunch should include a complex carbohydrate, protein, and fiber. Visualize a plate where half is covered in fruits and veggies, one quarter is a protein, and the other quarter a carbohydrate, and you have a balanced meal. Cressman says,



"This combination helps with satiety and blood sugar balance to keep them alert to learn."

Carbohydrates provide long-lasting energy throughout the day. Focus on complex carbohydrates, including fruits, vegetables, whole grains, beans, brown rice, nuts, and quinoa.

Proteins keep one full until the after-school snack. Consider meats, eggs, peanut or almond butter, beans, dairy (cheese, yogurt), or seafood. Packing a thermos or carton of milk will add dairy and protein to the meal.

Fiber in fruits and vegetables provides the needed vitamins and minerals a growing child needs. High-fiber foods include beans, nuts, fruits or dried fruits, vegetables, oats, whole-grain breads, and popcorn.

Variety in color and types of food will prevent boredom and offer essential vitamins and minerals without your child knowing it. Instead of using bread for every lunch, consider a bagel, wrap, or English muffin. Use a colorful variety of vegetables and fruits in season (much cheaper).

Preparing food on the weekends can save you headaches and stress. Boil eggs, cook pasta, and cut veggies on Sunday so the food is ready to toss on the weekdays. Get your shopping done ahead so you're not left making a sandwich with both heels of the loaf on a Monday morning. I did that and still hear about it years later from my son.

What are some things not to pack? Processed foods (foods with a long storage life) have little nutritional value. Think natural colors, avoiding items with added food coloring. While an occasional sweet treat is fine, watch for hidden or added sugar in other foods. Adding an inspirational note or a joke to your child's lunch bag once a week is a nice touch. These notes feed your child's spiritual and emotional being and let the child know you are thinking of them. That note may be just the word they need to hear to get them through a rough day.

Children in Tennessee—9,100 of them—in the foster care system typically enter a traumatic and emotional experience when they leave their homes and go into foster care. Helping Hands meets the needs of families with children at risk of being removed from their homes by protecting the dignity of the children and respect for their personal belongings. No longer must children drag around in black garbage bags the little they have. The goal? Help children feel they and their belongings are valued, not thrown into garbage bags like trash. Children feel more normal and stable—having something of their own, sometimes for the first time in their lives—when they come into custody and later if they move from one placement to another. The attractive, new, compartmentalized duffel helps them better transition to their next opportunity and placement and confirms appreciation for their developing lives.

Project Life provides

- Specialized mobile clinics for convenient prenatal testing and counseling
- Unique partnerships with pregnancy centers to meet community needs for testing and education
- Service to multiple geographies



The goal of Project Life—see a life, save a life—is to lease ultrasound units (costing more than \$250,000 each) to existing pregnancy centers throughout



the country. Project Life provides free prenatal testing, ultrasounds, education, and counseling in specialized mobile clinics to help women make informed choices about the life of their baby. Ultrasound technology helps these centers more effectively show women with unintended pregnancies that they have far more positive choices for their future and the future of their child than they might think.

How You Can Support: Adults and older teens help Project Life and Helping Hands through golf tournaments, encouraging their churches or other civic organizations to conduct baby bottle drives, or making donations throughout the year. "And I looked, and beheld a pale horse: and his name that sat on him was Death, and Hell followed with him." Rev. 6:8.

The hooded rider and torch bearer who led the procession ashore from the Seine River at the opening ceremony of the 2024 Olympics rode a pale horse. Given the events leading up to this equestrian saunter, it is apparent that the color horse selected for the initiation of the Olympics was not accidental. The symbolism followed a string of satanic rituals culminating in a grotesque parody of Leonardo Da Vinci's "The Last Supper" mural of Jesus and his apostles composed of drag queens who struck poses

behind a long table astride a crowned transgender goddess.

The Lord's Supper, as described in Luke 22:19-20 is one of the holiest moments in Christianity. It is when Jesus instituted the eucharist and spoke of his coming sacrifice. The depiction of this scene by Da Vinci is among the most revered, sacred images to Christians around the world. If the theme of the Olympics is a call for world unity, why would the French Olympic organizers choose such a divisive depiction as a centerpiece for the opening ceremony to be displayed on a world stage?

Dr. David Filson, Interim Pastor at Christ Presbyterian Church summed it up this way. "Domination, not toleration, has always been the goal. Christians should not be surprised by this. That this happened there is at least consistent with the trajectories of Sartre, de Beauvoir, Lyotard, and Foucault. And, I appreciate the fact that they are so clearly naming their perception of the enemy of critical theory ideology - Christianity."

The first modern Olympics were held in Athens, Greece, in 1896. The man responsible for its rebirth was a Frenchman named Baron Pierre de Coubertin, who presented the idea in 1894. The Charter of the Olympics state that: "The goal of Olympism is to place sport at the service of the harmonious development of humankind, with a view to promoting a peaceful society concerned with the preservation of human dignity." Olympic Charter at p. 8.



The irony could not be more pronounced. The divisive degradation of Christianity during the 2024 opening ceremony has led to widespread criticism from Catholics and Protestant leaders around the world, including several church leaders within France. The

French Bishops' Conference released a statement saying "this ceremony unfortunately included scenes of mockery and derision of Christianity, which we deeply regret. We would like to thank the members of other religious denominations who have expressed their solidarity with

Regrettably, these views are not shared by the highest-ranking members of the French government. French President Emmanuel Macron defended the controversial opening ceremonies saying "Thanks to Thomas Jolly (the openly gay organizer of the ceremony) and his

creative genius for this grandiose ceremony. Thank you to the artists for this unique and magical moment."

As Pastor Filson points out, the modern culture's attack on Christianity should come as no surprise. In Matthew 5:10-11, Jesus said: "Blessed are you, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake." We are reminded also in 1 John 3:13: "Do not marvel if the world hates you." Evil has a jealous hatred for good. As a constitutional attorney defending religious liberty, I have witnessed this in courtrooms across the country when representing those arrested and persecuted for their faith in Christ.

The Olympics, tarnished as this institution may be from this spectacle, still represents the highest in human ideals. It serves these ideals by providing a unique opportunity for people of all races, colors, religions and cultures to lay aside their differences and contribute to building a peaceful and better world through competitive sports without discrimination.

Opportunities in the Music Industry Abound for Trevecca Students

Trevecca students and graduates have found themselves near the epicenter of the Nashville music scene in recent years, not only gaining hands-on experience but working with some of the biggest artists in Christian and country music as they've built connections, learned new skills and prepared for promising futures.

- Trevecca's worship choir, Testify, has had numerous opportunities to record with Christian artists. Most recently this has included collaborations with Rebekah White, the writer of the song "Rest on Us," which has 10 million downloads; Tasha Layton, one of 2020's Billboard Top Five female Christian artists; and the Newsboys on their 2024 single "Heaven on Earth." Testify members, including those who had never been in a choir before, can be heard on the Newsboys song that has been streamed more than a million times.
- Members of the Grammy-nominated band We The Kingdom visited with students in a music business class and shared stories about their experience as an up and coming Christian band. The group has completed multiple headline tours, and they shared insights about the reality of touring

and performing and answered student questions in an informal classroom setting.

- Trevecca students had the opportunity to participate in a unique cinematic experience when a scene for the movie "It's Christmas Again" was filmed on campus. One Trevecca music student, Darby Cappillino, even had a role in the film. The movie was shown in Regal Cinemas throughout the country.
- Trevecca student Ty Thompson played the drums for a crowd of 10,000 at Red Rocks Amphitheatre in Colorado. Thompson's connections have also given him opportunities in country music, where he has played the CMA Fest with artist Angie K and opened up for Morgan Wallen at the Faster Horses Festival in Michigan. He has also opened for Brian Kelley from Florida Georgia Line, while drumming with Noah Hicks.

Students have opportunities behind the scenes as well. Clayton Lepley, a 2020 graduate, is now the lighting director for Grammy award-winning singer Zach Williams. He is responsible for loading equipment and making sure the shows run

smoothly. Previously, Lepley went on tour with TobyMac and later Casting Crowns. Even before graduating, he was honing his skills, traveling on tour with the support of Trevecca faculty.

"My dean was willing to work with my schedule when I had the opportunity to go on tour during the fall semester," Lepley said. "My professors knew this was what I wanted to do and they were willing to go the extra mile to make it happen." Trevecca faculty understands the value of real world experiences, and is always ready to provide students with opportunities in the classroom and in Music City. "These are just some of many opportunities students have when they study music at Trevecca," said Craig Adams, executive director of Trevecca's Center For Commercial Music. "Attending college here is a chance for students to press into the heartbeat of Nashville as an entertainment capital."





Cancel Culture Is Not Civil Disobedience, Nor Is It Productive Cancel culture is dangerous, stifles free speech

Just weeks before the U.S. Supreme Court heard oral arguments in a case involving the abortion pill, abortion advocates have "canceled" peer-reviewed science (and the scientists) that disagree with their abortion-on-demand worldview. The facts, which highlight real risks to real women, matter less to the abortion advocates than the opportunity to silence their opponents. It's not a stretch to say this latest episode of cancel culture might kill innocent women.

It's important to acknowledge that free speech has its limits. No one should be allowed to call for the extermination of the LGBT community nor call for genocide of Jews. All speech is not free, but the free expression of ideas should be allowed without fear of retribution. Cancel culture, with its tendency to silence dissent, threatens the very essence of democratic dialogue.

The more our society (and mainstream media) normalizes this attitude of bullying toward differing points of view, it's important to distinguish between the constructive nature of civil disobedience and the destructive tendencies inherent in cancel culture.

Civil disobedience, at its core, is a principled stand against authority or actions that goes against our conscience or, in the case of Christians, against God's Word. Like a boycott, it's a way to express disagreement respectfully, without adopting an attitude of hatred toward the opposing perspective. History bears witness to the effectiveness of civil disobedience, such as the Montgomery bus boycott and the Anti-Apartheid Movement, in bringing about meaningful change. However, boycotts are often not successful or sustainable.

Cancel culture deviates from this form of dissent dramatically. Unlike a boycott, cancel culture is not geared towards constructive change but rather seeks to punish those with whom one disagrees. The targets often include individuals or businesses based on their thoughts or past actions, leading to consequences that can be disproportionate and long-lasting.

Take, for instance, the case of comedian Kevin Hart, who faced the wrath of cancel culture for past tweets. Despite expressing remorse and a commitment to change, Hart felt immense pressure to withdraw from hosting the Oscars in 2018. Cancel culture even extends beyond individuals to powerful tech companies, exemplified by the suppression of conservative satire site Babylon Bee on social media platforms following their statement that "a man is not a woman."


Whether someone is canceled because they supported a certain candidate or because they were bold in standing for biblical values or they were against the COVID-19 vaccine, no matter the issue, it really boils down to this: it's not the little guy trying to stop the bully, but the celebration of the bully winning. Cancel culture is dangerous; it stifles free speech and discourages the open exchange of ideas.

The effect on public debate is undeniable. People are hesitant to voice opinions that may challenge popular narratives, hampering the discovery of biblical truth or the productive exchange of diverse ideas. People who may have great ideas, ones that could literally save someone else, may not want to risk their reputations and livelihood to speak out against popular opinion. Conservative Christians, in particular, have become increasingly tempted to shy away from the convictions of their faith because of societal backlash. It's undeniable that along with this epidemic of cancel culture, people who uphold biblical values are often characterized as aggressive, unbending and

I wonder why some people have an intense need for canceling if they truly believe their ideas are genuinely superior? In a society that values intellectual diversity, the onus should be on engaging in meaningful conversation rather than stifling opposing viewpoints. Consider the relatively recent conservative boycott against Bud Light. It highlighted the need for alternative avenues of expression that foster dialogue rather than division.

As we navigate the complexities of today's world, it is important to preserve the sanctity of civil disobedience while rejecting the pitfalls of cancel culture. There's a critical need to have purposeful discussions on topics such as God's love, disagreement does not equal hate, the dangers of remaining silent and how fear can be a driving force in action. Only through open dialogue and a commitment to respectful expression can we hope to maintain a society that thrives on the exchange of diverse ideas and perspectives and preserves our foundation as a God-fearing nation.



I learned a lot from a recent Bridges guest named Donna. She had two adult children that were battling substance abuse. As a concerned mom she want-

ed to jump in and get her adult children back on the right road. Donna tried everything she knew. She prayed. She talked with Christian counselors. She talked with her children. There were many conversations, arguments, and conflicts yet nothing Donna did yielded a positive result (at least as far as Donna could see).

You Just Need to Let Go

One day Donna decided to go to the altar for prayer. As she explained her situation the pastor prayed and then he said, "You just need to let go". Donna was irritated by the comment. She also wondered what exactly it means to "let go and let God". The "let go" comment catapulted Donna into finding out how she could let go of her children who were clearly in serious trouble. Donna joined Nar-Anon. A 12-step group for friends and families of people struggling with addiction. It was this group that helped Donna understand that letting go was about trusting and leaving all the things that are outside of our responsibility/control into the

loving hands of our Heavenly Father.

She said No to Requests for Money

Donna had to stop enabling. She had to say no to any requests for money. She drew boundaries and stuck with them. This was hard and she second guessed herself a lot. Thankfully, she stayed the course. Once she let go of what she couldn't control she was better able to recognize what she could do. She found that she could show her children love and support while being clear that she would not condone substance abuse. She also prayed and reached out to other trusted friends to join her in prayer. Donna learned that letting go isn't an "I don't care attitude" or "just let things be" Instead, letting go is an active state of trust that requires faith and bravery.

As Donna started to live from trust, faith, and bravery she started to grow closer to God. She was learning lessons from her very challenging situation. She shared with me that it was the journey with her children that really helped her see how much love God has for all of us.

Donna was clear as I talked with her that there was no easy fix. When her two adult children were in active addiction, she was understandably very

concerned and prayer-

ful. For Donna learning to let go meant that she no longer allowed the addiction to control her life. She stopped rescuing her children and instead leaned on God to comfort her and reach her children. It took years before Donna saw the prayers for her children answered. Many prayers, many tears, and many trials. But God proved faithful, and Donna now enjoys a healthy relationship with her children. Donna recently became a grandmother, and she says that is her greatest joy. I asked Donna if she could share one thing with parents in similar circumstances. Donna paused...a long pause...and she said you just need let go and let God.





Jeff Allen isn't there yet, but he's well on his way. It's been a long journey, but he isn't walking it alone now.


Exactly what makes Jeff Allen special? His comedy is relatable; the sublime craftmanship in his act is flawless; he can spend 90

craftmanship in his act is flawless; he can spend 90 minutes on stage and not say anything you wouldn't want your granddaughter to hear—not a single nasty word.

Allen enjoys performing at early hours to draw parents and older audiences to his shows. "I'll get parents home before their babysitter has time... to get caught in an embarrassing situation," he jokes. "Really, it's that my audience doesn't go out much after 8, so we started asking clubs to let me do 5 or 5:30 on Saturdays, and they quickly sold out."

In both the book and tour, Are we There Yet?, Jeff Allen takes audiences on the rollercoaster ride that his life and career took before he found redemption. Allen drastically reworked what had been an angry act filled with foul and hateful language. His comedy was reinvented: he became a smiling, happy comic who works clean. He admits that non-clean material still pops into his head, but he works it into fami-





ly-friendly shape or dismisses the jokes he simply cannot do to his other comic friends. "I had a heart change. It was interesting because the comedy material didn't change much. It was just how it was delivered—the vessel changed. There were times my wife would come into a club, hear me talk about our marriage, and leave in tears. She'd say, 'You must hate me!' I'd say, 'It's comedy! Comedy is anger!' Anyway, my heart changed."

Pursuing a Moronic Lazy Atheist

While that's all true, perhaps the most remarkable aspect of Jeff Allen can be measured in consistent "laughs per minute." He shares the inspirational and at times laugh-out-loud story of how God rescued him from drunken alcoholism and cocaine and despair through the book of Ecclesiastes that begins exactly how he felt. He started listening to three taped sermons a day about all aspects of the Bible, including Jesus.

Before redemption Jeff describes himself as "a shallow, empty, vacuous man filled with anger; a jaded, bitter, foul-mouthed cynical man—definitely, not a nice man—with a very large ego." Long before he knew or believed there is a God, that same God used an ancient poem, *The Hound of Heaven* by Francis Thompson, a little know English poet (1859-1907), to pull him into a different reality. Allen saw himself in the poem. Through symbolism, *Hound of Heaven* pictures God ever-pursuing a deviant, depressed man while he runs. God so follows the fleeing soul by His Divine grace that the soul feels the pressure to turn to Him alone in that never-ending pursuit.

God chased Jeff Allen in another rather odd way through a friend he had met at a golf course. This man had done well in business, and Allen began asking him about ways to make money. Phil explained, "You don't want a lot of money." "I don't?" "No, you can't handle what little you have. To enjoy the creation, you must

have a relationship with the One who created it. When you can handle a little, you will be entrusted to handle a lot."

"Phil got me thinking about life in a way I never had before. I didn't know it at the time, but Jesus got people to open up by asking questions. The problem? Great wealth was my mighty goal."

Allen hadn't counted on the friend being a Christian—calling his atheism "simple moronic laziness," an atheist who couldn't come up with anything he disagreed with in the Bible because he had never read it. Thus began the friend's mailing him tape

after tape of the whole Bible preached by Tommy Nelson. Of course, Allen threw the tapes in any ole drawer or closet until years later when his marriage was all but gone and his stage appearances were failing—nose bleeds from cocaine use weren't appealing to audiences. Neither was dirty, drunken alcoholism. Neither was horrific anger eruptions. Neither was marriage according to a wife who sought solace elsewhere. For years he had been taking his rage out on his wife and those around him by verbally berating them and making nasty jokes.

"I had started a journey where I explored all kinds of philosophies. After seven or eight years of recovery and self-help and New Age and Buddhism, I realized that there was no point to this life. My beautiful wife who loved me was so frustrated with me. I had children that were healthy, I had a job I loved, but there was no point to it. Can you imagine being married to someone like that? "When I was 14, my father told me there is no God, and I believed him. There is no God. My father probably had one of the best vocabularies of anybody I've ever known, but he cussed like a lunatic! He told me that swearing is the 'crutch of the lazy."

Eventually, I went into a 12-step program, and they said, "Pray," and I said "To what?" They said "Well, something bigger than you in this universe." It's interesting how arrogant a drunk can be. I said, "Is there anything larger than me in the universe? Are you kidding me? I am the center of the universe"! Allen sought help in almost everything. Eventually, he found the tossed aside tapes and listened to three tapes a day of Bible sermons. Ecclesiastes (1:1) spoke his language of hopelessness. "When I heard 'meaningless, meaningless, all in life is meaningless,' I agreed. That was my conclusion, too—nothing mattered. I was a full-blown nihilist; nothing mattered. What I really got out of that first sermon tape was life without God will have no meaning, and without meaning, there's no purpose—and in a life without purpose, suicide. That summed up my eight-year search. I personally couldn't find anything that gave me lasting peace or joy. That's why I'm so concerned about today's Millennials who choose these same thought patterns and are their own gods. "I kept listening. Jesus said, 'Don't worry about this life, I'll give you a new counselor in the form of the Holy Spirit. That was a new way of viewing of the world. It ushered in the proverbial 'come-to-Jesus' meeting."

The Hound of Heaven was still pursuing this lazy moronic atheist through His Word. "I got on my knees and when my friend who was leading me to Jesus asked, 'Can you admit you're a sinner? I said, well, let's not go overboard ... yeah...I know what I am. I know what I am."

Besides Jeff, wife Tami (Mishler) and two children had much repair work to







do. The divorce papers remained unfiled, children had to come to terms with all of it and are still doing so. To his son who said he didn't really remember much of the angry early life, Jeff responded, "You may not remember what I poured into you, but one day your wife will draw it out of you." Wise counsel.

Breast cancer challenged Tami's life. After her thirty-first radiation treatment and their living with a third-party controlling monster in their home—cancer—she declared that she was not going to be defined by cancer. "When I performed at HBO's US Comedy Arts Festival in Aspen, Colorado, Tami served as the bald "vanilla cream" between two bald black men (actors) in an Oreo-type picture, laughing all the way!"

These days Jeff Allen is involved with One Church Home in Fairview, Tenn., and sometimes leads men's groups. Often, he performs comedy routines as fund raisers in communities and for corporations. A summer delight each year is two dedicated weeks with the grandkids, bringing the two in Montana together with the two in Tennessee.


God brought Jeff Allen into His kingdom, rescuing him from addictions and despair; praise to the Father that Jeff Allen is thirty-one years alcohol and drug free and is helping clean up comedy one bleep at a time. The Hound of Heaven, through Ecclesiastes, captured the heart of the raucous comedian who

cleaned up his act. Jeff walks with the Hound now. "When all has been heard, the conclusion of the matter is this: fear God and keep His commands because this is for all humankind" (Ecclesiastes 12:13).

FAITH UNDER FIRE

When Your Company Asks You To Do Something Unethical

Every now and then, almost every professional runs into a situation where he/she is expected to do something that violates their conscience – something unethical. How do you handle that? I was in the third year in a very fulfilling and lucrative sales position. I was good at it, was well-respected in the market and inside the company, and was enjoying an excellent income.

The company I worked for, however, had a reputation for being short-term focused and occasionally taking shortcuts. They came out with a new product and gave every salesperson a quota for selling it. The quota

was prefaced by the announcement that the company had invested greatly in the development of this new product and needed to get its investment back. Therefore, the quota wasn't optional. It wasn't a "Here's what we'd like to see you sell" approach. Instead, it was "If you don't sell this, your job is in jeopardy."

After a few sales, it became clear that the product did not work as advertised. If I continued to sell it, I'd actually damage my customers and create a black spot on my reputation as well as the company's. Further, as a Christian, I saw that continuing to sell it was promoting a lie.

I was faced with a major ethical conflict: Follow the company's direction, or follow my conscience?

I suspect that many other Christian professionals have been, or will be, faced with a similar conflict. How do you handle a situation where your employer wants you to do something that violates your conscience? I've gained experience with this over the years.

Here are five thoughts to consider. First

If you are a Christian, you start every one of these matters with a great deal of prayer. Bring the issue to God as clearly and specifically as you can and do so on several occasions. You should have the sense that God is involved in this situation because you invited him in.

Second

Make sure it really is unethical. It could be that your perspective is a bit off. Maybe you interpreted something incorrectly or your views are skewered in ways that distort reality. So, first, make sure the thing your employer is asking you do to is really unethical.

Find a couple of experienced Christian men and women who are older, more experienced, and wiser, and run it by them. Try to be as objective as possible when you tell them your story, so it isn't tainted by your viewpoint.

If they agree that the action you're being expected to take is unethical, then move on to the next step. If not, if it's you and not the company that is the issue, then you don't have a conflict. Instead, you need to educate your conscience a bit.

Third

Create an alternative action. In other words, instead of doing the unethical thing the company wants you to do, offer an alternative plan. Is there some



other way to achieve the company's objectives, other than acting unethically?

Offer that plan to your supervisor. That way, the situation is not seen, from your employer's point of view, as a refusal to do what you are asked to do, but rather a discussion of alternate ways of accomplishing the same goal. This will take the personal egos out of the situation and show your manager that you are creative and on the company's side. You avoid a contest of wills by reframing the situation from a "Yes" or "No" situation and a being viewed as defiant, to a discussion of alternative approaches.

There is a great biblical example of this from the life of Daniel. You'll remember that he and his friends were expected to eat the food prepared by the king's servants. Daniel felt that violated his ethics, and, instead of just refusing, Daniel offered an alternative plan. (See Daniel, chapter one.) The supervisor agreed to try it, and Daniel avoided a confrontation.

Fourth

Try not to let the event jeopardize the relationship. Hopefully, you have nurtured a relationship with your manager such that he/she sees you as a valuable employee, enjoys your company, and respects your opinions. If that's the case, your proposal will be far more likely to be seriously considered than if you've been a fault-finding, nitpicky complainer.

Fifth

If you've done all that and are unable to convince the company to ease up on its unethical demands of you, then you have a choice: to leave, or to stay and violate your conscience. Before you make this difficult decision, bring the decision to God and ask for his direction and guidance. Then, expect that He will guide you, and follow the direction He gives you.

It may be that this incident puts you into a better place. Remember, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him and who have been called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28).

Back to my story. How did that work out? The company saw that it had a problem with the product and backed off of the quota a bit. My manager left the company for personal reasons, and the demand to sell the product just faded away. A short time later, I resigned.

PARENTING POINTS

Divorced Parents - Getting Ready for "Back to School"

For divorced parents or those in a blended family, getting ready for the first day of school can be a bit more complicated due to shared parenting time and multiple households being involved. There are many things to consider for making it as easy on the kids as possible – here are a few tips:



1. Schedule a "co-parent meeting" to discuss the upcoming fall schedule. Discuss at least 30 days prior to school starting details such as:

- a. How will school supplies be handled who will purchase them? Will the kids be involved in selecting them? If there is a specific list of supplies for each child, be sure all the adults have a copy (biological parents, stepparents, grand-parents if they help with school). Consider rotating which family buys the "new backpacks and lunch boxes" each year so that both parents are allowed to participate in the shopping process equally.
- b. Who will be listed on the contact info sheet at school? Are there any phone, email or address changes that need to be updated for accuracy?
- c. Are there any concerns for the children going back in the fall (tutoring, summer reading projects, etc.) if so, what are some ideas that can be shared to support your children and help them succeed?
- d. Be sure all adults understand what needs to be taken to school the first day and who is providing it.
- e. Open House Share date and time try to attend together and show a respectful united front as you go room to room and help the children get acclimated to what they will need to know.
- f. Meeting the Teachers attend together and be respectful. Don't try to "outshine" the other parent, be pleasant and give each side of the family time to ask questions and be involved. **I believe if there are stepparents in the shared children's lives that they should be invited to attend these events as well; it can be their decision to join or not, but if they live with the children and help with homework, school projects, etc. it is ideal for them to know what the overall expectations are and be part of supporting the kids.
- **2.** No matter where the child is sleeping the night prior to the first day, it is a nice thing to offer that all parents be part of the "first day" experience. Consider some of these ideas:
- a. Meet at McDonald's early before school and have breakfast together.
- b. Meet in the parking lot of the school and walk in together at a specific time.
- c. Offer to take a photo of your child with their other parent and stepparent if applicable
- d. If you plan fun activities on the first day "after school" include the other parent if possible (Don't try to be the "favorite" or the "fun" parent invite everyone). If this can't be done together, be intentional to rotate each year so even if it is not in the parenting plan, each parent gets to participate over time.
- e. Some families will choose to meet after school and have ice cream together and let the shared children talk about their first day with everyone present this can be a powerful sign of showing "unity" between families.
- f. If both parents can't walk the child in, consider an extra Facetime call so the child gets to talk with the other parent as well, even though this is probably out of the normal call schedule

Remember that coparenting is NOT a competition of favorites – try to look for positive ways to support your children as parents together, even when you live apart. Kids thrive when they have one whole heart, in two healthy homes.

Now More Than Ever, America Needs Robust, Bipartisan, and Respectful Debate

Our nation narrowly avoided a catastrophe with the failed assassination of President Donald Trump in Butler, Pennsylvania on Saturday. In the wake of this disturbing attack, I am grateful that President Trump is safe and recovering and join my fellow Tennesseans and Americans in praying for the two victims who were critically injured and in mourning the loss of Corey Comperatore, a rally attendee who was killed while heroically protecting his wife and daughters from gunfire. As we make sense of this shocking act of political violence, it is imperative that we reflect on how we reached this point.

For 248 years, robust, bipartisan, and respectful debate has been the hallmark of our nation's political process, empowering us to defend our freedoms and build consensus around lasting legislation that serves the American people. While debates can often be contentious, only through open deliberation can we freely express our beliefs, challenge others' viewpoints, and figure out the best path forward for our country. Yet, more and more, we have seen this process break down as respectful debate gives way to vitriolic attacks.

Just days before the assassination attempt on President Trump, President Joe Biden told supporters

that "it's time to put Trump in a bullseye." That remark followed weeks of increasingly hyperbolic comments from Biden, who called President Trump a "genuine threat to this nation" who "really could become a dictator."

Following President Biden's cues, the media have echoed this reckless language, with one popular left-wing magazine recently depicting President Trump on its cover with the features of Nazi dictator Adolf Hitler. Even after the tragedy on Saturday, some in the media went as far as insinuating that President Trump is partly to blame for the assassination attempt on his own life. Make no mistake: This sort of rhetoric has no place in our public life.

To be sure, many political debates—especially those in Washington—are inevitably heated and combative. Our nation faces serious challenges, and on many issues it is difficult to find common ground. But no matter our differences, Americans of all political stripes must communicate with each other with a sense of respect and decorum. Only then can we keep the possibility of consen-

sus alive and work toward solutions that put our country on a better path.

In so many ways, the assassination attempt on President
Trump is a powerful reminder of what can happen when
Americans abandon the possibility of working together and choose to settle political differences with violence.





AN ENCOURAGING WORD



Have You Ever Been Caught In A Standstill With God? When faced with an important decision, most Christians turn to God for direction, and when we don't receive a clear-cut answer, sometimes we mistake that as a "no" from Him. But there's more to consider before we jump to that conclusion.

When seeking God's guidance, it's crucial for us not only to pray, but to turn to His Word. The books of Psalms and Proverbs are excellent places to start looking for wisdom. But if we are honest with ourselves, we've probably all had instances when even our Bibles did not give us absolute clarity on a pressing matter.

So what are we to make of this? Does God simply not care as much about these decisions where He appears to fall silent?

The short answer is – of course, He cares! But in order to fully understand why God refrains from giving us simple answers to some of our questions, we must take a deeper look at His character.

Proverbs 3:5-6 gives us three directions that provide insight into our dilemma: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." For emphasis, I'll begin with the third charge and work my way back. In verse 6, God tells us that in order to make our paths straight, we must fully submit to Him. Practically, this means we have to come to a place where we can say, "Lord, even if the best decision is the one I'd rather not take, I will do that if it's what you want for me." This is not an easy prayer to pray, but is absolutely necessary in order for God's perfect plans to play out in our lives.

God gives us free will and does not want to control us like puppets. Instead, He gives us opportunities to share experiences with Him, which make the outcomes of our decisions that much more meaningful and enjoyable. That is why sometimes, God will wait for us to let go of our own way before He gives us peace about which direction to take. "Lean not on your own understanding." This is where the waters can get murkier, because while it's true that God works all things together for the good of those who love Him, it's also true

that there will be much trouble in this world. Not only that – God also allows us to experience pain at times for our own benefit, as a loving parent disciplines a child who needs to be corrected (Psalm 94:12).

So we must keep this in mind when we're trying to make difficult decisions that can potentially bring suffering because, yes, God will sometimes allow our suffering if it ultimately leads to a deepening of our character and faith. Understanding that brings us to the final, and perhaps most important aspect of this passage: "Trust in the

Lord with all your heart." It seems simple enough. But what if we actually do totally trust God, yet still don't know or understand what He wants us to do?

In my experience, God has waited to give me full clarity or confirmation on some of the most important decisions of my life until AFTER I've taken a step forward in a certain direction. And in every case, He did this as a way to test my faith in a deeper way. I think it's easy for humans to put God in a box and assume He'll give us cookie-cutter methods on how we should approach our lives. But it's actually an extreme example of His radical love that He does not.

There is a certain aspect of mystery to all of our lives, and God is gracious enough not to give us all the answers, but instead to allow us to experience life as a beautiful adventure with Him. Though God may allow you to learn a hard lesson or two as you try to navigate life, if you are genuinely seeking His will in your life, He will never abandon you. Remember, as a Christian, you have the Holy Spirit living inside of you Who will convict your heart when you should absolutely refrain from certain paths. But for those decisions where you're not completely sure, take a leap of faith and ask God to be with you in your decision. And in doing that, He will ultimately carry you to the path you need to be.

Then we were told a good credit score was crucial for financial success as an adult, so we opened a credit card or two... or 10. Pretty soon, we "needed" nicer wheels and tacked on a car loan to the tab. And at Thanksgiving, Uncle Terry wouldn't let up about how renting is "throwing away" money, so we decided to get a mortgage for Christmas. Why not?

This is how debt becomes normal in our lives and eventually begins to rob us of financial margin and ultimately freedom. And to make matters worse, the financial systems we trusted benefit from our money struggles—meaning they're more than happy to keep us dependent on debt and asking for more.

Take the credit score, for example. Most of us have been led to believe that a good credit score is a sign you're doing well financially. But in reality, a high credit score just means you're crushing it with debt management, not money management. Think about this:

- Why do we want a credit score? To go into debt.
- Why do we want to go into debt? For a higher credit score.
- Why do we want a higher credit score? To have more access to debt.
- Why do we want more access to debt? For a higher credit score.

The only way to achieve and maintain a high credit score is to go into debt, stay in debt, and continually pay your debt accounts "perfectly," without adding too much debt or paying too much off too soon.

Are you getting the theme here? It's all about debt. The credit score is just an ingenious way for lenders to profit by luring you deeper into debt while convincing you you're doing great with money. In fact, according to a Fin-Health Spend Report, in 2020 alone, credit card companies made \$106 billion off interest. Starting to make sense why they want you hooked on your plastic and obsessed with your credit score?

So, if what we've been taught about money is a load of—pardon my French—bologna, then what should we be doing with money? Well, after falling for all the traps, I finally figured out that financial success is about what you have in



the bank, not what you owe to the bank. And that when you're ready to take control of your money and get rid of debt for good, you'll find margin, peace and joy. I know paying off debt can feel impossible, but data shows that most people can do it in under two years using the proven method I personally used to get out of debt—the debt snowball.

Hear me say this: You'll never win with money if you hang on to your debt. So, do you want to keep letting debt rob you of freedom and wealth? Or will you do the hard work to take control of the money that's rightfully yours?

If you're still on the fence, here's one last question: What could you do if you didn't have any debt payments?

Answer: Anything you want!






