

How Do I Know If I Have A Winning Case?

Turn on your TV today and it's a safe bet that within ten minutes you will see a commercial by some local or national law firm promising that they will win your case and get you an award of big bucks. These ads allure would-be clients with high-sounding claims. "You deserve to be paid!" "We don't get paid until you do." "We specialize in winning." "Call us to find out what your case is worth."

Such claims are often misleading. Any experienced trial lawyer worth his or her salt will tell you that every case is different. They will also tell you if they are honest, that the only thing certain about litigation is uncertainty.

The American Bar Association has issued the Model Rules of Professional Conduct to govern lawyer advertising. Specifically, Rules 7.1 – 7.3 address how law firms may promote their legal services. All states, including Tennessee, have adopted these rules in some shape or form. One rule, common to all states, prohibits lawyers from making "false or misleading" communications about "the lawyer or their services."

I have tried lawsuits on behalf of clients for the last 40 plus years in state and federal courts in Tennessee and in over half of the states in the U.S. I have won cases that frankly I should never have won because of factors over which I had little to no control. I have also lost cases that I felt confident were winners, but the jury believed otherwise. The decision to go to court is always a monumental one for any client. Here are some considerations I make it a point to discuss with my clients before filing suit.

• What does a victory look like in your case? I am always suspicious when a client tells me

"this is not about the money." The truth is, it is always about the money, because that is the only relief you can obtain in court. The judge will never give a jury this instruction: "Ladies and gentlemen of the jury, this case is not about money, it's about principle."

• How strong is the issue of liability?

Liability means that somebody was responsible for something. For a case to be solid and in your favor, the other party would have to be responsible for your loss or in other words, at fault. Rarely is there a clear case of liability. Typically, the issue is much more complicated and requires hours of careful and extensive research. Take heed whenever a lawyer tells you that in your case liability is open and shut.

• *What will it cost to get the case to trial?* Recall that in Luke 14:31 Jesus cautioned: What



king is about to go to war against another king who

against another king who won't first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? It is important to consider costs. Your attorney should estimate your potential lawsuit costs, whether the case is likely

to end in a settlement or a trial, how much that the settlement would be, and whether or not there would be a recovery at all. A good lawyer will tell you that if the recovery you will receive does not cover the costs of getting to trial, then the case may not be worth it.

• If you win, can the judgment be collected?

Some defendants are what lawyers call "judgment-proof." Suing them is akin to drilling a dry well. If I were able to collect on all the judgments I had obtained over the years, I would be writing this article from some luxurious place in the south of France.


Demonbreun? Donelson? Who Were They?

Have you ever driven on Demonbreun Street, James Robertson Parkway, or Donelson Pike, or passed an exit to Charlotte Avenue or the town of Charlotte on I-40? Who in the world were Robertson, Demonbreun, and Donelson? How did a lady named Charlotte have a street and a town named for her? These names reach back to the founding days of Nashville.

When America's founders signed the Declaration of Independence in 1776, a group of pioneers were living in the Watauga settlement of East Tennessee. After purchasing land from members of the Cherokee Nation, some of them prepared to begin a new settlement in the area around French Lick in Middle Tennessee. That new settlement would one day become Nashville.

Those Watauga pioneers believed that an overland route from Watauga to French Lick would be difficult for the women and children, so they divided into two groups. James Robertson would lead most of the men and older boys on an overland route over the Cumberland Mountains to French Lick. Donelson would remain at Watauga with some of the men while they built 30 flatboats to bring the women, children, and enslaved people by water. Among those who waited were James Robertson's wife, Charlotte, and John Donelson's daughter, Rachel. Rachel would one day marry Andrew Jackson, who became our seventh president.

The Robertson party set out in the fall of 1779, driving their cattle before them. Robertson planned to build a temporary

settlement on the southern side of the Cumberland River, but their route took them to the north side. Robertson wondered how they would cross the river. Cold weather solved the problem. The river was frozen solid, so the pioneers and their cattle walked across the ice. This was the same cold winter when Daniel Boone established Boone's Station in Kentucky. The Middle Tennessee settlers reached their destination on the same day Boone reached Boone's Station: Christmas Day, 1779.

The men and boys began building Fort Nashborough, expecting Donelson's group to arrive in January. They soon began to venture away from the fort to build cabins for their families. They were in constant danger of attack by members of Native Nations who did not agree with the sale of their hunting lands.

Donelson and his party did not arrive in January or February or even in March. None of the settlers had ever traveled to Middle Tennessee by water. They were only guessing that it was possible. Due to delays in building the flatboats, Donelson's group did not even leave Watauga until December. The boat travelers had terrible difficulties along the way. Native Nations attacked them. Some of the travelers contracted smallpox. They suffered through the treacherous waters of the Muscle Shoals in what is now northern Alabama.

Robertson and Donelson had believed that the Tennessee River flowed near French Lick and that the settlers could easily travel overland from the river to the new settlement. They were badly mistaken. Their route took them across what is now northern Alabama and through West Tennessee and Western Kentucky all the way to the Ohio River. They had to paddle against the Ohio's current east to the Cumberland River and then paddle against the Cumberland River's current to French Lick. They did not arrive until April after traveling 1,000 miles.

When the Robertson and Donelson parties arrived at French Lick, French Canadian longhunter Timothy Demonbreun had been hunting in the area for several years and had lived there for a brief time. Demonbreun was from a noble family in Canada, was a veteran of the American Revolution, and served as Lieutenant-Governor of the Illinois Territory. Soon after the establishment of Fort Nashborough, Demonbreun moved to the area permanently.

The Marquis de Lafayette, the French nobleman soldier who came to America to aid our cause in the American Revolution, visited Nashville in 1825 on his grand tour through America. During a dinner in Lafayette's honor, Demonbreun was toasted as "the grand old man of Tennessee and

the first white man to settle the Cumberland country." Demonbreun died the following year. A Nashville newspaper reported: "Died, in this town on Monday evening last, Captain Timothy Dumumrane, a venerable citizen of Nashville, and the first white man that ever emigrated to this vicinity."

Now when you see those place names, you'll know that they honor the brave founders of Nashville, Tennessee.

Flexible

A few years ago, I stood before the WHTN team going over the renovations plans for the studio. As I shared

the plans, I held up a rubber band and explained that during the renovations we would all need to stretch and remain flexible. After all the walls were coming done to make room for new sets. There was drywall work, painting, and equipment installation in front of us. This type of studio project definitely requires a flexible attitude.

I taped a rubber band to my office door

When I was finished outlining the plan, I taped the rubber band to the exterior of my office door. That rubber band would be a reminder to all of us to stay flexible in the midst of such a large project. Several weeks into the project I noticed that someone had switched out the rubber band on my office door – for a gigantic rubber band. There was also a sign next to the rubber band. The sign read -Blessed are the flexible, they shall not break. After I stopped laughing, I realized the sign spoke the truth. In every project, in every relationship, in just about every circumstance a flexible mindset can make a tremendous difference. How do we achieve this kind of flexibility? One of the first steps is what I call the Attitude Commitment. That means that at the beginning of whatever the project, relationship, or situation we find ourselves in that we decide at the onset that our attitude will remain flexible. We all have a certain way we want things to go. But we all know that isn't how it usually plays out. Usually, we have to pivot – at least on some level and just having that flexible attitude and commitment helps us stay grounded and work our way through challenges in a healthy way.

The Small Things and EXTRA Large Things

One of the ways to support our attitude commitment is through prayer. The Bible tells us to pray about everything. The small things. The big things. The EXTRA-large things all require prayer. We need wisdom to make the right decisions. The wisdom we need comes from God – and wisdom is ours for the asking. Here is what the Bible says we should do to get wisdom.

"If you need wisdom, ask our generous God, and he will give it to you. He will not rebuke you for asking. But when you ask him, be sure that your faith is in God alone. Do not waver, for a person with divided loyalty is as unsettled as a wave of the sea that is blown and tossed by the wind. Such people should



not expect to receive

anything from the Lord. Their loyalty is divided between God and the world, and they are unstable in everything they do." James 1:5-8 NLT

Several years have passed since that sign and gigantic rubber band were taped to my office door. But the laughter and the lesson still stand. Now, when I am involved in things like large projects I remember the rubber band lesson. I think back to the WHTN studio renovation project I remind myself of this powerful truth: "Blessed are the flexible they shall not break." The next time you find yourself thinking that nothing is going according to plan remember WHTN and the rubber band lesson. The truths found in that gigantic rubber band and sign may well help you though a challenging season. Today's Secret from the Studio: Blessed are the flexible they shall not break.

When you end the page, get on your knees and thank God for each of the items individually. Peter tells us to cast our anxieties on him through humility. 1 Peter 5:6-7 Then, if you are still overwhelmed and anxious,


write out your problems, and ask God to help with each of the problems. Invite Him in to these as He has already taken away our shame, worry and sickness on the Cross through His Son.



A Simple Plan to Heal the Nation

Over the past century, America's foundational Judeo-Christian values have been systematically eroded, leaving our Founding Fathers' vision of "One Nation Under God" almost unrecognizable. Prayer has been removed from our schools, the Ten Commandments from our courtrooms, and most importantly, God has been displaced as the center of our homes. This shift has contributed to a growing secularization, where reliance on an ever-expanding government is replacing faith in God.



Keep Wildlife Out of Your Crawl Space: Tips and Prevention

Your home is your sanctuary, but it can also attract Prevention: Seal cracks, install unwanted wildlife, especially in crawl spaces. These dark, damp, and secluded areas are appealing to animals seeking shelter, warmth, and food. Wildlife invasion in crawl spaces can lead to structural damage, health risks, and costly repairs. Here's a look at the most common culprits and how to keep them out.

Common Wildlife in Crawl Spaces 1. Raccoons

Raccoons are smart and can easily tear through weak crawl space vents. They cause damage by ripping up insulation and ducts and can leave behind harmful droppings.

2. Opossums

4. Snakes

Snakes, often in search of prey like rodents, may find their way into crawl spaces.

Prevention: Remove food sources, seal gaps, and use snake repellents.

5. Skunks

Besides their notorious odor, skunks can weaken your foundation by digging near it.

Prevention: Install strong barriers, remove food attractants, and use motion-activated lights.

6. Squirrels

Squirrels are known for chewing through wood and electrical wiring, posing serious risks. Prevention: Repair screens and doors, trim tree branches, and use repellents.

7. Bats

Though bats help with insect control, their droppings can cause respiratory diseases.

Prevention: Install bat-proof screens and seal all cracks.

8. Insects & Spiders

Termites and carpenter ants can cause structural



damage, while venomous spiders can pose health risks. Prevention: Use pest control treatments and keep the area dry and ventilated.

How to Protect Your Crawl Space

- Install Barriers: Use mesh to cover vents and entry points.
- Seal Cracks: Fix gaps in the foundation, doors, and vents.
- Maintain Cleanliness: Keep the area free of debris and moisture.

• Consult Professionals: If you suspect an invasion, call a wildlife control expert.

Congratulations! You are now a full-time caregiver! You started as a volunteer role, but because you consistently showed up with a smile on your face, and put in your best effort, you landed the job! I will also note that for some reason, all other candidates have withdrawn their interest. Here are a few details about the position. The hours are pretty much 24 hours, 7 days a week either "in person," or "on call". Duties include, but are not limited to, cleaning, cooking, transportation, bathing, dressing, laundry, medication management, scheduling physician appointments, taking notes at appointments, decorating and hosting all major holidays, answering various questions, entertainment, pet care, first aid, paying bills, insurance and legal concerns, cognitive brain health exercises, physical exercise, safety patrol, & spiritual and emo-



tional support. You will need your own car and should be able to demonstrate that you can multi-task, plan ahead, and anticipate change.

The responsibilities of this position will take priority. Please go ahead and let your current employer, family, and friends know that you will be unavailable for any personal and social time for quite a while. Finally, we come to compensation. Unfortunately, the position does not pay well, actually, there is no salary. There is no PTO or paid holidays; however, you will be expected to be on call for them. We are including free onboarding and training below. These are crucial truths about your job and manager. If at all possible, commit them to memory. We are glad to have you onboard. Remember, you are not alone. Many have taken on this role, and we will be sure to connect you with a local group of caregivers to share in your experiences.

Finally, we are here to answer any of your questions and provide you with all the resources to help you on your new caregiving endeavor. You are not alone.

It does not rejoice at injustice but rejoices with the truth [when right and truth prevail]. Love bears all things [regardless of what comes], believes all things [looking

for the best in each one], hopes all things [remaining steadfast during difficult times], endures all things [without weakening]. – I Corinthians 13:4-7 (AMP)

7. When Your Care Recipient Is in Pain: *Now may always the Lord of peace Himself grant you His peace and in every way [that peace and spiritual well-being that comes to those who walk with Him, regardless of life's circumstances]. The Lord be with you all.* – II Thessalonians 3:16 (AMP)



Medicare Open Enrollment Starts Soon

Yes, just like the trees starting to turn those beautiful colors, it will soon be time for Medicare Open enrollment.

So, let's take a look at what Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) is all about. If you have a Medicare Advantage Plan or a prescription drug plan (PDP) this is the time of year you get to review how those plans have done for you. You will be receiving from your plan's carrier toward the end of September a letter called the ANOC letter (annual notice of change). It will tell you what the changes in your plan will be for 2025. Remember to open this letter from your carrier and not put it in file 13!





If you don't do mail, then hop on your computer beginning October 1st; you will be able to log on to Medicare.gov and check out your plan there. You may also see your plans info in the 2025 Medicare&You that will be mailed to you. It's available on their website but does not have local information on plans/carriers.

The open enrollment signing period is October 15th through December 7th. If you decide to make any changes, your new plan will start January 1, 2025. If you don't make any changes then your current plan will roll into 2025, and you don't have to do a thing!

Suggestion – call your Medicare Rep and discuss next year's plan with him or her! Every year we must get recertified with Medicare and the Carriers to be able to offer suggestions as to what would be the best route for you in 2025. We are blessed to have such a great healthcare system in middle TN and that attracts many companies that want to do business here.

Remember this is about your healthcare coverage for next year. It's worth taking a look!

And this time next year - we get to do it all over again!

When I read a Scripture that He knows the very number of hairs on my head (Matthew 10:30 and Luke 12:7) or He formed me in my mother's womb (Psalms 139:13-15) or so many others that remind us of the plans He has for us, I realize that I am so much more. God created you and me with a plan. He has made us for purpose. The more we know God, the more we know about ourselves.

Like my dear Sunday School teacher, there are many well-meaning, church-going individuals that seem to know a lot about God, but they do not "know" Him. They do not know His character. Think about the many people we come across daily. We may know a lot about them. Even intimate details like their favorite color or their shoe size, or perhaps what they ate for breakfast, but we really do not know them. This is the extent of the relationship for many people with God; they may think they know a lot about Him, but they fail to know Him.

To know God is to experience Him. This is the relationship God has made us for. It is a two-way street. He wants us to know Him as much as He wants to know us. The Fantazmical Life of Zoro Denmer Extraordinaire

Amid a culture that feels divided, depressed, and confused comes a formidable force of positivity. Zoro the Drummer is a man of conviction—compelled to make a difference and to let his God-light shine by every means possible.

He met Lenny Kravitz on the lawn at Beverly Hills High School while pretending to be a new student, introduced Whitney Houston to Bobby Brown, and sat on a plane next to Frankie Valli when the icon shared his "Jersey Boys" Broadway musical vision. He traveled with Microsoft co-founder Paul Allen on his Octopus, the world's most expensive privately owned vacht, held court with Michael Jackson and the Jackson 5, and was honored at the White House; Jimmy Fallon sang Happy Birthday to him on the set of "The Tonight Show."

However, before Zoro became one of the world's greatest drummers who played for everyone from Lenny Kravitz, Frankie Valli and

The Four Seasons, and Bobby Brown, to New Edition, Philip Bailey of Earth, Wind & Fire, and Lincoln Brewster, he was abandoned by his father at six months of age. As an impoverished young boy from the streets of Compton, he helped his family move from one apartment to the next with his Radio Flyer wagon. In rural Oregon, he lived in a car and tent with his immigrant mother and six siblings, showered in city parks, rummaged through Goodwill drop-off boxes for his clothes, experienced extreme racism, and raised exotic chickens.

The band director caught him and invited him to join all the school bands. That day, a future drumming star was born.



Kids on Mission: Taking and Sending Your Kids on Mission Trips

When Jesus commanded believers to go into all the world and preach the gospel (Matt 28:18-20), He didn't put any age limits on it. With innocent faith and endless energy, kids make great missionaries! Sometimes it's us parents who need more convincing.

I get it. Finances, communication, safety, health, distance – the concerns and risks are real. But before we cover those, let's look at the benefits of taking and sending our kids on mission trips.

Taking Kids on Mission

Jared Belton, Senior Project Manager at Medi-Share, recently took his 11-year-old daughter Emma on a mission trip to Ecuador. The father-daughter duo went with a team from church; it was the first international mission trip for both of them.

Jared was excited to share the trip with Emma, knowing that they would be able to worship with people from a different culture who share our same faith. He says, "I wanted to bring my daughter and get her to experience another country and understand a different perspective. It's good to experience things from a non-Western perspective, to witness all the blessings we have."

While in Ecuador, their team assisted a partner church through Vacation Bible School activities like teaching, crafts and recreation. Because there were so many children involved, Emma jumped right in, making friends and serving easily despite the language barrier.

Sharing a mission trip together created great faith-building memories for the Beltons, a practice that the family hopes to continue as their other children get older. As a dad, Jared counted it a privilege to watch his daughter rise to challenges and develop new levels of maturity and gratitude. "It was everything I could have hoped for in being able to share this with her," he says.

Sending Kids on Mission

My teenage sons Isaac and Caleb went on a mission trip to Guatemala last spring – a first for them. I was excited for many of the same reasons as Jared. I wanted them to witness faith through the perspective of a different culture, and to stretch their own faith by stepping into uncomfortable situations.

While there, they were able to do just that. Their work in Guatemala included ministering to orphans, sharing their testimonies, organizing soccer games, distributing water filters and more. They slept in jungle hammocks and traveled for hours in unairconditioned buses. Their team battled sickness, danger, dehydration and extreme delays.

Yet upon return, my boys' first words were, "I wanna go back!" Their photos and videos were filled with sweaty smiles and bilingual praise songs. As they debriefed, it was clear their heart for the nations had expanded in ways that could only happen in an unfamiliar environment. They spoke of trials through a

lens of joy, and blessings through a filter of newfound humility. As a mom, I'm so proud and grateful.

Overcoming Hesitations

As church-goers, we hear many stories like these – a mission team will give their report, concluding the trip was "hard-butgood." So, while Jared and I both attest that taking and sending kids on mission trips is great, valid hesitations remain. As parents we're compelled to care for our children physically and spiritually, and when it comes to overseas missions, sometimes those aspects of care seem at odds. Is it worth risking their safety for their spiritual growth? There's no good answer except through prayer and discernment.

Before sending my sons on their trip, I worried about access to health care. If they got sick or injured, they'd be hours from a hospital. Through prayer, I felt the Lord telling me I should let them go. That may not be the answer He gives every time, but it was the answer He gave me, so I had to obey and let them go.

Finances were another concern for both myself and Jared. Funds for overseas mission trips can be steep. However, we both discerned it would be wise for our kids to take ownership of fundraising. Trusting God to provide for the trips was another way to strengthen their faith.


Jared learned how blessed we are and that the ministry he and Emma did could never happen in reverse – the people of Ecuador don't have the means to travel to the United States for similar fellowship and encouragement.






There are legitimate reasons not to take or send your child on mission trips. "I recognize not everybody is called to serve internationally," Jared says. "But if you're just trying to find a reason not to go, turn that around and just go." Taking and sending kids on mission trips is certainly life-changing and faith-stretching for all involved.

THE GREAT COMMISSION

Student, Teacher or Both

When we see or hear these two words, apostle and disciple, our mind likely goes straight to the religious connotations, but they also have distinct meanings in our personal and professional lives. They are tied together by a great teacher. Thankfully, the Power of the Wisdom of Three shows us the way.



A disciple is generally considered a follower, student,

or learner. In the Bible this term is used to describe all the followers of Jesus, regardless of their role or level of leadership. It comes from the root meaning of being a "student" or a "learner" and implies someone who is constantly learning, following, growing, and putting into practice the teachings they are learning. This should be our mindset in all aspects of our life.

A disciple chooses to follow the teacher.


An apostle, on the other hand, is derived from the Greek term meaning "one who is sent off." Apostles are those who are on a mission to accomplish something specific. In the Bible, it applies to the twelve closest followers of Jesus whom He sent out into the world to preach the Good News of salvation. In today's church, this mission has been handed down to their successors, our modern-day bishops. However, in a broader sense, anyone sent on a mission to proclaim the Good News, profess the truth, while being a positive example to others can also be considered an apostle. We are each charged with spreading the truth.

An apostle is chosen by the teacher.

This indicates that while all apostles are disciples, not all disciples are apostles. The twelve closest followers of Jesus were his disciples first and later became apostles spreading the gospel. Our children, while young, are disciples of their parents and once they go out on their own, they should become apostles of their parents. A person starting a new job is a disciple, once promoted to a supervisor position, they become an apostle of the business. The big take away of this lesson is that once elevated to apostle status, discipleship never ends! Mentors of whom we follow, be it our God, our parents, or a businessperson, should be a constant source of learning for us. Learning is a lifelong endeavor. The experiences we encounter as an apostle will be accompanied by new questions, and who better to turn to than those who sent you out, and who you selected to follow in the first place.

In most cases, your teacher or mentor will have bonded with you, built a solid relationship of trust, respect, and eventually one of love. This trust, respect, and love combination brings with it total honesty and true loyalty. When doubts arise, who better to turn to than people who showed you love throughout your growth journey.

Family Fun this Fall

Leaf jumping. If you have many mature trees in your yard, leaf jumping is a favorite activity. There's only a short window of time to do this, so let your kids take advantage. Of course, you can have them rake the piles and help clean the yard.



How to Pack a Neat & Tidy Suitcase

A Visit to a Leper Colony?

I am often asked, "Why do you go to Guatemala?" It's sort of ironic, because within myself-body, emotions, and my soul, I want to shout, "How could I NOT go to Guatemala"? Perhaps this story about Maria encapsulates a new Hope in emotional healing.

I believe it was my second visit to Guatemala that I had a very unusual person visit the orphanage to consult with me. Her name was Maria, and she was about 50 years old. I was very fortunate that there were excellent translators on hand, typically the young adult who participate with Rotary in Guatemala. Maria began to share the horrific troubles which had led her to be depressed for most of her life. When I asked Maria specifically to share with me what troubled her so deeply, she began to share the pain and trauma she experienced, primarily stemming from being assaulted by gangs and raped five times in her life. After each assault she had been left near dead and it took a



have missed something very important or perhaps you have not shared with me yet another part of your loss?" Maria burst into tears and screamed with pain, "I became pregnant with each assault and my family, made me give up all my children!"

I continued the process of energy healing for some time, addressing each event, and finally we arrived at an acceptable score of 2 suds. I believed it would be important to connect with Ms. Maria the next day (which was our last day of treatment) due to the intensity of what Maria had processed. But Maria sadly stated that she lived many miles away and she would not be able to come. I was particularly concerned about this because she shared with me that she suffered from night terrors, intrusive horrific dreams, and panic most nights as she tried to sleep. In our work treating our patients in Guatemala, most often it was a one-Time opportunity to do all that one can do. I graciously thanked Maria for allowing me to assist her with

long time to recover physically and emotionally. She had many scars from the assaults and was missing most of her teeth, but she was very articulate as she shared her pain with me.

In the trauma world which I frequently work in, an individual identifies the level of the trauma by "suds "-subjective units of disturbance- which range from 0, the lowest, to 10, the highest. Ms. Maria was profoundly stuck at 10! Over the years I have studied the numerous dimensions of treatment and healing in the field psychology, and I have remained especially eager to incorporate meaningful ways to help others rapidly as possible heal from such traumatic emotional injury. Over the years I have studied the numerous dimensions of treatment and healing in the field psychology and especially eager to incorporate meaningful ways to help others rapidly as possible heal from such traumatic emotional injury.

Over the past several years of study and experience I have found the field of energy psychology, often referred to as acupuncture without needles, to be the most remarkable, consistent, and profoundly effective process for healing the terribly troubled spirit of the person who is experiencing profound trauma.

Maria was technically the last client of the morning, but it was not very long that I realized that treatment would move well into lunchtime because I could see that Maria was finding hope for herself for the first time. As Maria slowly, painfully, and exhaustively shared the traumas in her life, she progressed quite well and finally arrived that suds score of 4. I typically do my best to help an individual to come to suds score of 2, because that will often progress further with practice and time. Sometimes by evening, the client arrives at suds score 10r 0, as the trauma becomes resolved within the psyche. I just did not feel right as I looked into Maria's eyes and I said, "Ms. Maria, I believe I

so many painful challenges in her life with her many years of anguish and suffering. And as we closed, I presented Ms. Maria with a copy of my written template called GUTT (Guatemala urgent trauma treatment) and encourage her to follow the tapping treatment protocol so that she can continue to manage her trauma and her symptoms as they occur. As I reviewed this treatment template with Maria we simultaneously smiled and she said, "I got it, Gracias"!

The next day, being our last clinic time at the orphanage for the year, was understandably busy and quite demanding. And yet, the last day is always extremely productive and meaningful for just about everyone we treated. A couple of times during the day, Ms. Maria popped into my mind, and I wondered how she was doing.

As we were wrapping up our final consultation, the nurse came over to me with a big smile on her face and told me that Ms. Maria had walked back several miles to the orphanage that day! With a beautiful smile on her face, Maria had told the nurse to please tell me "Please tell my friend Dr. Tim that I am at 0 suds, I slept all night with no night terrors, and I am at peace. Thank you!" I was so excited to hear her good news from Maria that the nurse relayed. Though we were quite exhausted, everyone on our team was amazed, inspired, and ironically energized. Is that not one of the great paradoxes of life? And that is why I believe I can always positively answer the question: "Why do I go to Guatemala each year?"

American Girls in Sports Day



Across our country, more than 3 million female high school and college athletes compete, practice, and train every day to achieve athletic success. For many of these young women and girls, athletic participation is more than just a game: It is a life-long passion that improves their physical health, boosts their self-confidence, and teaches them the discipline and leadership skills to succeed on and off the field.

In many ways, the success of women's athletics would have been impossible without Title IX, the landmark civil rights law that codified protections on the basis of sex. By requiring equal resources for facilities, training, recruitment, and scholarships for female athletic programs, the law opened the floodgates for women in sports. In fact, since 1972, the year Title IX became law, the number of female college athletes increased by a factor of seven, while the number of female high school athletes has increased more than ten-fold.

Despite the incredible outcomes for women, for years we have seen the Biden-Harris administration wage a war on the very Title IX provisions that enabled greater women's participation in sports. On the 50th anniversary of Title IX in 2022, for example, the Department of Education announced new rules that allow students to participate in activities that do not align with their sex—essentially forcing schools to allow biological males to play on female teams. To make matters worse, just in April the administration redefined "discrimination" to allow biological men to use women-only locker rooms and bathrooms.

Make no mistake: With its radical interpretation of Title IX, the Biden-Harris administration is erasing women's achievements and changing the world of athletics as we know it. You do not need to be a biologist to understand that there are inherent biological differences between men and women that put women at a competitive dis- advantage in sports and jeopardize their safety during competition. In fact, since 2003, biological men have wrongfully displaced women and girls from more than 1,000 championship titles, medals, scholarships, and records, including at least 28 women's sports titles in volleyball, swimming, mountain biking, track and field, weightlifting, and cycling—with much of this happening in just the last few years. The results are tragic: Young women—who often dedicate their entire lives to their sports—miss out on scholarships, career opportunities, and the hard-earned records that they deserve.

Thankfully, many of these young women are bravely speaking out against the Biden-Harris administration's radical agenda, including Tennessee's Riley Gaines, a former University of Kentucky swimmer who was forced to compete against and share a locker room with a biological male during the NCAA Women's Swimming & Diving Championships. Now more than ever, Congress should stand with the female athletes fighting for fairplay and celebrate the incredible contributions women have made to the world of sports. That's why, in the U.S. Senate, I introduced a resolution to establish October 10 as "American Girls in Sports Day." Of course, we picked that date for a special reason: As the 10th day of the 10th month, October 10 is represented by the roman numerals XX the same numerals of the female sex chromosome. In addition to establishing "American Girls in Sports Day," this resolution would call on sports-governing bodies in the United States and abroad to protect biological women and girls in sports. Just last month, I led 22 of my Republican colleagues in demanding that the NCAA prohibit biological males from participating in women's sports to restore fair competition.

In the last 50 years, female athletes have gone from the sidelines to the center stage of competition. As we continue to fight for women's participation in sports, we must keep in mind what is at stake—and the "American Girls in Sports Day" resolution will help ensure that happens.

"Dogs Don't Bark at Tombstones"

It was a hot June day in Tulsa, 35 years ago, and I was attending a regional Christian conference. One of the speakers was Alan Bryan – a good old boy with a heavy Alabama accent who began his presentation with those words.

It was almost delicious – these remarkable words, contorted through the deep Southern accent that was almost a caricature, laid out over the audience and catching us up as if in a butterfly net. We all stared at him, wondering what was coming next. Alan went on to explain, and then defend his title. Dogs don't bark at tombstones. So, if you are figurately dead, content to stay within your comfort zones, afraid to verbalize your Christianity, then the dogs won't bark at



Probably the biggest distortion is this – Christianity is about being involved with a local institutional church and has little to do with our lives in the marketplace. As long as we are active in a church, we can live pretty much under the radar screen, and no one need to know that we are Christians. That is one of the greatest lies in history.

We've substituted churchianity for Christianity, and the impact has been devastating. Literally millions of people, across geographies and generations, have been lost because the Christians in their workplace were hiding under the cover of churchianity.

Instead of active Christians sharing the resources God has entrusted to us with needy people around us, we've been content to write a check to the local church and see the money used to maintain church buildings and pay professional staff. Millions of people could have been touched with the real expression of God's grace through a gift by an individual Christian and were not. Instead of real relationship with God, we've been content to be 'fed' by a legion of professional Christian pastors. The impact has been to instill the idea that the only truth we know must come through the lips of a professional Christian, and to encourage passive pew sitting instead of active involvement.

I could go on and on, but you get the idea. We've allowed the dogs to multiply because our sights were focused elsewhere. We could justify being anonymous at work because we were invested in a church. Since we were occupied with the vagaries of the local institution, we felt absolved of any need to be visible in the marketplace. We attend every Sunday morning and serve on the worship committee. Isn't that enough?

This substitute of churchianity for Christianity has taken its toll on our day-to-day behavior. For example...We could ask someone going through a difficult time if we can pray for or with them, and we don't, because by doing so we unveil ourselves as Christians. Better to let the moment go by then risk an awkward, self-revealing scene. We are occasionally tempted to post something on social media that holds up God, and we don't, because we don't want to have the internet dogs barking at us.

When the conversation meanders around to world-views and belief in God, and the consensus is that "all roads lead to God," or all religions are the same, we nod in soft affirmation instead of voicing Christ's claim that "I am the way, the truth and the life, no man comes to the father except through me." (John 14:6)

Alas, the dogs have multiplied because of our indifference. The remedy is obvious. Accept the dogs barking as a necessary consequence of living a visible Christian life. The louder and more vociferously they bark, the greater is your threat to them. It is time to venture out of the grave and onto the field. Don't be a tombstone.

you. You will have no verbal enemies, and no one will bark, growl or bite at you.

However, if you take a stand for Christ, verbally giving God the glory, holding tight to your morals and focusing on him – if you actually try to live out your Christianity -- you'll have detractors. It comes with the territory. If you are alive and active, you will attract the dogs who will accuse you, criticize you and belittle you.

While the dogs have been around since the beginning of time, in our time, the dogs have been unleashed and are running loose. Those dogs include the legions of social media addicts who find it so much easier to anonymously criticize someone online than to actually talk with someone in person. Those dogs include the hordes of Hollywoodians who live in their secluded homes, employ their servants and pontificate on what other people should do. Those dogs include the talking heads on mainstream media who are more content with shoring up their distorted view of reality than accurately reporting on anything. The dogs include the godless radicals who decide what can and cannot be discussed on social media.

And of course, the relatively new breed of politician whose ideal world is a Marxist godless society where all personal responsibility has been obliterated and bureaucrats' rule without accountability. These dogs have multiplied in recent years and have gotten more and more aggressive in the pursuit of their goals, and in the attacks on those who don't agree with them. Most Christians find themselves in that category. While the attacks on Christians have been irregular, the frequency and intensity will continue to grow.

At first, it has been, and will continue to be, attacks on Christian morals. Christian businesses, like Chick-fil-a and Hobby Lobby, to name some of the most visible, have had to endure dog attacks because of their stand on moral issues. That will eventually morph from attacks on Christian morals to attacks on Christians themselves.

Unless God intervenes and Christians rise up, the specter of economic isolation and marginalization – persecution – is very real. All of these dogs are sniffing around, looking for Christians to criticize and Christian principles and ideals to belittle. We are to blame, of course. 21st Century western Christians. We have been content to believe some very convenient distortions that have become so common as to be accepted as unassailable truth. We've been content to remain lifeless and beyond the notice of the dogs.

Growing up, I was a timid child with a mean-spirited father who often made me feel scared. This experience caused me to think that I had little value. I attended a church where the wrath of God was often preached and taught. These two oppressive influences made me uncertain about wanting to know God personally, even though I had accepted Jesus into my heart at the age of nine.

As an adult, after leaving that church and joining one where God's love was preached, taught, and demonstrated through the people's caring actions, I started to develop a personal relation-

ship with Jesus. I started singing in the choir early in my faith journey. The church members encouraged me to perform solos, and I often had the opportunity to do so. Although I was still working through feelings of low selfworth, I felt God urging me to use my talent for outreach. Though hesitant and fearful, I knew deep down He was calling me to take a step of faith and allow Him to work through me. In the end, I pledged to the Lord that if He granted me the opportunity to sing outside the walls of the church I attended, I would devote every moment to Him and His perfect will. I invested hours in finding new songs with soundtracks, waiting until I felt the Lord's anointing on a particular song that encouraged me to learn it.

Then, I spent additional hours practicing until I memorized each word, ensuring that I was fully prepared to perform under the guidance and anointing of Holy Spirit. I approached this calling with the belief, "I need to prepare thoroughly as if everything relies on me, while knowing that ultimately everything is in the hands of the Lord."



He began giving me many opportunities to sing. Often before singing, I received a message from the Lord to share, and many times, that message felt even more important than the song. I believed it was crucial to make every interaction with the congregation or audience meaningful, and I recognized that without the anointing of Holy Spirit, my efforts would be in vain. I dedicated much time to prayer and praise, allowing Jesus to lead me, even rewriting some song lyrics to better honor Him.

Reflecting on that period of about 20 years, I am certain it was His calling for me, bringing

irreplaceable peace and joy along with a deepened sense of His love for me. This convinced me that if the King of the Universe valued me, I should value myself too. This time deepened my reliance on Him, and my prayer became, "Jesus, I can't do it, but you can. Use me to bring you glory and let others know your presence." I often said, "I am a nobody from nowhere, but He has made me a somebody going somewhere." I also learned a very valuable lesson in humility, which is that I am not defined by who I am but by whose I am. The King of the Universe created and restored me, and I belong to Him.

In closing, let us always remember that our ultimate goal in serving is to lift up Jesus. Whether we are called to sing, teach, serve in any way, or lead, each
