

"Pope Leo XIV Condemns Brutal Machete Attack That Killed 49 Christians During Prayer in DR Congo

Jihadis burst into Sunday service in Democratic Republic of congo as part of campaign to establish Islamic Caliphate

The Pope, the State Department, the United Nations and a leading Christian group have all condemned a new major attack on Christians in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), which the U.N. says left at least 49 dead."

Many of you likely saw this headline or a similar report near the end of last month. The details are deeply disturbing. The attack was marked by unimaginable brutality and a complete disregard for human life. These heartless terrorists seem to be driven by a singular, sinister goal: to eliminate Christians at any cost. As we've seen in other parts of the world, they are often willing to sacrifice even their own lives in pursuit of their evil mission.



Unfortunately, these reports are becoming all too frequent. Though we rightly condemn the violence and may even pause to pray for the families of the victims, many of us quickly return to our daily routines. It's a sobering reminder of how easily we can become numb to such evil when it feels far removed from our own lives.

As Christians in America, do we truly comprehend how blessed we are to worship God freely—without fear of arrest, torture, or death? The freedom to attend church, pray, and share our faith openly is a profound gift that we should never take for granted.

Take time this week to reflect on this as a family. Talk about it. Pray about it. And specifically lift up missionaries who live and minister in regions where the name of Jesus Christ can cost them everything. These men and women share the Gospel daily, fully aware that they may be arrested, dragged from their homes, beaten, imprisoned—or even killed—for proclaiming the Good News.

Please pray not only for missionaries but also for the countless Christians around the globe who worship under the constant threat of violence. Undoubtedly, the believers in the DRC that day were praying and worshiping with courage and faith, knowing the risks. And yet, they stood firm.

May we never forget their sacrifice. May we honor it and others who will make the same sacrifice with our prayers, our awareness, and our commitment to stand for truth no matter the cost.

Is AI taking over the classroom?

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is being hailed today as one of the greatest technological breakthroughs of the 21st century. Evolving at lightning speed, AI has already revolutionized several industries, as well as fraud detection, finance, medical diagnosis, entertainment and many other sectors. One recent innovation which is gaining recognition is the role AI will have in future learning environments like the public school classroom.

School systems across the country are taking a hard look at a broad range of AI platforms now available for the classroom to enhance student learning experience and to ease the task of teachers. For example, one AI developer touts a system to transport students to simulated environments ideal for what it calls "experiential, project-based learning." Teachers may now lead "virtual field trips" expanding beyond textbooks to directly experience other cultures, history and places. Lesson plans can be developed in seconds with AI with seeming endless possibilities for student involvement in this experiential and interactive learning.

One popular generative AI program gaining recognition today is called "MagicSchool", a system developed by Adeel Kahn, the son of Pakistani immigrants. MagicSchool has been adopted statewide in Indiana where it is being used by over 31,000 teachers who claim the program is saving 7-10 hours each week in their teaching schedules.

Will AI ultimately replace the classroom teacher? Those who advocate for creative applications of AI in the classroom characterize such fears as an unfounded "head in the sand" approach to this technology. But education is not taught in a moral vacuum. It is inherently value-laden.

Recently, I filed suit against the Williamson County school system on behalf of a number of parents and students over a curriculum called Wit and Wisdom, a program that evolved from Social Emotional Learning (SEL) and is based on what is called "Culturally Relevant Teaching". This curriculum emphasizes Critical Race Theory which is the belief that policies and practices in our society contribute to discrepancies through systemic racial inequalities.

In K-12 schools, Social Emotional Learning ("SEL") programs, such as Wit & Wisdom, are implanted as a solution to change the policies and practices that create inequitable outcomes created by what it calls systemic racism or oppression According to one of our experts, Dr. Jennifer McWilliams, the policy and practice changes in this program are designed to encourage children to adopt the critical race theory mindset and become "agents for systemic change." According to McWilliams, "Wit & Wisdom teaches Critical Race Theory to students through purposeful, psychological manipulation with a focus on empathy towards systemic racism/oppression and personal stories of racism/oppres-

sion." While Wit and Wisdom does not currently employ AI as a mechanism for transmitting such Critical Race Theory precepts, the groundwork has already been laid for such implementation in the public school classroom. The implications of such an application are worthy of parental concern because the subtlety with which these moral judgments are being inculcated into school curricula makes them often hard to detect. The parents whom I represented had no idea that their children were being exposed to several precepts which directly contradicted the Christian values they sought to instill in their children. Only when COVID restrictions forced their children to a home-based program of study did these parents discover, for the first time, the divisive nature of their children's lesson plans and reading assignments.

As the Supreme Court has recognized, "a child is not the mere creature of the state, those who nurture him and direct his destiny have the right, coupled with the high duty, to recognize and prepare him for additional obligations." For parents who recognize this solemn responsibility to guard against encroachment by the state on their role as the directors of their child's education, the expansion of AI into the classroom presents an ever-increasing challenge.

Can You Be Too Religious?

Religion has been a source of meaning, moral guidance, and community for billions of people throughout history. It can inspire, encourage ethical behavior, and be strength in times of hardship. Religion can serve as a moral code. But can there be such a thing as being too religious?

The question may seem a little offensive at first glance, however, is valid and necessary, particularly where religion plays an important role in our life, especially living here in the "Bible Belt". It is important to define what "too religious" means. Instead of having a deep, sincere faith it suggests imbalance, extreme dogmatism, or disconnected from empathy.

Religious belief has sometimes justified discrimination or even hatred towards others. Extreme religion has also been used to control or manipulate others, especially in cult-like settings. A religious life dominated by fear rather than love and grace

can be emotionally paralyzing rather than uplifting. When religious rules become more important than relationships or compassion, a person's life can become rigid and narrow and truly miss the entire message of Christianity.

So, can you be too religious? The answer is yes, especially if your religious commitment

begins to harm yourself or others and fosters intolerance – specifically when a person seems to justify their cruel behavior.

Deep faith is not the problem. Religious issues arise when belief becomes inflexible, oppressive, or even disconnected from compassion and reason. Relationships suffer. Faith, like any powerful tool, must be wielded with care. At its best, religion ele-



vates the human spirit. At its worst, it can narrow it. The challenge as well as the opportunity is to practice a faith in Jesus that remains both deeply rooted and open-hearted.

Most of our religious traditions should emphasize love, service, humility, and forgiveness. When practiced in this spirit, religion can be a powerful force for good. If it crosses into judgement, rigidity, and

fear, it can lose sight of its own higher calling.

Next time we find ourselves in a challenging situation to be "religious", allow love to be your guide. "It is the love of God that brings people to repentance". (Romans 2:4). We were never called to be "religious" – just to love others.

When licensed counselor, Kimberly Haar sat down on the Bridges set, I had no idea the story I was about to hear. It was a raw and compassionate conversation,

where Kimberly pulled back the curtain on her own devastating journey as a domestic violence survivor. Assaulted and kidnapped by her ex-husband and seeing the man she loved shot 10 times; she offered a lifeline of hope to those wrestling with seemingly unrecoverable pain. Drawing from both personal and professional experience, she reveals how it is possible to navigate life's darkest seasons with vulnerability, faith, and resilience so that you can ultimately embrace hope, find joy, and rediscover God's deep and abiding love for you. Here are some of the powerful truths that Kimberly Haar shared during our conversation.

Don't Buy the Lie

Don't buy the lie that healing from life's deepest hurts isn't possible. Give up the concept that your life is irreparably harmed. Believe God's Word that says nothing is impossible for those who believe and His promise that He's working all things out for your good. Certainly, our lives are affected by loss, grief, and trauma - but this doesn't mean that all

hope for healing is lost. Kimberly found that journaling God's promises helped her dismiss the lies that the enemy and even well-meaning people may say.

Embrace the Essentials

Faith. Trust. Forgiveness. One day at a time. Hold on to your faith in God and His good plan and promises for your life. Trust that you can be completely honest with God about what you're experiencing and how you are feeling. Trust that He sees your tears and cares about your pain. Believe that forgiving the person/s that have wronged you is not only possible but that in doing so you will be set free. Understand that all of this is a process. It's one day at a time and sometimes it's one step forward and two steps back. Kimberly found that her healing was not a straight line but rather a back and forth. As she accepted that healing was a process and not just a single prayer – she found resiliency and hope for her journey. However, as you hold on to God's goodness over time He will bring healing to your life.

Seek Expert Help

Sharing your thoughts and feelings with a Christian therapist can be very helpful in rebuilding your life after trauma, loss, or grief. A Christian therapist offers you complete confidentiality and a safe

space for you to share your unfiltered thoughts and feelings. A therapist is equipped to provide you with ways to navigate and process life's deepest hurts and challenges. Kimberly found that therapy provided a safe space to share her deepest fears and rebuild hope one step at a



What is Medicare Open Enrollment (AEP)?

Annually the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has a time frame for you to make changes to your Medicare coverage – whether you have a Medicare Advantage plan (MAPD) or just a Prescription Drug plan (PDP) – with an effective date of January 1, 2026.



You are allowed to make those changes (if wanted/necessary) without any health underwriting and basically no questions asked as to why you are changing. The idea is to see how your current insurance has done and if you have had any changes in your life that MAY require to look at other options.



When is AEP?

Your open enrollment dates are from October 15th through December 7th each year. The plan's effective date is January 1st.

How Do I Find Out What My Current Plan Will Look Like For 2026?

Generally speaking, you will receive from your current carrier what next year's plan (that you are on) will be via mail by the end of September. Each carrier has a different way of sending it so be on the lookout!

This is all so confusing, where can I get help?





Questions and Answers

1. Birthright Citizenship – what questions should be before the Supreme Court?

On January 20, 2025, his first day in office, President Trump issued an Executive Order seeking to qualify eligibility for birthright citizenship. The Fourteenth Amendment provides that: "All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside."



But what does it mean to say "and subject to the jurisdiction thereof?" When is a person not subject to the jurisdiction of the United States?

Birthright citizenship was explicitly added to the Constitution in 1868 when the 14th Amendment was adopted following the Civil War. But there are several categories of individuals born in the United States who arguably are not subject to its jurisdiction. Among these are: (1) when that person's mother was unlawfully present in the United States and the father was not a United States citizen or lawful permanent resident at the time of said person's birth, or (2) when that person's mother's presence in the United States at the time of said person's birth was lawful but temporary (such as, but not limited to, visiting the United States under the auspices of the Visa Waiver Program or visiting on a student, work, or tourist visa) and the father was not a United States citizen or lawful permanent resident at the time of said person's birth.

The Supreme Court will hear arguments on this important constitutional question. The issue will likely turn on how expansive the Court finds this provision of the 14th Amendment, and whether a child born to illegal immigrants is covered by this protection.

2. Has the constitutional power of impeachment become a political weapon?

Where does Congress derive its authority power to impeach a sitting president? Article II, Section 4: The President, Vice President and all civil Officers of the United States, shall be removed from Office on Impeachment for, and Conviction of, Treason, Bribery, or other high Crimes and Misdemeanors. The framers of the Constitution saw this power as an important check on the Executive and Judicial branches. But many believe that in recent times the power of impeachment has become a weapon for partisan political warfare. Partisan impeachment is when one branch of government attacks another as a means of political retribution. Impeachment has had a long political history, and even the framers were a little worried about how it would be used. In fact, it may be the only issue that Alexander Hamilton and Thomas Jefferson agreed on. Both men worried that a party with a large majority could weaponize it against their opponents. Today, their fears may have taken root. During our country's firs 211 years, only one president had been impeached. But three of the last five presidents have been impeached or faced impeachment inquiries, and one Cabinet secretary was impeached for the first time since 1876. Impeachment is a powerful constitutional weapon when wielded correctly, but its weaponization raises well-founded concerns of the constitution's drafters.

The Virtue of Faith: A Cornerstone for Christian Parenting

I remember being a young child and finding a dollar bill on the floor of my classroom. I was thrilled, coming from a single-parent home on food stamps, that dollar meant I could finally buy an ice cream at lunch. I slipped it into my pocket, and for the rest of the morning, I could hardly focus on my schoolwork. All I could think about was that sweet treat. But during morning recess, I noticed one of my classmates crying. My heart always ached for anyone in pain, and I went over to ask what was wrong. Through her tears, she told me she had lost the dollar her mom gave her for ice cream.

In that moment, I was torn. Part of me wanted to keep the dollar, but I knew what was right. My mother had worked hard to instill biblical values in me, and even though the choice wasn't easy, I couldn't ignore what she had taught me. "So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin" (James 4:17, ESV). That truth guided my heart. I knew I had to do the right thing, no matter how difficult it felt.

I returned the dollar to her. She was overjoyed and thanked me for finding it. She could tell I was disappointed, so when lunchtime came, she used that same dollar to buy an ice cream sandwich and shared it with me.

Instilling Christian Virtues:

Instilling Christian virtues, such as love, honesty, kindness, and responsibility, lays the groundwork for developing Christian character. When taught, these virtues help shape a strong moral compass that guides children's choices and actions throughout their lives.

Traits such as empathy, patience, and fairness also play a vital role in helping children form deep, lasting friendships and healthy relationships. They learn to see the world through others' eyes, handle conflict with grace, and become peacemakers. We hope to raise our children to be other-centered, rather than self-centered. A life rooted in virtue often leads to a more profound sense of joy and purpose.

The most powerful way to teach virtue is through example and hands-on practice. When children see virtue in action, they are more likely to embody it themselves, as those virtuous decisions take root in their hearts and transform them to have a Christ-like character. Scripture tells us: "Make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love. For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 1:5-8 ESV).

Faith is an Outstanding Virtue:

The virtue of faith is one of the cornerstones of Christian parenting. Faith is



also one of the three "theological virtues" alongside hope and love (1 Corinthians 13:13 NIV). How can we instill the virtue of faith?

Celebrate those "faith moments." When your child chooses to do what's right, even when it's difficult, and sees God respond through prayer, acknowledge and rejoice in it together! Say something like, "That's faith in action!" Reinforcing these moments helps them see that faith is real and relevant.

Faith doesn't mean never having doubts or questions. Encourage their questions! Help your children explore their curiosity and seek answers in the Bible. Let them know that God welcomes their questions and walks with them as they grow. Questions also help children develop into critical thinkers and make informed, wise choices.

Age-appropriate conversations:

• Ages 2-4: "We may not be able to see God with our eyes, but we know He's real, just like we know the wind is real because we can see what it does. God cares for you the way Mommy and Daddy care for you."


- Ages 5-7: "Faith means trusting God's promises even when they haven't happened yet. Remember how Abraham had to wait many years for baby Isaac? He trusted God the whole time."
- Ages 8-12: "Having faith doesn't mean we never have questions or doubts. It means we choose to trust God's character and promises even during confusing or difficult times. What questions do you have about God?"
- Ages 13-17: "Faith during the teen years often involves questioning and personally owning beliefs rather than simply inheriting them. What questions or doubts are you wrestling with in your faith journey? How do you balance critical think-

ing with trust? What does mature faith look like compared to childish faith?"

As you cultivate virtuous faith in your child, you will witness a glorious transformation of godly character unfold before your eyes, helping them develop deep trust in goodness, truth, and their ability to make a positive difference in the world.

"I get the most consistent views there, and have more followers," Vining says, adding that she's always on the lookout for new opportunities. "I'm currently trying to grow my Snapchat, because it's really begging for good creation on that platform," Vining said. "That's my new territory." She's well known online, has been spotted "in real life" as a social media influencer, and recently attended VidCon (a national convention where successful influencers gather to learn and socialize). It's a level of success that Vining said she could never have imagined as a teenager who was discouraged by her parents to even view videos on YouTube. She's learned to appreciate an upbringing that challenged her to use her faith in an alternative and creative way. "As a kid, I knew I wanted to do something 'big,' like singing, but because I didn't get a lot of support, I had to figure it out myself," she said. "I really felt like it was me against the world." She first made money online via her Amazon storefront, where she posted product review videos and skits. After she made \$1,000 a month on Amazon,

she felt legitimate and validated. Vining began to experiment with different types of content, and soon found that comedy was what resonated with her audience. "I learned that authenticity is what really works," she said, noting that she couldn't be something she wasn't. "As long as what I do is authentic, then people will respond."

Her comedy sketches deal with topics that many people can either identify with personally or that they find funny as they relate to current pop culture. On TikTok, for example, Vining's recent popular videos include funny takes on homeschooling, impersonations of celebrity JoJo Siwa, comedic conversations between Gen-Z children and Baby Boomer parents, and collaborations with other influencers she met at VidCon. The

idea for much of her content comes from her own experiences, as well as interactions with other people from a similar background. "I'll talk with people about their experiences and find that a lot of our feelings are the same," she said. "As a homeschooler, I was very awkward and uninformed about stuff. Those experiences show up in my comedy, and people have really liked them. And other people who were homeschooled often tell me that they identify with what I have to say." Vining started college at the age of 15 as a dual enrolled student and graduated with a degree in business administration from Thomas Edison State University at the age of 19. On Instagram, Vining's videos are divided up into categories including Sarcastic Rae, Chatty Rae, Catness Rae, Fan-Girl Rae, and Actress Rae. But she also includes "Christ Follower" in her description on Instagram and is up front that, while her comedy isn't Christian, she is a person of faith who is committed to creating material that anyone can watch.

The Faith Thread. Vining grew up in a Baptist household and still worships at a Baptist church but was inspired by the comedy of Studio Ca sketch television show produced by BYUty, a channel and family-friendly streaming service founded in 2000 at Brigham Young University. The Studio C YouTube channel has more than 3.3 million subscribers and has received more than 3 billion views. "I saw that success and was just interested in what makes people laugh," she said. "I wanted to specialize in clean comedy. I wanted to create someforward it along to other people." She mentions the faith-based inspiration

on her YouTube channel description: "I create clean, original, relatable comedy skits. My passion is writing and acting! I was greatly inspired by the sketch comedy style of Studio C. I'm a Christian, 22-year-old college graduate living in Alabama. I'm blessed to be a full-time content creator supporting myself entirely independently." Vining said that she gets a variety of responses from Christians to her comedy sketches and other online content. Most responses are positive, but she occasionally is challenged with the idea that she should be more "obvious" with a Christian message. She, however, believes that her message can be best presented in a more nuanced way; in fact, she can reach more people for Christ with her general, clean approach to comedy. "I met a friend of a friend one time, and she said that she'd heard about my platform. She wanted to know how I use it to spread the Gospel," she said. "I told her that I don't. You can't force the message on viewers." Instead, Vining prays

comedy. I wanted to create something that people wouldn't have to be embarrassed by or roll their eyes at to a comedy. I wanted to create something started Rae's WAY Overdoing It YouTube channel when she was just 17 years old but has found her massive success in the last two years. She's only 22 now and knows that more opportunities await her.

that her faith shines through in her comedy. "My content is brand-safe and includes nothing controversial," she said. "And it's something that anyone can watch." Vining said that there are surprisingly plenty of Christian content creators online today; they aren't "branded" as Christians, but they're proud for people to know that they live a life of faith. "I get really excited when I meet a fellow creator and find out that they're a Christian," she said. "It's important for Christians to be making good content."

The Lessons Learned. Vining is still young, but she's already learned many important lessons about following dreams and having goals. In fact, she said that she encourages parents to give their children a wide range of opportunities. "Let your children figure out who they are, instead of saying 'this is who you need to be.' If your child tells you that she wants to be a singer, put her in voice lessons," Vining said. "If she says she wants to be a dancer, let her take classes. If they don't like it, they can stop it. But it lets them explore those creative dreams." Vining firmly believes that God puts intuition, goals, and dreams in our hearts for a reason. Vining also said that online careers are something that the younger generation should be given opportunities to explore. While older generations may not understand social media and content creation, they should be willing to open their minds to these new areas. Whatever direction a child, a young businessperson, or anyone with a dream goes toward, Vining said that it's important to have courage and to be your own advocate. "My advice is not to wait. I want you to hurry up and fail, because every failure is a lesson that's going to help you get ahead," she

said. "A week or a month or a year from now, you can look back on the failure and learn from it. You'll look at it in a totally new way." Ultimately, however, Vining said that it's important to trust God along your journey. Despite early discouragements and challenges, Vining said that she can look back now and see how God guided her every step of the way. "I wouldn't be here if I wasn't open to God's will, and if I hadn't asked God for help," she said. "I feel like I've had the biggest blessings and halos over my head. God has blessed me, and I look back now and really see where He worked."

Simple Prayers For Little Ones

I've been teaching my grandson some rudimentary sign language (mostly spelling). We have a poster hanging on the wall of our home that shows each letter of our last name in sign. Every time my grandson and I pass the picture, I sign his last name. Last week, he moved his chubby fingers like he was signing. Not precisely, but he mimicked what I had been doing.

Preschoolers model so much of what we say and do—the good and not so good. Prayer is the perfect spiritual discipline to teach your kids at this early age for they will model your every word and action. Even the very youngest can fold hands, join hands in prayer, or say a simple prayer.

Consider using these slower summer days to introduce your preschooler of ways to talk to God. Watch for times to guide your child in prayer when:

- fighting occurs between siblings
- someone is hurt or ill
- it's a beautiful day
- it's an everything-went-wrong day
- your child is frustrated
- your child rebels
- someone or something is lost

When you stumble on one of these moments, pray right then. Try starting with one-sentence prayers, prompting your child to fill in the blank with his own words.

God, you are ______.

Thank you, God, for ______.

I am sorry I ______.

Help me ______.

Help ______ get better.

Help me to obey ______.

Don't just teach them to pray for themselves but also for others. If you hear of a friend who is sick, pray for that person by name. If you see a homeless man on the street, ask God to provide for him and stir his heart toward God. If an ambulance whizzes by, pray for all those involved. Be brave and pray before meals at restaurants or for the waiter. You're showing your child that prayer is important.

Do you have a memorized prayer during mealtime at home? Keep it short and simple. Soon your preschooler will be saying the prayer with you or on his own. Consider starting a prayer wall or prayer jar where family members can keep prayer concerns front and center. Even a picture on the refrigerator could prompt daily reminders to pray.



Allow each child to mature at their own spiritual pace. One might not seem interested or even listening at the moment. Another will want to pray on and on every time. Your job is to keep praying so your kids can hear and model your prayers. Remind them that it is an honor to pray to God. Compliment them after they pray. Most importantly, assure your child that God hears them and delights to answer prayers.

Our Kids Need To Know: Why Does My Writing Matter?

A.I. is making a lot of teachers and some principals I know nervous. While this uncertainty makes a lot of sense, we have a chance to get clear on a few concepts that can deeply bless our students for lasting impact wherever the Lord should call them.

First, kids' questions are so important to how they learn! Joshua 4 twice says "when your children ask you." This word suggests that we should joyfully expect kids' questions, like portals to their hearts that may only be open for a short time!

When it comes to AI, many kids are asking: "Now this machine can do the writing for me. We use machines to do lots of things to make our lives easier. How is this different?"

As a student, I was told I must write well to earn good grades, to write college essays, to write my cover letter to get a job. I was told that it was cheating to use someone else's words as my own. I gradually discovered that worthwhile things usually do involve hard work.

Those answers weren't wrong; they just didn't go deep enough for this question. What about writing makes it so important, so key to how God made

me as a unique person, that I would want to go through the struggle to put my own words together, even if it sure seems like a computer can do a smoother job of it than I can right now?

If you've ever written a love letter, you already know. And the Bible is God's love letter to us.

Jesus tells me that out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks. Proverbs 18:21 tells me that "death and life are in the power of the tongue," so how I use my own words must matter a whole lot. The Psalms tell me to sing a new song to the Lord, which sure sounds like the Lord wants my creative involvement, not just somebody else's words. 1 Peter 3:15 tells me always to be prepared to give an account for the hope I have in Christ. Whether I feel skilled or not, my words matter to God because I do, and God has given them to me to encourage others.

When we truly listen to kids' hearts, we hear other



questions waiting underneath. Why is writing a thing worth working to get good at? Is it OK if I'm not that good at it right away? How can I get better? Are my own words really that important? Who will take the time to read or hear them? Who will take them seriously enough to talk with me about them?

Do you hear the pleading behind those unspoken questions, for time, for attention, for relationship? I've spent years developing tools and strategies for young writers, but without love they're just "a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal". Love is how we demonstrate value with our actions. And love is often spelled "T-I-M-E."

What is the B-Endorphin all about? PART 1

Sometimes the good old things (the research from several years ago in the late 80s) remain most relevant in today's 2025, world of healing. In 1987 I was the principal author of a most interesting study on the B-Endorphin which was published in the International Journal of Clinical Biofeedback and Health. For anyone who may be interested in reading the entire study (it's really very interesting for sure, though I'm biased) it is in volume 10, No1, pp.8-15 in this International Journal of Clinical Biofeedback and Health.

At the time of this early research, I was in the midst of completing my PhD in Clinical Psychology and simultaneously I was enthralled by the newly discovered power of the "runners high", which rather quickly became recognized as the unusual event which often takes place when a disciplined athlete pushes him/herself beyond what is normal, and often excel to a level they never expected!

As a youngster growing up in the inner city of Chicago, I was petrified to enter a swimming pool because of a near drowning experience. My longtime friend Mike very much wanted to help me overcome my fear of swimming, especially before I entered high school. With my friend's persistent help, I was able to learn to swim, so when I entered high school, I surprised myself by immediately joining the swim team. At that particular time, I was so enthusiastic about my accomplishment with swimming that I volunteered to swim in the very competitive breaststroke hundred-meter race and when I excitedly climbed out of the old sandstone pool, I tore off three or four of my fingernails, but I felt no discomfort, only excitement because I placed in the race!

This was my first experience with understanding the power of the Endorphin which is present in all human beings. The Endorphin is a protein made up of 31 amino acids and is produced in the pituitary gland of our brain which is the size of our baby fingernail. The endorphin was discovered by Dr. Hughes in 1975, and it literally means "from inside the head". The Endorphins are an opiate-like substance which can alter our moods and behaviors by producing a morphine like substance which can be 5000 to 10,000 times more potent pure morphine! And most amazingly it is formed within our body and research suggests that the use of other drugs, especially morphine like drugs may very well stop the production of our own Endorphin and its medicinal abilities.

During that time in high school, I was becoming immersed in the Greek culture as I was studying the Greek language with my professor who was from Greece. I was very fascinated by the Greek culture and the new understanding of Greek medicine and healing. The Greeks believed that there were three very different healers in their culture: there was the "knife" doctor, and then the "herb" doctor, and the "Word" doctor. There is no doubt in my mind they all were critically important, but I was most fascinated by the "Word" doctor, especially because I had recently read "Anatomy of an Illness" the New York Times most popular book written by the author of The Saturday Review, Norman Cousins.

Norman Cousins was experiencing intense suffering from a terminal illness which medicine provided no relief from his pain. Ironically, he found healing through the "words and behavior" of funny people, such as Laurel and

The Endorphin travels at an incredible speed within our brain and throughout our entire body, and the complex interactions within our brain. This unusual Endorphin energy present in each of us is composed of 100,000,000,000+ neurons which have thousands of connections with other neurons. This computes to a minimum of 100 trillion interconnections, or 2,100,000,000,000,000 possible transactions that the human brain can begin at one time! The human brain is a dense thicket of hundreds of

billions of nerve cells, each capable of forming anywhere from 1000 to 500,000 synapse, at any time. It is important to remind ourselves that we have been created by an amazing God who has placed within each of us roughly 10,000 miles of interconnecting nerve tissue in each cube inch of our neocortex. This is enough connections to stretch practically from Los Angeles to Cape Town and back 28 times; enough to stretch from here to the moon and back again and then back to the moon again!

We recognize the brain transmits information electronically and chemically and as well as jointly utilizing both systems. As advanced as we are in so many ways, we have very limited knowledge of our brain. However, the more we are committed to learn about our brain, the reward will be significant increase in knowledge, and this will exponentially grow because of the marvelous reality of what our brain really is with its infinite learning available for those who aspire in this quest.

In the article which we wrote in 1987, I reference very unusual book written by my esteemed Professor, Dr. William Glaser. This book is entitled Positive Addiction and suggests everyone is prone to addiction and probably we all are an addict in one way or another. At first this was rather disturbing to me, however as I processed it, I realize that perhaps there are a few "positive addictions" such as learning, growing, creating, etc. which provide unusual opportunities moving forward rather than remaining stuck in negative addiction. Limited thinking, self-centeredness, and poor decision making which results in painful outcomes, can change. We can CHOOSE to recover!

Please look forward to part two which focuses on the importance of wisely utilizing our Endorphins to promote good health and healing. The second part on the Endorphin will be in next month's Publication

My friend, Tim Bisagno, in his Stand Up Dude podcast, calls men to live with purpose and lead their families through five key biblical anchors — each of which strengthens how we steward what God provides:

- Be watchful Pay attention to your financial habits and spiritual blind spots. Know where your money goes and what it says about your priorities.
- Stand firm in faith In uncertain times, resist panic. Trust God's plan over financial fear, knowing He is our true provider.

- Act like men Embrace your role. Lead your family, make the hard calls, and reject passivity when it comes to money.
- Be strong Exercise discipline and perseverance. Save consistently, stay out of debt, and say "no" to short-term gratification.
- Do all in love Let your stewardship be rooted in love for God, for others, and for future generations.

Standing up financially is about more than money. It's about reflecting God's character through how we handle His blessings — with purpose, courage, and love. To follow biblical stewardship principles, investors can start by creating a purpose-driven financial plan that aligns with their values and responsibilities. Regularly review your finances and invest with integrity, avoiding fear-driven or unethical decisions. Stand firm in faith by choosing long-term impact over short-term gain. Be watchful and disciplined, seeking wisdom and avoiding unnecessary debt. Lastly, lead with love and generosity—build giving into your plan and use your resources to bless others.

True stewardship isn't just about growing wealth, but about reflecting God's character through intentional, faithful, and impactful financial decisions that honor Him.

PARENT WITH PURPOSE

The Third Gift We Give to Our Child

A child's personal development begins the moment they do. It starts with the very first gift their parents give to them; Life, the most precious gift anyone can be given to another.

Shortly after the first, the second gift follows, the gift of their unconditional love; it too is a great and powerful gift. The third gift bestowed upon a child by their parent is their name. It is said that good things come in threes, and I strongly believe that to be true. A name is more than just letters, it carries the identity of belonging, the history of heirship, and

meaning as to who the parents wish them to become.

It is the first declaration to the world of who a child is and the legacy they inherit. A name holds power, shaping how a child sees themselves and how the world will address them from that moment on. It becomes a foundation for confidence, pride, and belonging, reminding them they are loved, cherished, and meant for greatness. With every word spoken by or of them, their name echoes through time, marking their journey, dreams, and achievements. A parent's gift of a name is a promise, a guiding light that follows their child through every step of life.

Parents often select names based on three primary criteria, each carrying its own meaning and impact.

The Influence of Popular Trends

Names can reflect the cultural and social landscape of the time. Parents may be drawn to names that are fashionable, inspired by celebrities, literature, or even societal movements. These names give children a sense of belonging in their generation, shaping their identity within a contemporary framework. While trends evolve, the name remains a marker of the era in which the child was born, a time capsule of influences and aspirations.

Honoring Family Legacy

Still other parents choose names that have been carried by cherished relatives, weaving their child's identity into the family's history. Whether it's a grandparent's name, a beloved aunt's, or a sibling's tribute, this practice instills a sense of tradition, respect, and continuity. The child grows with a name that carries memories and values, making them a living connection to those who came before them. It fosters pride and responsibility, reminding them they are part of something larger than themselves.

The Meaning Behind the Name

For some parents, the essence of a name, the meaning it holds, matters most. Names can symbolize qualities like strength, wisdom, love, or resilience, serving as an aspiration for the child's life. Some cultures prioritize names with spiritual or philosophical significance, believing they shape personality and destiny. Prior to 1983, the Catholic Church required parents to select a name that was from the Bible or a Saint's name. Another interesting fact is that King



David named his son, Solomon, because he was tired of war. Solomon means "peace" in Hebrew. According to the custom of the times, the child was raised trying to live up to the meaning of their name. When Solomon became king, his forty-year reign is still the longest peace time in the Jewish peoples, nearly six-thousand-year history. A name rooted in meaning serves as a guiding force, encouraging the child to live up to its virtues and embrace its purpose.

Interestingly, in 2024, when it comes to the third gift, the top twenty most popular names given to newborns,

> ten were either from the Bible or were named after Saints.

I find it fascinating that the first three gifts, life, unconditional love, and a name, are that they are all meant to be permanent and shape a child's identity forever. While material gifts fade, these three gifts define who a person is at their core.

Life is the foundation, the sacred

beginning of existence. It is the one gift that parents grant without knowing how it will unfold, yet it holds infinite possibilities.

Unconditional love ensures that the child never questions their worth. It is the only force that can truly heal, empower, and protect, shaping every relationship they form in life.


A Name becomes their first connection to the world, their introduction to society, their tie to family history, and, in many cases, the symbol of their destiny.

The Foundation at Work



ENCOURAGING WORD

Salt And Light....In A Divided Culture

Is it possible to be salt and light in a culture where Evangelical Christians champion individual freedom, autonomy, and liberty while seeking to legislate societal morality through majority rule? This question reveals a genuine tension for Evangelical Christians. How do we advocate for personal freedoms while using the democratic process to influence and enforce our biblical understanding of moral standards in society?

I formulated this question a month ago while studying the "Scopes Monkey Trial" in preparation for the 100th anniversary reenactment of the "Trial of the Century" held this week in Dayton, Tennessee.

The tensions argued 100 years ago over individual liberty and majoritarian democracy remain prescient today. Watching actors portray Clarence Darrow and William Jennings Bryan, the central figures in the Scopes trial, argue vastly different worldviews stirred my dilemma. How do Christians living in the "now but not yet" reconcile this paradox?

This dilemma is a "liberal paradox," revealing a deep tension between two cherished principles in liberal democracies that cause societal conflict. In balancing respect for individual choice with fair collective decisions, we hit a limit: not all values can coexist harmoniously. Adding to the tension is the clear mandate from Jesus Christ to be salt and light in this cauldron of malaise.

How do we honor both the biblical call to be "salt and light" (influencing society toward godliness) and the principle that faith should be freely chosen, not coerced? I shared my question with 18 insightful Christians — pastors, scientists, doctors, lawyers, politicians, apologists, and educators. Their responses were varied but showed consensus that Christians must pursue biblical righteousness through legislation that "influences society toward godliness." Issues like abortion, human sexuality, and defining marriage were frequently mentioned.

However, there was also agreement that Christians often pursue the right objectives in the wrong way. One politician noted that too often we seek to advance God's kingdom and righteousness by enacting laws to enforce a moral code prescribed by God, but such efforts are often "in vain," according to 1 Corinthians 15:58, because they are self-serving and not done "in the Lord."

Former Tennessee Gov. Bill Haslam writes in his book, Faithful Presence, "Too often, Christians shape their faith to fit their politics rather than forming their politics from their faith. They seem to forget their calling is to be used by God in service of others rather than to use God to reach their own desires and ends. Faith can be a redemptive, healing presence in the public square, as it must be, if our nation is to flourish."

An apologist responded that for the unbelieving world, "our testimony of faith in Christ, our involvement in Christian community, and our stand for truth, regardless of which way the winds of society blow, should have a far greater impact than legislative or societal movements in the name of the Lord.



This doesn't mean Christians should avoid legislation faithful to Scripture, but we can't rely on legislation (or judicial action or executive orders) to change the human heart."

A Christian educator put it succinctly: "Morality as a goal is misguided. Morality is fool's gold. The dead are burying the dead." A pastor added, "What good is it if we win the moral battle in society yet lose the souls of men in the process?"

Many respondents highlighted a prevailing shallowness in biblical literacy among Evangelical Christians, a lack of understanding of how

the Bible intersects with contemporary issues, and an inability to engage in meaningful, reasonable conversations with those of differing perspectives. One pastor said, "We are so divided we don't know people with other viewpoints, and most don't want to [know anyone with another viewpoint]. Our politics influences our evangelism more than the Holy Spirit does."

Ironically, a 1925 Memphis Commercial Appeal editorial about the Scopes trial noted a lack of confidence among Christians in defending their faith against secular challenges. "Most sincere believers in religion have their religion but are afraid if they go out and mix in the fray, they will lose it. Some fear they will be put to confusion. Some believe but fear they cannot prove their belief, so they leave the field to extremists like Darrow and Bryan."

Are Christians toothless lions, reduced to shouting at the culture rather than engaging it? We shouldn't be. Everything the editorial mentions can be corrected. We know God. We have His truth in the Bible. We know God's desire is to see hearts changed. We have the gospel. We have the Holy Spirit. We have each other.

The bigger question is: What will we do with all that we have, and how will it guide us to be salt and light "in the Lord" in a decaying society of individual freedoms while graciously pursuing righteousness, loving and serving those who may hate us? It is a complex question, and demands both an individual and collective response.

The Voice You Feed

I may not see the way, but I believe You're making one." So when doubt knocks, don't answer. When fear screams, let faith whisper louder. Feed the voice that says, "God is able." Because He is.

Prayer For Today:

Father, today I choose to silence the voice of doubt and lean into Your voice of truth. Help me to stay anchored in faith even when fear tries to take the wheel. I know You are able to do far more than I could ever ask, dream, or imagine. Remind me that Your power is at work within me, and that nothing can stop what You've ordained for my life. I surrender control and place my trust fully in You. Let Your still small voice lead me, strengthen me, and remind me that You are always fighting for me. In Jesus' name, amen.


