



PARENTING POINTS

Heart-Based Parenting: Moving Beyond Power Struggles

"Johnny, get off the computer and finish your homework!" "No, Mom, just one more minute!" "No, Johnny—off right now!" "But Mom, I'm almost at the next level!"

If you're a parent or grandparent, chances are you've gone back and forth like this with your child at some point—it's a familiar tug-of-war in many households. I know I did when I was raising my kids!

Most parents have experienced this exhausting cycle of setting boundaries that resulted in pushback from their children. What begins as a simple request to complete homework or limit screen time quickly escalates into a full-blown confrontation, leaving both parent and child feeling frustrated and angry. Resistance and conflict are persistent challenges parents face. Highlighting the importance of intentional, heart-focused training over mere behavioral control is crucial and can lead to lasting change.

Persistent arguing leaves us, and our children, exhausted and angry. Prolonged disputes may often occur due to your

child's desire to control their environment or may result from expressing frustration because of their limited autonomy. This is a significant factor with young children who cannot express their frustration. Often, this is because of their underdeveloped emotional regulation skills, difficulty accepting disappointment, or an immature understanding of who's in charge. Just ask most two-year-olds, and they will tell you they are the boss! Rather than viewing these conflicts as willful defiance, parents can use them as opportunities to teach essential life skills.

A more effective approach focuses on developing the child's heart to want to do what is right rather than simply managing their external behavior. This heart-centered method acknowledges that sustainable change originates from within and aims to equip children with the emotional and social tools they need to navigate challenges independently. Instead of asking, "How can I make my child comply?" this approach asks, "What skills does my child need to handle this situation more effectively?" This aligns with the wisdom of Proverbs 4:23: "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it." When we focus on the heart, we address the source of behavior rather than merely its symptoms. It is a more loving way to guide and discipline.

Teaching children how to respond correctly they can learn to respond with acknowledgment and acceptance rather than immediate protest. Similarly, when asked to complete an undesirable task, children can learn to express compliance verbally before taking action. For young children, you can use the yes-no sandwich technique. "Mommy, can we go to the park?" Instead of saying no, your baby sister needs a nap, reply, "Yes, we can as soon as your sister wakes up from her nap, yes, we will go then." If you say no, we can't, because your sister is asleep, this will foster sibling rivalry. However, the yes-no sandwich works because they hear the word 'yes' instead of 'no'. In addition, helping your child learn how to respond helps them develop self-regulation skills that will serve them throughout their lives.

The ultimate goal of this parenting philosophy extends far beyond reducing daily conflicts. By investing in character development during childhood, parents are preparing their children for future relationships, academic challenges, professional responsibilities, and personal struggles. The skills learned through heart-based training become the foundation for healthy marriages, successful careers, and meaningful friendships. This long-term perspective transforms everyday discipline moments into opportunities for life preparation rather than mere behavior modification. Most importantly, it strengthens

the connection between parent and child, building a lasting bond of love and trust.

When parents respond to conflict with gentleness rather than harshness, they model the very behavior they hope to see in their children. Proverbs 15:1 illustrates this principle: "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." By refusing to engage in unproductive arguments, parents demonstrate mature conflict resolution skills and create opportunities for effective teaching. Similarly, 2 Timothy 2:23-24 advises, "Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments, because you know they produce quarrels. The Lord knows that I engaged in too many arguments when my children

were growing up. I only wish I had known what I know now, because it would have made a significant difference, especially during the teenage years. The goal is to help your family grow together in an atmosphere of love, trust, and respect, not one built on fear or strict control. Most of all, we want to give kids the tools they need to thrive on their own while staying connected to their families through strong, trusting relationships. Obedient kids are often happy kids.

Has "Grievance Culture" Become a License To Break the Law?

There is a disturbing mindset stirring today: If you feel wronged or a victim of injustice, you can make your own rules. This is a quantum leap beyond mere civil disobedience which has always played an important role in shaping American culture since the Revolution. Martin Luther King, Jr., perhaps the most avid modern proponent of this form of resistance to tyrannical authority, recognized the use of peaceful protest to effect needed change

during the civil rights era of the 1960's. Like-

wise, Gandhi's civil disobedience was a strategy of

nonviolent resistance against British rule in India,

How do we counteract this dangerous trend? Some advocate appeasement as a form of addressing this issue. They argue we should counter the trend of cultural grievance by promoting empathy, opening dialogue, and shared goals to address the roots of division and reduce political polarization. Others say it is futile to employ a calm, reasoned dialogue as a means of placating imminent violence. It is hard, they would say, to invite peaceful discourse with one who is poised to ignite and hurl a Molotov cocktail at innocent bystanders because of some perceived grievance.

aiming to achieve independence through peaceful means. It involved deliberately breaking unjust laws and refusing to cooperate with the British authorities, while maintaining complete nonviolence.

Over my career I have legally defended several across the country who exercised peaceful civil disobedience outside of abortion clinics to urge a reversal of Roe v Wade. Today, we are witnessing a dangerous shift, at least by a segment of society, condoning the use of violence as a means to assuage some political injustice.

The latest example of this is the Luigi Mangione case. Mangione was accused of killing United Healthcare CEO Brian Thompson all in the name of retaliation against an unjust healthcare system. Shortly after his arrest, he was hailed as a folk hero by many on social media. An online community was formed to raise money to pay for his defense. To help raise funds, merchandisers sold coffee mugs and t-shirts emblazoned with Mangione's likeness. Luigi Mangione: the Musical debuted in San Francisco to a sell-out crowd, and was so successful that it became a tour event. Smiling defiantly at the cameras, Mangione knew that he had tapped into a mob-like group of followers who shared a sense of public outrage at the healthcare system.

Recently, a New York gunman, 27-year-old Shane Tamura, opened fire in an office building killing four people over his grievance against the NFL, which had offices there. Tamura claimed to be a victim of football-related injuries. He carried with him a note stating: "Study my brain injury!"

Just what is "grievance culture?" Sociologists define grievance culture as a societal or group mindset characterized by perceived injustices, and historical wrongs. This fuels anger, resentment, and a sense of victimhood, leading to violence as a means of retribution. This culture can manifest politically, as seen in historical and modern examples of grievance-based political movements such as Black Lives Matter, or individually, in cases of lone actor violence.

Individuals who resort to violence often do so out of a perceived victimhood and react out a sense of righteous anger. Their violence is not directed at a specific individual, but rather against a class of society whom they blame for this injustice. The more grievous the wrong, the greater the justification for acting outside the rules.

As one commentator put it: "The danger is obvious. When grievance is elevated over morality, the threshold for acceptable behavior collapses. Harming others becomes a legitimate response to feeling wronged. Public safety erodes. Shared norms vanish. And in the vacuum, each person decides which rules apply to them and which do not."


It's not that grievances aren't real. Some are, and there is a moral obligation to address and remedy them. But grievance politics inevitably leads to a breakdown in communication.

Morality originates from God, who created humanity in His image. Restoring morality biblically involves acknowledging humanity's fallen state, embracing God's restorative work through Christ, and living by God's unchanging moral law as revealed in Scripture and creation. This process includes seeking God's Spirit for transformation, practicing virtues like kindness and forgiveness, following the Golden Rule of treating others as you'd be treated, and upholding the moral clarity God established in His design for humanity.

How Your Child Can Be Light at School

School is back in session. Rhythms have formed, schedules are filled, and busyness now rules. September is a good time to remind your kids about what is truly important. Of course, learning, grades, and behavior are all important, but don't forget the spiritual aspect of your child. How can they be light in their



school this year? How could they be the hands and feet of Jesus to their class-mates and teachers?

Remind them of who they are. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus told the people, "You are the light." For younger children, you might need to be more literal and show them how to be like Jesus, then challenge them on what that would look like. Speak encouragement over them, such as: You are brave. God is with you. God will help you. Older children may understand what it means to be light, but also need some guidance.

Look for opportunities. Encourage your children to think about how they could use their hands or feet at school. How might they use their hands? Could they hold a door open for someone or carry something for the teacher? Their feet could remind your child to share about Jesus at lunch or on the playground, like the beautiful feet mentioned in the Bible (Isaiah 52:7).

Pray for strength and courage. Before your kids leave for school, ask God to infuse them with courage to shine brightly in the hallways and classrooms. Encourage your child to pray for the bully, teachers, staff, and friends. Remind them that they can pray silently before taking an exam or eating lunch. Practice role-playing how to handle difficult situations with your kids. This will boost their confidence.

Offer leadership opportunities. This Thursday, September 9, is See You at the Pole (SYATP). During this nationwide student-led event, kids, teachers, and parents gather around the flagpole to sing and pray for their schools. Visit the SYATP website to learn how your child can participate in or organize this event at their school campus.

Look for teachable moments. Remember, your child is learning to be a light. They don't have the experience or know-how of how to shine for Jesus yet. Model this behavior at home or while going about your day. Have conversations around the dinner table about missed and successful opportunities to be light. Discuss specific situations on how to be kind to others or treat those who don't act nicely. Don't expect your child to be perfect. Give them grace and time to grow their light. But do offer praise and encouragement when you see them acting like Jesus.

What a difference your child could make this year.

2024 was a year of remarkable progress!
God's provision of our facility in 2021
came with the vision of expanding medial
services, establishing a family serves ministry, and pursuing opportunities to serve Portico
clients in more meaningful ways. In 2024, God's
provision, again helped us make great progress in
these areas that could have taken years to achieve.

In mid-2024 we began funding through the Ten-

nessee Strong Families Grant, enabling us to fund three new positions and expand into three new areas of ministry. With this funding we added a Certified Nurse Midwife, a Family Services Coordinator and a Case Manager to the Portico team. After two decades of providing medical services, we can now provide not only expanded medical care but more peace of mind for anxious moms through out early prenatal care program. Our new Family Services program aims to enrich the parenting services and education that we have been providing since we began in 1986. This program allows us to focus more support on single mothers and couples committed to becoming better parents, providing them with essential community and resources. Case management has allowed us to target areas of need, recommend or provide resources, and assist



our clients who are pregnant and may have material needs that are driving them

toward abortion. We have been able to help with rent, purchase baby beds and car seats, provide transportation, and even assist with car repairs so that mothers and fathers can work.

The state grant was a big part of God's provision in 2024, but the unwavering support of our community of donors and volunteers has been even more vital to our ministry's progress. The state funds are specifically targeted and do not impact our regular budget. 

Medicare Open Enrollment Starts Soon

It's almost Fall y'all so it will soon be time for Medicare Open enrollment.
So, let's take a look at what Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) is all about. If you have a Medicare Advantage Plan or a prescription drug plan (PDP) this is the time of year you get to review how



those plans have done for you. You will be receiving from your plan's carrier toward the end of September a letter called the ANOC letter (annual notice of change). It will tell you what the changes in your plan will be for 2026. Remember to open this letter from your carrier and not put it in file 13!

If you don't do mail, then hop on your computer beginning October 1st; you will be able to log on to Medicare.gov and check out your plan there. You may also see your plans info in the 2026 Medicare&You that will be mailed to you. It's available on their website but does not have local information on plans/carriers.

The open enrollment signing period is October 15th through December 7th. If you decide to make any changes, your new plan will start January 1, 2026. If you don't make any changes then your current plan will roll into 2026, and you don't have to do anything!

Suggestion – call your Medicare Rep and discuss next year's plan with him or her! Every year we must get recertified with Medicare and the Carriers to be able to offer suggestions as to what would be the best route for you in 2026. We are blessed to have such a great healthcare system in middle TN and that attracts many companies that want to do business here.

Remember this is about your healthcare coverage for next year. It's worth taking a look! And this time next year – we get to do it all over again!



Michael Wallin Living Out His Foith in Business

Michael Wallin tries to live out his faith with similar advice that he gives to clients at his investment firm: "Make Christ proud with your decisions." Wallin has moved up the ranks of the investment world and has had many impressive professional roles over the years. But his place right now—as managing partner at Franklin-based Optivise Advisory Services, through their affiliated company, PanthRex Asset Management, —is right where he says Christ wants him to be: encouraging other Christ followers to be wise with their money and their lives.

A Christ-Honoring Business

In 2014, Mr. Wallin partnered with CPA Allen Hargis to co-found PanthRex Asset Management, an investment firm, and Grace Global Alliance, LLC, a 501(c)(3) association of churches with the inititative to bring retirement and investment services to believers in a manner consistent with biblical principles. In fact, the name of Wallin's business comes directly from Scripture. PanthRex is the combination of the Greek and Latin names Panthera Leo (Lion) and Rex (King).

"PanthRex came from the knowledge the Lion of Judah is Christ and we believe that everything we have belongs to Him," Wallin explained. "PanthRex and Optivise are His companies and He has given us the great opportunity and responsibility to steward them in a manner that is honoring to Him. We believe in honoring God by the way we steward the resources He entrusts to us."

Wallin said that his past professional experiences challenged him to provide people with a unique perspective on investment and money management; he said, "most Christians rarely had an understanding into the companies their money was being invested. For many Christian investors, they are invested into companies they would not be proud to own."

When he co-founded PanthRex Asset Management, he found the opportunity to change that. "Years ago I was working as an executive vice president at an organization I'd been at for nine years, and God placed a word on my heart and a mission to achieve," he said. "God told me to 'go serve those people who are serving my kingdom.' It was not in my plans to leave that organization, but God kept giving me that message."

He realized that he, and so many other Christians in his position, were advising people to put their money in investment models that didn't honor God; they were investing into companies that by product, service, or philanthropy did not align with their closely-held beliefs. "There's gotta be a better way," he told himself. "So now we look at a Company's product, their service, and philanthropy and we use tools to screen those companies out of our investment solutions so that our investors can be confident in their investment decisions. If God gives us resources, then why are we investing in companies that don't support our Christian faith?"

Wallin said that his company's goal is to educate people on the decisions they make with their money, so that they can make wise, Christ-like investments

while also providing for their future. "Our job is to bring light into darkness, to educate, and to bring awareness," he said. "And then we want to prepare people with tools and resources to help them retire with dignity and to thrive, not just survive, during their retirement years. If one's cup runneth over, we want fort hem to have the opportunity to be even more generous in that season of their lives."

The company also tries to provide a multi-disciplinary approach in meeting client investment, income, tax, wealth transfer, charitable, and estate needs. "We don't want to be one-dimensional," he said. "We build the overall plan

taking into consideration both the quantitative and qualitative aspects of a client's life and how it matches up with the Word God has given us. You can only get truly comprehensive help with a multi-dimensional approach." In a way, he said, it's a harkening back to a more traditional, family-style business model. "We take the family office approach, realizing that Main Street needs to be provided with services as much as Wall Street," Wallin said.

Family and Faith

Wallin's own family journey has been filled with blessings and opportunities. Originally from Chickamauga, Georgia, he graduated from Austin Peay University in 1993 and moved to Nashville in 1997 with his business at the time. He and his wife, Tarryn, have two daughters-a 15-year-old and 9-yearold -and they're all active in the faith community. As a part of community outreach, Tarryn enjoys singing with her daugh-

ters at local nursing homes, women's events,

and local venues.

His wife, in fact, is a professional singer and songwriter and has written two hit songs in the Southern Gospel arena. Several years ago, she co-wrote Tonja Rose's number one Country Inspirational song called "I Found Life", and her co-written song "Expecting Good Things" was the title cut of Jeff and Sheri Easter's Grammy and Dove-nominated album. She also releases her own music as an independent artist under her professional name, Tarryn Aimée. "She's incredibly talented," Wallin said. "Her song Expecting Good Things was also performed live by the Easter's on Bill and Gloria Gaither's Homecoming CD and DVD set called Majesty".

Together they try to model Christ's example in their family. Wallin said they are very involved in their children's lives (he's a community coach for his daughter's sports teams, and they support their children's interest in the arts). "We love to give back to the community," he said. And in their home life, they stress the importance of making God the center of their conversations. "We make God part of everything, all of our family discussions and time together," he said. "We lean on God for discernment and guidance, striving to put God first."

The key to keeping Christ central in family life, he said, is balance. "We've always tried to Wallin says that his company's goal is to educate people on the have balance in our lives," Wallin explained. "Yes, we're attending church, but we're bringing the message home and into our lives. We ask ourselves, 'how do we demonstrate what we believe?' To do that you need balance." He added that Christians-and families-need to have a "plumb line" to fall back on when things get hard. "Getting back up after you

fall is easier when you have a plumb line to get back to. If you have a set of rules in your life, it's a lot easier to find your way back," he said. "We need a relationship with Christ, but if you don't have that place to direct you it won't work."

Wallin said that he looks forward to the reward for that faithfulness, as his own children grow up to have successful families of their own. "Hopefully, I'll hear my kids impart that same wisdom to my grandkids someday," he said. Wallin said that he often reflects on the trajectory his personal life, family life, and career have traveled over the years. Where he's at now, he said, is a culmination of lessons learned; it's validation from God that he's moved and is still moving in the right direction. "My life and career have been on these different levels throughout my life," he said. "First I was in a learning season, then an elevation season, and now I'm in a season of service."

The Bottom Line


As Wallin looks to the future as a husband, father, business owner, and Christian, he plans on continuing to teach the lessons he's found are true in all of those areas. He has hope that he and his partner's company will continue to grow, as they lead Christians to a new understanding of money management. Ultimately, he wants Christians to know that it's okay if they've invested money unwisely in the past-everything in life, he said, is a learning lesson. "Individuals don't need to be ashamed that they don't know things, or that they haven't ever thought about where their money's going," he said. "We're trying to educate people, and teach them how to be a good steward of their resources."

The investment sector can be one driven by greed, but it can also be about who Christians look to as their source-and how that knowledge can change their attitude toward money. "Our mindset is that investing should be with a purpose. Is my plan kingdom focused?" Wallin asked. "My entire life...not just financial, and not just family... should be aligned with God's kingdom plan."

Ultimately, it all points to the truth that you can't outgive God. "Blessings", Wallin said, "all blessings come from God; in return, Christians need to be generous, servant-minded, and knowledgeable about how best to honor His kingdom with their resources." "If you truly believe God is your source, you can't outgive God."

PARENT WITH PURPOSE

Welcoming the School Year with Prayer

A new school year has begun, pause — breathe deeply, gather your children close, and look back before getting caught up learning new routines and schedules and meeting new teachers. Slow down long enough to savor a few moments reflecting on the previous school year. Sit with your children and together recall the treasured moments of the previous grade.

Focus on the memories now woven into their hearts: the laughter shared with newfound friends, the spark of discovery when a lesson took root, the patient encouragement of teachers who helped them grow in confidence and competence.

As the school year unfolds, pray for every adult within the school — those who lead, guide, inspire, and care for students.

Ask for wisdom, patience, and an abundance of grace to fill their days. Engage your children in praying for classmates, for new friendships that will nurture kindness, empathy, respect, and a shared love for learning. Pray that every student feels at home and knows they are of great worth and value. May they desire to do their personal best day-to-day. As a family, take time to pray over the campus as you walk around the buildings, across playgrounds and sports fields.

If you homeschool, let your prayers encircle your home and wherever your child learns, whether in co-ops or on field trips. Pray for the students your child will meet in the coming year, that together they will learn from one another and build bonds

of encouragement and respect.

You may notice your child's worries bubbling to the surface — perhaps a third grader anxiously

In these moments, listen closely, and imagine the world through your child's eyes. Assure them it's natural to feel nervous when facing something new. Let your words wrap around them like a comforting hug: "It's OK to feel this way. I'm here with you and so is Jesus."

Let your child know again that you are their greatest cheerleader. Reassure them that no matter what happens — on the playground, in the classroom, or after the final bell that there is nothing that they can't share with you. And above all, remind them that Jesus is always by their side, ready to listen, to give strength, and to meet every need when they call upon Him.

Begin each day with prayer for your children — before they step onto the bus, walk through the school doors, or even open their books at the kitchen table. Bless their steps, their words, and the thoughts that fill their minds, carrying them through the day.



When the school day has ended and you greet your children, whether at the front door or from the front seat, do so with a warm smile and a word that

affirms their presence. Small gestures of welcome assure them that home is a haven where love and acceptance always await.

Consider, too, the questions you ask in those afternoon moments. Instead of "How was school?" — a question so easily dismissed — try inviting your child into the conversation with: "What made you smile today?" "Did you learn something that surprised you?" "Were there moments when you felt brave, or when you helped someone else?" These questions open the door to deeper connection, allowing your child to reflect, share, and feel truly heard.

Let's embrace the new school year with hearts full of gratitude and eyes wide open to the countless ways God will work in and through your children.

FAITH UNDER FIRE

Are You Stuck in Unforgiveness?

We have heard, "To err is human – to forgive is divine." This simple phrase was first coined by Alexander Pope in his poem, An Essay on Criticism. It is a profound truth about humanity and God. It is also a backdrop of the message of the Gospel. The first part of Pope's phrase expresses that everyone makes mistakes, and imperfection is part of the human experience. No one is without error. The second part suggests that the ability to forgive others, especially those who have wronged us, is a higher virtue. This is where, as a Christian, we push into the Holy Spirit to help us where we are unable to help ourselves. To forgive others who have caused us harm does require a supernatural power. If you are walking in unforgiveness, it is fair to say that you not pushing into the power of God. You may be trying to achieve this in your own power.

Forgiveness requires more than mere tolerance. It is an echo of the divine, a reflection of God's merciful nature. Forgiveness also offers restoration.

God, in His infinite Grace does not simply overlook our faults – He redeems them.

Welcoming New Life: Baptism Across Christian Traditions

Each year, Catholic families present their newborn for Baptism within weeks of birth, echoing the Jewish practice of presenting sons before the Lord on the eighth day. Both rites recognize the gift of new life and the promise of covenant. In Baptism, Christian parents entrust their child to God's mercy, washing away original sin, and clothing the infant in Christ's grace for the first time. In some cultures, the date of baptism is celebrated annually much like how we celebrate our birthday.

At the heart of the Baptismal Rite, the priest's opening questions, "What do you ask of God's Church for your child?" and "What name do you give them?", forge the soul's first covenant with Christ. The first question summons the parents to conscious intention, ensuring this sacrament is not a fleeting tradition but a deliberate embrace of new life in the Spirit, deliverance from sin, and incorporation into God's family. The second question, richer than mere formalities, inscribes the child's unique identity into the Body of Christ; in Scripture, names reveal vocation and promise, and by speaking it aloud, parents and community publicly welcome the child into a lifelong journey of faith. Together, these inquiries elevate Baptism from ritual to personal encounter, uniting parental commitment, ecclesial support, and divine grace for the child's path to holiness.

While Catholics follow Baptism with Confirmation in adolescence, other traditions weave these sacraments together or rearrange their sequence. In the Eastern Orthodox Church, for example, Baptism is immediately followed by Chrismation (their form of Confirmation) and First Communion. From the first moment a child emerges from the water, they receive the seal of the Holy Spirit and a share in the Eucharistic life.

Anglican and Episcopal congregations also practice infant Baptism, but they too reserve Confirmation until young people reach an age of understanding. At that point, candidates publicly affirm the vows made on their behalf, receive the laying on of hands, and deepen their membership in the Body of Christ. This two-stage approach mirrors Catholic structure while placing professed consent before full sacramental participation.

Lutheran churches, rooted in the Reformation's emphasis on grace alone, baptize infants to signal God's unmerited favor. Many Lutherans then invite children, as early as age seven or eight, to "affirm" their Baptism through catechetical instruction. Though not always called Confirmation, this rite of affirmation allows youth to claim the promises already theirs by Baptism. Methodists embrace both infant and believer's Baptism, treating it as "an outward sign of an inward grace." They do not separate Confirmation as a

required sacrament but encourage a mature profession of faith through church membership vows. In many Methodist parishes, individuals, whether baptized at birth or later, publicly recommit themselves to Christ's service at a Confirmation-style ceremony.



By contrast, Baptist, Pentecostal, and many non-denominational communities practice believer's Baptism only. They delay the rite until a person is old enough to understand and confess faith in Jesus. Without a separate Confirmation ritual, Baptism itself becomes the moment of consent, a public declaration that one has died to sin and risen to new life in Christ.

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (Mormons) takes believer's Baptism even further, requiring each candidate to be at least eight years old. They view eight as the "age of accountability," when a child can discern right from wrong and choose the gospel. After Baptism, new members receive the gift of the Holy Ghost through a laying on of hands, effectively their Confirmation.

Despite these differences, every Christian Baptism proclaims the same good news: water and Spirit unite us to be born again in the image of Christ, sharing in Christ's death and resurrection. Whether sprinkled, poured, or fully immersed, whether at eight days, eight years, or eight decades old, the underlying reality is God's gracious initiative. Families across traditions share a vision of new life, community, and hope that no human schedule can bind. As Christian parents, grandparents, and godparents, we embrace both the diversity and unity of these practices. We honor our ancestral roots in Judaism, rejoice in the richness of global Christianity, and look forward to the day when every baptized soul stands clean before God, whether by the river Jordan or the local font. May the ripples of grace from our family's Baptism nourish our children's faith for generations to come.

Early, On-time, or Later?

Qualified retired workers reach the eligibility age to claim benefits at 62. For those who choose to begin benefits at that time, they experience a permanent reduction in their benefits for life. As an example, for someone born in 1960 or later, claiming at age 62 would result in a nearly 30% reduction in benefit compared with claiming at your Full Retirement Age (FRA) of 67. If a qualified retired worker chooses to delay claiming their benefit past FRA, then those individuals receive a permanent increase to their benefit amount. For each year of delay up to age 70, the benefits increase by 8% simple interest for each full year delayed. This increase is known as a delayed retirement credit.

Top Five Considerations for Claiming Strategies

- 1. Earnings Test Prior to FRA. For 2025, if you're collecting Social Security before FRA, the annual earnings limit is \$23,400. Benefits are reduced by \$1 for every \$2 earned above this amount. If you are in the year you reach FRA, then the annual earnings limit of \$62,160 applies. No earnings limit applies once you've reached your full retirement age.
- 2. Life Expectancy. If you have longevity in your family and expect to live a long life, delaying benefits can potentially lead to a higher total lifetime payout. On the other hand, if you have health issues or a family history of shorter lifespans, claiming earlier may make sense.
- 3. Primary Retirement Income Sources. Look at the big picture of your retirement finances. If you have enough in retirement savings and other income streams coming in, you might be able to delay claiming and accumulate delayed retirement credits. View Social Security as an asset in your retirement portfolio. You may want to work with a financial and tax professional to con-

What Is the B-Endorphin All About? part 2

The B-Endorphin remains for many, as the most important healing entity which can provide so much health and healing for each of us. Don't forget to review the four reference pages supporting this research. This pertinent information is noted Part 1, on Page 1, on the Endorphin, published in the last months edition. Always remember to follow, RULE #1.

When this article was initially published, the authors conducted a survey of 61 randomly selected medical psychotherapist who were members of the American Board of Medical Psychotherapist were surveyed and the results revealed that 87% regarded the discovery of the B-Endorphin to be among the three most important discoveries relating to health since 1960. Shortly after these results, a randomly selected group of biofeedback clinicians who subscribe to the Journal Clinical Biofeedback and Health revealed that 84% identify the Endorphin as one of the most potent scientific discoveries of the past century. It was that long ago, 1975, that Dr. Hughes discovered the Endorphin, which literally means "from inside the head" which reside the pituitary gland of each of our brain's and is 5000 to 10,000 times more potent than synthetic morphine. As I completed this great 12 year experience, I retired my A&D licensures and returned to full-time clinical practice with renewed interest in the Endorphin and healing, utilizing Eastern Medicine with Energy Psychology.

The more we venture into really understand the brain we experience mind-boggling because we often become overwhelmed. Several years ago, Dr Hans Selye identified the sequence of the body's responds to stress and this is referred to as general adaptation syndrome (Gas). Included in this syndrome was the "alert state" in which the pituitary gland immediately releases fight or flight hormones including the ACTH, which is the primary hormone of the pituitary gland that affects heart rate, blood sugar levels, pupil dilation etc. With all this orchestration there's increased levels of the Endorphin which significantly affects physical activity and endurance. Previous experiments required utilizing the brains of over 30,000 sheep to complete a similar task of managing severe pain for just a few individuals with intractable pain associated with your cancer.

Many colleagues and friends over the years, as well as myself, and other professionals have arrived at a series of beliefs concerning the Endorphin. Some contend that the drug addict or alcoholic continually seek the effects of the Endorphin, which for a variety of reasons cannot be achieved with the alcohol or drug they have, because these substances tend to turn off the production of the Endorphin in the pituitary gland of the brain. The psychic nature of addiction is more apparent with a response to a perceived deficiency, and one seeks relief with the synthetic analgesic which they hope will relieve their "psychic pain". Trevecca Professor Acquires Historic Bibles to Expand Student Learning Opportunities

Two centuries-old Bibles have made their way into the hands of Dr. Steve Hoskins, professor of religion at Trevecca Nazarene University, who is thrilled to share them with his students. The books once belonged to a retired pastor and profes-

sor, and he passed them along to a Methodist bishop who's a friend of Hoskins, insisting that they be given to people who understood their significance and would tell their stories well.

The bishop called Hoskins to ask if he was interested. "He contacted me on FaceTime and started to show me these Bibles. I said, that one there, I'll wrestle anybody for it," Hoskins said. "That Bible was published nine years before the King James Bible and is called the Bishops' Bible."

Printed under Queen Elizabeth I, this version includes apocryphal texts and was one of the first bibles published by the Church of England. "It's not in the best condition," Hoskins said. "But one in great shape could sell for \$25,000."

The second Bible was printed by the Society for





the Promotion of Christian Knowledge (SPCK) in 1841. The SPCK was key in supporting the ministry of John Wesley, a key figure in Nazarene theology. This collection of scripture demonstrates a much different side of the Church than the royally commissioned Bishops' Bible. "This Bible is just a straight-up, poor person's Bible. Not spectacular, but very functional," Hoskins said. "It was used to teach literacy and Anglican doctrine—often to girls and the poor."

For students, the opportunity to interact with the artifacts is a rare one. Freshman theology major Mason Robertson was surprised to have this opportunity so early in his college career.

"I was not expecting to see anything remotely like this up close until grad school—and I'm a freshman," Robertson said. "I want to go into translation work and I thought it would be years before I had a chance like this." Hoskins made the point that this kind of opportunity sets Trevecca apart. Students are able to physically handle the books, albeit carefully; an uncommon experience in higher education. "Many schools don't let people touch these," Hoskins said. "But here, it's about connecting students to history in a real, visceral way."

For Hoskins, these Bibles are not just museum pieces. He hopes his students come to a deeper understanding and respect for scripture and history. "They are part of a mission—to remind students that faith is rooted in real people, real sacrifice and real moments in time. For the students to get to interact with history—I think it's the best way to teach history," Hoskins said. "You get a sense of how it was done. Printing a book in 1602 was very rare. In the Reformation, wars were fought over the Bible. The price paid and the respect people had for it—that's something students can now feel firsthand."

KIDS KORNER

How to Explain A.I. to a Fifth Grader (and Why It Matters for All Christians)

Have you ever tried to hammer something with the back of a screwdriver? I have. It hurt my hand! Different tools are good for different things. They each have strengths and weaknesses. Understanding this helps us choose the right tool for the job.



A.I. is a tool that looks for patterns, then uses them to make predic-

tions. Maybe you've been to a school cafeteria that served peas on Monday and carrots on Tuesday. Maybe you predicted they'd serve peas and carrots on Wednesday. Maybe you were right! Leftovers are a common pattern.

The reason A.I. seems so smart is that it's seen billions of patterns. When you ask it a question, it tries to fit it with a pattern it's already seen, then follow that pattern to predict what words you want to hear. Maybe that answer will also be true. Maybe not. A.I. can be an incredibly useful tool. But predicting text and discerning truth are two different things, as different as a hammer and a screwdriver. And what people want to hear is not always what's true!


Recently I read in my Bible again about King Saul. You may remember that the Israelites wanted a king so they could be like the other nations. They had a pattern in mind. God warned them about this pattern, then gave them want they asked for. King Saul did look like a king on the outside; he was a head taller than anyone else around him. But is that pattern really what makes a good king? Perhaps you read about the tech company whose systems rejected many women for jobs. Most of the company's current employees were men, and the computer looked at their records to make its patterns. Even if the computer wasn't told whether a person was a man or a woman, a women's college or a women's sport on a resume didn't fit its pattern, so that person scored lower and might not get the job. Does that mean that person couldn't program a computer?

Patterns on the outside don't always tell us what's on the inside. Later the prophet Samuel almost makes this same mistake himself, but the Lord warns him "man looks on outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart" (1 Samuel 16:7). The king the Lord actually chooses is the youngest son. Young David doesn't fit the pattern people expect, but he has the courage from the Lord to take on Goliath! His size wasn't important for being a good king. His courage from the Lord was.


Let's end with a classic tomato joke. Knowledge is knowing that a tomato is a fruit. Wisdom is not putting it in a fruit salad. (Eww! That wouldn't taste good!) A.I. knows lots of patterns, but it isn't wise because it can't understand what's really most important about them. We can learn to be wise, though. The Bible tells us that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom. To become wise, we can read His Word (the Bible) and seek to follow Him. Maybe then we can use our tools wisely too!

How to Clean Stainless Steel and Keep Appliances Shining!

Taking Care of Stainless-Steel Appliances

Stainless steel is everywhere in homes today. In addition to appliances, it's also used in sinks, countertops, and more. No matter the application, there are a few golden rules to follow when cleaning or maintaining this tough yet touchy surface.

Remember to check the manufacturer's recommendation before using commercial steel cleaners. Certain brands use surface treatments or finishes that require special attention or care. Using some cleaners could even void your warranty.



For quick and easy cleaning, try this:

Fill a tea kettle or a pot with water and bring it to a boil on your stove.

Place your stainless-steel coffee pot in the sink and add a tablespoon of dish soap.

Pour the boiling water into the pot.

Let the pot and the water sit for 30 minutes.

Swirl the water and soap inside the pot and pour it out, rinsing with cold water.

Inspect the pot and repeat as needed.

How to Clean Stainless Steel Safely

Stainless steel resists everything from germs to stains to dents, but it does have one weakness: fingerprints. As we mentioned, specialty steel cleaners are available. Check to ensure the cleaner is safe to use on the surface, especially if it's a highly visible element in your kitchen, like a fridge or dishwasher. You might even consider testing it on a small, discreet portion of your appliance and waiting to see if there is any effect.

Natural Steel Cleaning Options

You can also use vinegar as a natural cleaner on stainless steel. Here's how: Fill a spray bottle with white vinegar. You don't need to dilute the vinegar, so skip the water!

Spray the surface and wipe in the same direction as the steel grain. Rinse by wiping with a rag dampened with clean water. Let the surface air dry.

Vinegar is less expensive than commercial stainless steel cleaning sprays and is just as effective at removing the marks from oily or sticky fingers. Vinegar also offers some disinfecting power, which is a major plus when used on kitchen appliance handles. If the strong scent of vinegar lingers, use a fan to dissipate the smell.

To avoid damaging the finish on your steel appliances, never use the following cleaning supplies:

- Steel wool or abrasive sponges and brushes
- Glass cleaner
- Furniture polish
- Any chlorine-based cleaning sprays

How Often Should Stainless Steel Be Cleaned?

Cleaning your stainless-steel appliances and surfaces should claim a spot in your cleaning routine every month. Depending on how many family members use the fridge (and how clean their hands are when they do!), you may need to clean more often to keep your steel surfaces looking spick and span. Consider keeping your vinegar spray bottle topped off to give high-touch items like the fridge or dishwasher a quick cleaning whenever you get a spare minute. Like all cleaning supplies, you should keep vinegar out of the reach of children. Although it's a natural, non-toxic cleaner, it can still make curious kids sick if ingested.

How to Clean a Stainless-Steel Coffee Pot

Cleaning other stainless elements of your home is a little different. One head-scratcher is cleaning a stainless-steel coffee pot or electric kettle. Cleaning these items is especially important if you have hard water at home, which can lead to a mineral buildup inside, affecting your coffee's taste.

How to Clean a Stainless-Steel Sink

We're hoping to help you clean everything, including the kitchen sink! Cleaning your sink is a great way to kill bacteria, avoid unpleasant odors, and impress your guests. Cleaning a stainless-steel sink effectively calls for a few items you probably already have at home, such as:

¼ cup baking soda

½ cup water

1 cup white vinegar

You'll need a spray bottle for the vinegar, which is another reason to keep that bottle of vinegar handy in the kitchen! Empty the sink and rinse it thoroughly with water using the hand sprayer. Mix baking soda and water to make a paste the consistency of pancake batter. Sprinkle more baking soda liberally over the entire surface of the sink. Spray the entire surface with vinegar. It will begin to fizz and foam. Scrub the sink with your baking soda paste using a non-abrasive sponge or rag. Rinse thoroughly with the hand sprayer.


