



What is it in our Constitution that Makes Us Who We Are as a Nation?

The late Justice Scalia delivered an opening statement on American exceptionalism to a Senate Judiciary Committee on October 5, 2011. Here is an excerpt from his answer to this question.

"What do you think is the reason that America is such a free country?" "What is it in our Constitution that makes us what we are?"

"If you think that a bill of rights is what sets us apart, you're crazy. Every banana republic in the world has a bill of rights." Every President for life has a bill of rights. The bill of rights of the former "Evil Empire," the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, was much better than ours. I mean it, literally. It was much better. We guarantee freedom of speech and of the press -- big deal. They guaranteed freedom of speech, of the press, of street demonstrations and protests; and anyone who is caught trying to suppress criticism of the government will be called to account. Whoa, that is wonderful stuff!"

"The Bill of Rights is just what our Framers would call a parchment guarantee. The real key to the distinctiveness of America is the structure of our government."

"The Europeans look at our system and they say, well, it passes one House and it doesn't pass the other House; sometimes the other House is in the control of a different party; it passes both, and then this President, who has a veto power, vetoes it. And they look at this and they say, "Ah, it is gridlock".

"I hear Americans saying this nowadays, and there's a lot of it going around. They talk about a "dysfunctional government" because there's disagreement. And the Framers would have said, "Yes, that's exactly the way we set it up. We wanted this to be power contradicting power -- because the main ill that beset us".

"So, unless Americans can appreciate that and learn to love the separation of powers, which means learning to love the gridlock, which the Framers believed would be the main protection of minorities -- the main protection."

Diets & Making Peace with Your Body: A Journey Toward Freedom

Happy New Year. Whether we call it a New Year's Resolution or a goal, most of us have something we would like to achieve during the New Year. I wasn't surprised at all to learn that losing weight was at the top of the list for many women, the struggle with body image begins quietly and early. A comment overheard, a comparison made, a standard absorbed without question. Over time, those moments can grow into a lifelong pursuit of acceptance—often measured by mirrors, scales, or clothing sizes. In a recent episode of *Hope for the Journey*, Monica Schmelter and Heather Creekmore invite listeners into an honest and hope-filled conversation about making peace with our bodies and finding freedom through faith. Heather shares her personal journey of wrestling with body image, a battle that persisted even as she walked closely with God. What surprised her most was the realization that her obsession with appearance was not merely a confidence issue, but a spiritual one. When our thoughts, energy, and joy revolve around our bodies, body image can quietly become a form of idolatry—something we look to for worth, control, or identity instead of Christ.

Healthy is not a Number on a Scale

This perspective may feel uncomfortable at first,

but it is also deeply freeing. Recognizing body image struggles as a sin issue is not meant to bring shame; rather, it opens the door to healing. Sin thrives in secrecy, but when brought into the light, it loses its power. As Heather explains, "Healthy is not a number on a scale." True health includes spiritual well-being, emotional wholeness, and right relationships—not just diet plans or exercise routines.

The conversation also highlights how exhausting body obsession can be. Constant self-monitoring robs women of mental space, joy, and presence with their families. Instead of engaging fully in relationships and God-given purpose, many stay stuck waiting—waiting to feel confident enough, thin enough, or "fixed" enough to truly live. But the encouragement is clear: we don't have to wait anymore. Freedom begins with loosening the grip body image has on our hearts. This doesn't mean ignoring health or self-care but reframing them. Pursuing health should never come at the expense of spiritual growth. When wellness becomes another rulebook or source of pressure, it has missed its purpose. Healthy living is about stewardship, not self-salvation.

God Often Uses Trusted Friends

Community plays a vital role in this journey. Isola-

tion fuels comparison, while relationships remind us of who we are beyond appearance. God often uses trusted friends, mentors, and faith communities to gently redirect our focus from ourselves back to Him.

Making peace with your body is not an instant fix—it is a process. But each step taken toward surrender brings relief. As women learn to focus on God's purpose for their lives rather than society's expectations, they discover something powerful: freedom. A life no longer dominated by mirrors or measurements becomes one filled with deeper joy, stronger relationships, and renewed hope. Today's Secret from the Studio: When we loosen the grip of body image, we make room for something far better—the abundant life God has been offering all along.




Celebration of a Two Hundred and Fifty-Year Long Experiment In Liberty

As Benjamin Franklin was leaving on the final day of the contentious summer-long constitutional convention in Philadelphia on September 18, 1787, a lady named Elizabeth Powell asked him: "Well, Dr. Franklin, do we have a monarchy or a republic?" Franklin replied: "A republic. If you can keep it!" This year will mark the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, and Franklin's admonition is just as compelling today as when first spoken. It is a formidable warning that a self-governing republic is not guaranteed but depends on the ongoing vigilance, participation, and civic virtue of its citizens to remain free from tyranny. Our founding fathers understood that self-government is hard business. It requires citizens who know how their government works and who have the courage to hold their leaders accountable. We may not always agree about the right policies for the day, but we have the freedom – the obligation – to robustly debate competing ideas and values.

A government of and by the people presupposes that we the people should and can govern ourselves – and do so in peace and with mutual respect. Today, as perhaps never before in our nation's history, open debate is threatened by a

growing intolerance of opposing worldviews, especially Christian views, to the point of violence. The assassination of Charlie Kirk is perhaps the most poignant example. As Lincoln put it, speaking to a war-torn republic: "We must not be enemies. Though passion may have strained, it must not break our bonds of affection."

Throughout much of my career as a constitutional lawyer, I have represented individuals who courageously stood in the public square, proclaimed their allegiance to Christ and were arrested or persecuted by those who condemned them for their ideals and hated them for their audacity to share them publicly. Currently, I represent a young man who was arrested and handcuffed in a public park when he refused to stop sharing the gospel with those who celebrated with "pride" their opposing views. Ironically, those who pressed the police for his arrest did so under banners that proclaimed a need for universal tolerance.

My friend and ardent champion of constitutional liberty, Dr. Carol Swain writes in her book *Be The People*: "Americans' acceptance of cultural relativism has opened the flood-gates for many changes. Cultural relativism rejects absolute right or wrong,

teaching that truth is valid only for a particular society at a given time. Acceptance of this worldview creates an environment in which tolerance is elevated as the highest virtue."

There is room in the public square for freedom of expression for all competing ideals and worldviews. Indeed, acceptance of this foundational premise is vital to the preservation of our republic.

The challenges our nation faced in its infancy remain today. But we now have a long history in which contentious disagreement and factionalism has tested time and again our ability to survive these divisive winds. As we celebrate this momentous milestone, let us not only look to our past accomplishments, but to the future of a commitment to the preservation of our unique experiment in self-government founded on the consent of the people and a shared commitment to liberty for all.

ENCOURAGING WORD

The Six Questions of Discovery and The One Choice

The questions starting with Who, What, and Why always prompt us to ask When, Where, and How. Only after they generate multiple options, do we ask the final question, Which.

Questions are the key components to learning. Any parent can tell you, that as soon as a child begins to comprehend their environment, the questions start to flow. It is how every human creates their cache of knowledge. Without questions, our only source of knowledge would come from our limited life experiences and instinct. Trial-and-error would be the method of choice delivered through the School of Hard Knocks.

But the six questions of discovery are much more than the mental calisthenics for all knowledge; they are the keys we use to unlock the truth needed to live by. They are, by Divine design, tied to the natural order of our existence through the Power of the Wisdom of Three; the natural laws of science having only three components. No, they are not six stand-alone questions; they are really two pairs of three questions, each pair intended to enrich the knowledge that makes us uniquely human.

All these answers combined, should lead us to one unified individual; not three different and separate personalities. Who, what, and why we are, regardless of when, where, and how we are! When, Where, and How make up the questions that direct us toward our future accomplishments. They should clarify our actions while supporting our human personas through our three conscience human abilities; our Thoughts, Words, and Deeds. These questions allow us to seek out the truth from other



sources. It is our thoughts that conceive the questions, bringing them to written or oral words so we can learn and teach them for and to others, and our actions or lack of action make up our deeds which are created by applying their answers appropriately or, in the case of poor decisions, inappropriately, to our personal, professional, and spiritual lives.

It is the choice question, Which, that makes the difference between wise or unwise decisions. Our freewill, not our intelligence, controls the answer to that question, as well as the final outcome.

Asking the discovery questions to everyone will only confuse you; look around, there are many inquisitive fools. We must learn how to weed out those persons who do not know the truth and those who benefit from ignoring or withholding the truth. Those people, though loved, should never be trusted to provide true guidance or allowed to enflame our emotions. They know that many can be manipulated to use emotions, as the determining factor, when answering the Choice question.

In addition, we must use of these questions appropriately to be effective. Start by using the other laws of nature in unison with these. One such law is The Law of Determining the Truth. It provides a simple to remember, yet difficult formula to master, for uncovering the true facts of life by asking the right questions, to the right people, at the right time. Then, once the truth is obtained and the right choice is made, we should follow the Law of Applied Truth; we are each born to learn, then teach, and finally, to live the truths of human life.

DEK of Hearts:

How a Trevecca Trio Earned Their Way to a Four-Chair Turn on "The Voice"

The roar of the crowd could be heard from backstage. Music icons were waiting to hear them sing, along with the rest of America. As the seconds ticked down to the biggest performance in any of their young careers, the trio bowed their heads in prayer. "It was a make or break moment," said Emily Clapp, one-third of the Trevecca-made band DEK of Hearts. "We were taking a risk jumping right into three-part harmony." As Emily walked onto "The Voice" stage with her bandmates Dylan John and Kollin Bailey, they hummed their starting note to prepare to hit their harmonies. A single chair turn could drastically change their lives. A deep breath, a count-in, and they began to sing. Almost immediately, a chair turned to face them. Then another. And another. And another. In just a verse or so, the trio found themselves singing directly to music superstars Reba McEntire, Michael Buble, Snoop Dogg and Niall Horan. "I think I blacked out," Emily said. "We genuinely were just praying for a one chair turn. I don't have a clear memory of the performance or anything the coaches said." But before Season 28 of "The Voice," before Team Niall and before the national spotlight, there were just three singing friends on Trevecca Nazarene University's campus.



Connecting on the Hill

Kollin Bailey still remembers touring Trevecca's campus and meeting two students in Trevecca's Nineteen|01 coffee shop—Emily and her future husband, Chris. "I remember thinking, wow, if everybody that goes to school here is like them, then I want to go to school here," Kollin said.

On campus, their circles overlapped through Trevecca's public relations (PR) ministry teams: Emily and Kollin traveled with Refuge; Dylan John traveled with Awaken alongside Chris. Friendship came first, music second "The first time I saw Dylan was on the steps of McClurkan," Kollin recalled. "He sang an Ed Sheeran song. I was like, gosh, this guy is so good." Their first trio moment came almost by accident. At a senior recital, Kollin asked Dylan and Emily to sing Lady A's "What If I Never Get Over You." "It felt so right," Emily said. And people noticed. But the three wouldn't become a band until nearly a year later.

The three become close

After graduation in May 2023, the trio stayed connected—sharing meals, pickleball games and occasional harmony cameos at each other's individual gigs. "We were best friends before the band started, and I didn't want to mess that up," Kollin said. "I'd heard horror stories of friends starting bands and not being able to even be in the same room later."

In April 2024 they opened for Rhonda Vincent, a connection formed from an internship Kollin had previously done with the Grammy-winning artist. "Even at that show we were like, are we doing this? Do we even have a name?" Emily laughed. "It felt like if we walk on this stage as a trio, we're introducing ourselves to the world—and it's going to be really awkward if we go back on it. So are we good? All hearts clear?"

All hearts were indeed clear, and soon after, as one band, they leaned into four-hour bar sets three to four nights a week, all while holding full-time jobs. That grind, they say, became their boot camp. An Instagram ad for "The Voice," on the last day to submit, nudged the next step. "We kind of went out on a limb," Dylan said. They recorded a quick cover of "Heads Carolina, Tails California," navigated callbacks, then waited. And waited... and waited some more. And then came February 10. The call came telling the trio to pack their bags and head for California. Ironic, considering their audition song. "I re-

member falling to the floor in complete disbelief," Emily said.

Breaking out

After the successful blind audition show, recorded in July, the group was forced to keep it a secret until the episode aired a few months later. "It was tough," Emily said. "There were a lot of people in our lives that had no idea what we were doing."

Finally, after months of waiting, a September 4 commercial before the opening kickoff of the 2025 NFL season broke the news. Of all the auditions that could've been previewed, "The Voice" chose DEK of Hearts. "Our phones were blowing up," Kollin said. "That's when it felt real."

Their first big dose of hype continued into the band's October Whiskey Jam debut in Nashville. "People had driven across state lines," Kollin said. People came from Georgia, Minnesota, Utah, even Canada asking for photos and autographs—a first for all three of them. Emily admitted: "I had to quickly practice my signature."

The Trevecca influence

All three band members credit Trevecca with shaping their craft and their calling. Dylan, a commercial music major with an emphasis in voice, learned the Nashville number system on PR and through songwriting with professor Kim McLean. "I hadn't had a formal music education. Trevecca was the first time I learned how to communicate with a band." Emily, a worship arts major and social work minor, discerned her call to ministry in a new context. "Now I'm doing ministry in the country world. We try to spread the gospel at all of our shows." For Kollin, a music business major, Trevecca was a place where he found reps—and resolve. "Trevecca gave us a space to goof around and be creative. PR prepared us to be in a band. It made what we do now easier."

What's next

Outside of "The Voice," DEK of Hearts is working toward releasing an EP. And the dream? "To play the Grand Ole Opry," Emily said. On "The Voice," DEK of Hearts advances next to the knockout rounds, which air throughout November. With luck, that could be followed by playoffs and then live performances. Fans can follow their journey on "The Voice" app and @dekofhearts across social platforms.

For Dylan, Emily and Kollin, this moment is bigger than music or TV—it's about calling, friendship and faith. And they pledge to keep their outlook the same: friends first, ministry always. "It's our dream to do it for a really long time," Emily said.

John DeBerry: Faith, Family, and a Life of Service

John DeBerry proudly calls himself a bridge builder. A former member of the Tennessee House of Representatives and the current Senior Adviser to and member of Governor Bill Lee's cabinet, John DeBerry has a strong conviction to use his Christian faith and heart for public service to do what's right for his constituents. Because of that, he wants to be a bridge builder who serves everyone despite political parties, religious faith, or anything else that might divide the people of Nashville and Tennesseans in general. "What I see now is that we too often maximize our differences and minimize the similarities. There are people who love to create division and chaos," DeBerry said. "But if I have a seat at the table, I have a responsibility to build consensus and listen to everyone from across the state."

A Faith Background

DeBerry was raised in a Christian home and was surrounded by Christian pastors and leaders. His father preached for more than 60 years and today DeBerry himself is pastor at Coleman Avenue Church of Christ in Memphis

DeBerry felt the call to ministry when he was young and has been in the pulpit since he was 17 years old. "I dreamed about being a preacher from an early age, and I studied under my dad's feet," he said. "Today I always go home every week and preach."

DeBerry's father, grandfather, and great grandfather preached; both of his brothers are preachers, one brother-in-law is a preacher, and a son is a deacon as are nephews.

While his professional background is in business and marketing (and now he works in politics), DeBerry has worked as a bi-vocational pastor for his entire adult life. It's an example he saw from his father—and one that still inspires him as he works in both ministry and public service.

"I've always been a working preacher, and my dad was that way too," he explained. "He was a veteran who worked at the post office and also preached. My background is in radio and television and I established a marketing firm in the 1990s that's still operating." According to DeBerry, that multifaceted life and career makes him more effective in all corners of his life.




"It keeps me grounded and makes me a better minister," he said. "Straying involved in politics, public policy, and business keeps me better connected to people. Everyone has a lot going on and I can understand their lives better because I see it from different viewpoints."

A word he uses often in describing his ministerial and political work is "blessed." "Faith is the foundation of everything, and I'm very blessed," he said. "It all goes back to my great grandparents, grandparents, and parents. They led the way for me and my family."

DeBerry said that his faith and worth are inseparable. He truly can't do one without the other. "If you don't have a Christian or spiritual basis...if you don't believe in something bigger than yourself and trust a wisdom greater than your own, then I don't see how you can be an effective public servant," DeBerry said, noting that the constitution of Tennessee recognizes God and faith. "The word of God," he said "is the basis for it."

In his past political work as a state representative, as well as his current work on the governor's cabinet, DeBerry said that he recognizes that his constituents are primarily Bible-believing people who have conservative and moderate values. They've always understood his values and he's fought for them even when he's felt pushback for it.

That, he said, is key in political power—to recognize what those whom you serve expect from you and to respect their needs and wants from their representatives. As a Christian serving other Christians, his faith is key in that work.



Political Work in Tennessee

DeBerry was first elected in 1995 and went on to serve for 26 years as a member of the state house of representatives as a Democratic lawmaker. During his career, he chaired committees on children and family and served on health and finance committees.

After coming out in favor of the state's "heartbeat bill" and against abortion, DeBerry was decertified by Democratic leadership and invited by Lee to serve in his cabinet. DeBerry said he has no animosity about his decertification,

instead insisting that his constituents understood his conservative beliefs on certain issues and looking to the positives from the move.

"The people who elected me knew I believed in a creator, in life, and in parental responsibilities and authority," he said. "I campaigned on these issues, so it wasn't my district that disagreed with me. They understood my heart and where I stood."

When Lee invited him to serve on his staff, DeBerry saw it as an opportunity to bring people together. "He offered me this position in his cabinet specifically to utilize my experience with members of the house of representatives and my ability to build bridges across the aisle," he said. "My goal always is to get public input and work for what's best for our people."

DeBerry said he recognized the governor as a fellow Christian and family man who had similar experiences as himself. They both had lost wives and raised children for years on their own.

He prayed about the job invitation from Lee and decided to take the step and accept the position. It's one that has vastly enriched his life and faith—especially as he meets the people of Tennessee and learns about their lives and struggles.

DeBerry is the first African American in the history of the state to have an office on the first floor of the state building, and he treasures the opportunity to meet with and serve the other diverse members of the state and local communities.


"The governor uses me as an ambassador, and I talk with different groups, different ethnic groups, people from different backgrounds, even different political groups and individuals," he said. "I've been very blessed to work with Native Americans, African Americans, African, Latinos, and others. It's a privilege to sit in this office, represent the governor, and serve all of our people."

Love of Family

DeBerry's pride in and love for his family is evident, and it guides both his ministerial and political work. He met his wife in college at Freed-Hardeman University in 1972 and were married for almost 45 years. He lost her in 2015 after she suffered a stroke. He and his wife had two daughters, Chevida (who is an attorney and married to a doctor in Memphis) and Victoria (who also lives in the Memphis area). His extended family includes two brothers and numerous nieces and nephews.

"My daughters are wonderful children and I have very good grandkids. I'm very proud of them," DeBerry said. "My daughters both look like my wife, and I see her strength in them."

DeBerry was raised in a strong Christian family and had what he considered three sets of parents—his parents, grandparents, and great grandparents—who lived in houses side by side. "I had three different generations who were strong, resilient, and took no excuses even in the days of segregation," he said.

His dad worked with Martin Luther King Jr and was with him at Pettus Bridge and at his last speech in Memphis. His mother campaigned against abortion, and both parents instilled in DeBerry the passion for public service and standing up for the underserved without a need for recognition.

"My Dad was one of the many unnamed faces in the crowd during the civil rights movement, and he was there for the work, not the recognition," he said. "He taught me that it's not about myself, it's about the job. It's about making the world better."

Before his father died, he reminded DeBerry that they shared a name ("He told me all the time, 'Don't mess up my name'") and he reminded him that there was a better place waiting for Christians. "I kept those words close to my heart," he said.

A Call to Unity

DeBerry's message to Tennesseans is that "we are more similar than we are different." In his work at the governor's office in Nashville, and from his pulpit in Memphis, DeBerry stresses that working together is key to a better future.

He bemoans the fact that people on different sides of the political and religious spectrums are unable to be friendly with one another. In the past, he said, people could disagree and still be friends. "Sometimes you won, sometimes you lost, but it wasn't personal. Now things are so personal, divisive, and toxic," he said. "When we lose sight of what God wants us to be, that's when we create division."





Biblical Look at Modern Gender Dynamics

In today's culture, conversations about respect between men and women often turn combative. Many people argue that men are solely responsible for how they treat women, regardless of circumstances. While men are absolutely accountable for their actions, the Bible also teaches that behavior, character, and self-respect matter for everyone. Ignoring this has contributed to a culture where mutual respect is breaking down.

Scripture consistently emphasizes modesty, wisdom, and self-control as foundations for healthy relationships. In 1 Timothy 2:9–10 (NIV), Paul writes, "Women should adorn themselves in respectable apparel, with modesty and self-control... with what is proper for women who profess godliness." This verse is not about shaming women or policing their bodies; rather, it highlights the idea that how someone presents themselves communicates values. When modesty and dignity are dismissed as outdated or oppressive, it becomes easier for others to respond without seriousness or respect.

Modern culture often encourages women to seek validation through sexualization, social media attention, and outward rebellion against traditional values. While this may feel empowering in the short term, the Bible warns that chasing approval in this way can lead to harm. Proverbs 11:22 (NIV) states, "Like a gold ring in a pig's snout is a beautiful woman without discretion." The verse is blunt, but the message is clear: beauty without wisdom or self-respect loses its value. When discretion is absent, people begin to treat others as disposable rather than honorable.



This does not excuse men who act disrespectful. The Bible is clear that men are commanded to act with honor. Ephesians 5:25 calls men to love sacrificially, and 1 Peter 3:7 instructs them to treat women with understanding and respect. However, Scripture also teaches personal responsibility. Galatians 6:7 (NIV) says, "Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap." Actions, attitudes, and choices shape how others respond, even when that response is not morally justified.

Respect thrives when both men and women uphold standards of character. Titus 2 encourages women to be "self-controlled, pure, and kind," not as a limitation but as a strength. When women model confidence rooted in integrity rather than attention-seeking behavior, they set expectations for how they should be treated.

Ultimately, the Bible calls everyone to rise above cultural chaos. Respect is not demanded through entitlement; it is cultivated through conduct. Reclaiming biblical principles does not mean returning to oppression, but restoring dignity, accountability, and mutual honor in a culture that desperately needs all three..

PARENTING POINTS

Teaching Generous Giving Throughout the Year

I know you have been generous with Christmas gifts, food, support for ministries, help for the homeless, nonprofits, and more. And God sees all of that. But how can we as parents teach our kids to hold things loosely and keep giving throughout the year?

Our actions and words model generosity. If you say you are generous, but they never see you give, what does that imply? Share with older kids whom you give to monthly. If you feel comfortable, show them how much you give, and ask them to keep this information confidential.

Start small. For younger kids, help them choose one toy to donate and suggest cleaning or sanitizing it first. (Make repairs if needed.) Take them with you to the donation site. If your child received a duplicate gift, recommend giving it away or getting a refund. What if they used that money to buy canned goods for a food pantry? Help them see that people are still hungry in January.



Clear out your closets and drawers. I bet there are plenty of outgrown or unused clothes that someone else could use. Do you know a struggling family? A single mom?

Does your child receive an allowance? Teach them to set aside a portion of the money in a savings jar or envelope. Let them choose how and to whom they will give the money.

Think of sharing time and talents. Impress on your children that giving isn't solely about money. Does your child have a talent or time to share? Maybe your teenager could babysit for free or spend time with an elderly neighbor. Does your child play an instrument to perform for a nursing home or a home-bound individual?

Help your child discover the joy in giving. After they have given away one or more items, talk about the experience. How did it feel when you first approached them about giving? How did you feel after leaving the item with someone else?

Most importantly, pray that God would transform your child's heart into a generous one.

Beyond the Wrapping Paper: Using Christmas Toys to Teach God's Word

This is the key to raising strong disciples! Deuteronomy 6:6-7: "These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

So, how do we bring God's Word alive for our little ones? The answer is beautifully simple: children absorb truth best through their favorite activity—play! As we integrate Scripture into the toys and games that already make their faces light up, we're not simply instructing them. We're crafting powerful memories that will anchor their faith for generations. Einstein understood this when he said play is the highest form of research. Here are practical ideas to transform playtime into faith-building moments.

When Your Child Builds with Blocks

I've watched my own children's faces light up as they stack towers high, and I've learned these are perfect moments to share how Nehemiah rallied God's people to rebuild Jerusalem's walls. As their little hands work, ask them, "Why do you think God wanted everyone to work together?" Let them act it out, making those ancient walls real in your living room. Abstract faith becomes something they can touch and understand. Also, you can purchase biblical Legos!

Transforming Toys into Teaching Tools

Your child's stuffed animals can become the creatures marching onto Noah's ark, two by two. Those action figures? They're suddenly David, standing courageously before a giant. I've discovered that when my children physically reenact these stories, something profound happens—they don't just hear about faith, they live it. What their hands do, their hearts remember.

Creating Art with the Creator

While your little one colors or paints, talk about how God filled creation with breathtaking colors. Share the story of Joseph's special coat or Noah's rainbow of promise. Ask wonder-filled questions: "What colors do you think God painted in the Garden of Eden?" Every crayon stroke becomes a celebration of God as the ultimate Artist.

Playing Kitchen, Learning Faith

During pretend cooking time, tell about God's miraculous meals, and how manna appeared each morning in the wilderness, Jesus multiplying bread and fish, or the widow whose oil jar never emptied. Wonder aloud together: "How do you think that little boy felt when Jesus used his lunch to feed so many people?"

The Joy of This Approach

When we integrate Bible stories and prayer into play, something beautiful unfolds. Our children naturally absorb God's character. Their curious questions—"Why did God do that?" or "Was she scared?"—show us their hearts are truly engaging with Scripture, not just memorizing facts. Building faith in young hearts requires patience, consistency, and abundant grace. Start small, stay steady, and trust that these faithful moments are planting seeds that will bloom for generations.




Churches and the Crises They Face

The reputations of churches today are just one crisis away from being destroyed. Yet, an overwhelming majority of churches are unprepared to manage even the slightest level of hostility that is becoming more prevalent in American culture.

Harsh statement? Maybe, but hopefully a wake-up call also. After more than 20 years in crisis communications and media relations, I can confidently say there are two types of organizations: those that have faced a crisis and those whose crisis hasn't happened yet.

When things go wrong, organizations without a plan often suffer significant reputational damage — sometimes irreparable — in a matter of minutes. Why are so many churches unprepared? Often, it's because no one anticipates a crisis. Some adopt a "we'll deal with it if it happens" mentality. Others recognize the need for a plan but don't know where to start or lack the staff and resources to create one. Whatever the reason, preparation must become a priority.

I've helped church pastors, and leadership teams navigate crises involving sexual abuse allegations, financial scandals, moral failures, social media attacks, false accusations, church fires, and more. While the number of churches in crisis at any given time is statistically small compared to the total number of churches affiliated with the Tennessee Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention, the question remains: What if the church in crisis is your church?

Every crisis presents an opportunity for a positive outcome. Preparation and execution often determine the result, and it all starts with being ready. So, are you prepared? Here are five basic steps to help your church absorb the initial blow of a crisis and build a foundation for survival.

Step 1: Embrace reality

Crises can arise from anything — a sidewalk trip-and-fall, a youth bus accident, or even a church shooting. Start by identifying potential crises your church could face. Too often, leaders dismiss crises as minor inconveniences that will resolve themselves. Reality check: The organizational landscape is littered with leaders who lost their positions because they failed to take crises seriously. Manage the crisis, or it will manage you.

Step 2: Define roles and responsibilities

When a crisis hits, who needs to respond, and what will they do? One person



cannot manage a crisis alone. Proverbs 11:14 reminds us there is safety and wisdom in a multitude of advisors. Assign specific roles: Who will serve as the spokesperson? Who will monitor social media? Who will gather the latest information? Who will contact families if someone is injured? Who will handle logistics, like meals, if the crisis requires extended engagement? Confusion escalates quickly when roles and responsibilities are unclear and people are under the pressure of a crisis.

Step 3: Practice preparedness

Once you've identified a crisis response team and assigned roles, practice. Walk through "what if" scenarios based on the potential crises you identified in Step 1. For example, "What if someone falls?" or "What if there's a camp accident?" "What if there is a social media attack?" Preparation through practice reduces confusion and ensures everyone knows their roles.

Step 4: Craft your message

Every crisis is unique, but your church's mission and values should guide your communication. Develop foundational talking points that reflect your church's ministry and can be adapted to different scenarios. These points will serve as the bedrock for your messaging during a crisis.

Step 5: Don't overlook the front desk

The receptionist answering the phone or greeting visitors is often the most uninformed person during a crisis. Yet, they are among the most critical. They are often the first point of contact for anyone reaching out to the church. Assign someone to keep the receptionist updated with the latest information and equip them with clear instructions on how to respond to inquiries.

There's much more to crisis management than these five steps. However, without these fundamentals, the rest won't matter.

A crisis can torpedo a church and its leadership in minutes — or it can be an opportunity to solidify your place in the community. The outcome depends on how well you manage the crisis.

Cleaning Schedule For Working Moms and Dads

3. Wash Toys With Ease

If you have young children, there are two easy ways to wash those germ-ridden toys they love. You can put all the toys in the dishwasher and wash them through a cycle. Or, wash them on a delicate cycle in the washing machine. Washing your children's toys once a week will reduce the amount of germs they accumulate and hopefully keep them from getting sick.

Evangelism with Confidence: Calvin's Call to Proclaim—and Ours

Where I Stand

In a world full of theological tension, I find myself somewhere between Calvinism and Arminianism. I believe God knows our choices before we're born—but knowing isn't forcing. We still choose. And that choice matters. I've known people who wrestled with faith. Some said, "I've got time—I'll sow my oats first." Others denied Christ outright. I've seen deathbed conversions that shook me to the core. And I've asked: What if no one had shared the Word with them? What if we stayed silent?

The Call to Proclaim

Scripture is clear—and urgent:

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations..."

— Matthew 28:19–20

"How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in Him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching?"

— Romans 10:14–15

John Calvin believed that evangelism was essential. Though he taught that salvation is by God's sovereign election, he also insisted that preaching the gospel is the ordained means by which God calls His elect. Calvin didn't know who the elect

were—so he preached to all. He trained missionaries, sent pastors into hostile regions, and preached regularly in Geneva. His theology didn't hinder outreach—it fueled it. That's not contradiction. That's confidence.

The Weight of Silence

If we don't share the gospel, are we responsible for those who never hear?

- For those near us—yes, we bear a burden. We are called to be salt and light.

- For hidden communities—we may not be personally responsible, but the Church collectively is. Missions matter. Outreach matters.

- For those taken suddenly—accidents, violence, illness—these remind us that time is not guaranteed. Evangelism must be urgent, not casual.

"The Lord is not slow to fulfill His promise... but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance."

— 2 Peter 3:9

"You will be My witnesses... to the ends of the earth."

— Acts 1:8

"If you do not warn the wicked... his blood I will require at your hand."

Evangelism Beyond the Pulpit



PARENTING POINTS

How to Talk with Your Child about a Book You've Never Read (and Why You Should Try It!)

Years ago, I bribed my then-teenage son with Cardinals tickets to read my favorite novel. As we began the drive to St. Louis, I looked forward to hearing all these insights bubbling out of him. But the book that began unfolding from his mind was like a house with no furniture. He was looking forward to the trip and the game, but the book held no joy for him! He had dutifully kept his end of the bargain. But the proud parent in me had forgotten what the teacher had learned long ago. Regardless of intelligence, reflection is not automatic. Some assembly is required along the way!



When kids are very young, we're often reading with them. As kids get older and more independent, asking about their reading gives them a chance to pull their own thoughts and feelings together as they make deeper sense of what they've read. Here are four conversation starters you can use, even if you've never read the book!

What in this story is grabbing your attention? This is a great entry point because it tells you as much about your child as about the book! As she speaks, listen for emotions: Did this part make her feel sad, angry, excited, or maybe surprised? If you ask this question frequently, you'll get a feel over time for how your child reads.

What in this story is reminding you of something in your life? Most kids like to picture things in their minds as they read. To them, a barn in the story might look like the barn down your road.

What character in this story you would want to be... or NOT want to be? Characters are people, and we all know people! Kids who struggle with many things about reading often find traction here.

What in this story do you wish you could change? This question engages the imagination and reasoning together. Could this story happen in a different time or place and still be the same story? Listen especially for complaints about "boring" parts or disappointing endings. When something in a story seems pointless to us, that's often where we're missing pieces we need to understand and enjoy it more fully.

When kids read, they're often looking for things they can connect to personally. For example, a boy who's reading for action may pass right over a character's thoughts and feelings... and miss how those are about to shape the action that happens next! Often reading improves as we begin to ask ourselves new questions, especially questions like "Why do you think this person did this thing?". When we engage with kids about what they're reading, we're not only showing them that their reading matters but also modeling the curiosity that helps make reading better.

TEACHABLE MOMENTS

Charlie Kirk Part II: The Call to New Evangelization

Last month, I offered a comprehensive review of Charlie Kirk, an extraordinary individual whose writings and inspirational podcasts have made a significant impact on many of us. Kirk stands out for his brightness, articulation, genuineness, and spirituality, challenging us to renew our understanding of the charge: "Go forth throughout our world and preach (words, actions, kindness, etc.) the good news of the kingdom of God." His influence has touched many in our audience, encouraging a deeper reflection on faith and purpose and meaning.

The Role of Cognitive Behavioral Thinking (CBT)

In Part I, I discussed the importance of Cognitive Behavioral Thinking (CBT) as a foundational change in how we think, believe, and behave. CBT involves shifting from irrational and untruthful thought patterns to a refreshed, rational way of thinking. This transformation leads to clarity, untainted by bias or prejudice, freeing us from narcissism and disengagement from learning, toward a passionate lifelong quest to learn! Such clarity also helps us resist superficial media narratives that promote materialistic values, such as "he/she who wins at life is the one with the most toys at the end of the game."

The Journey of Man: Our Shared Humanity

The second major change which also must happen, is our understanding of humanity's interconnectedness. Referencing the latest scientific research, particularly the work of Dr. Spenser Wells, it has been established that over 99% of human DNA is identical across all people. Wells, a passionate epidemiologist and anthropologist, traveled globally with his team to collect and analyze blood samples, confirming that our differences lie in personality, background, experience, and culture—not in our genetic makeup. His book, *The Journey of Man*, demonstrates that we all come from the same ancestors. Recognizing this truth leads to the realization that we are all brothers and sisters, making it unthinkable to harm one another family member. For further details, I recommend reading my article published in NCM in January 2025.

The True Mission of Christianity

Unlike the times of the Bible, many Christians today find "a comfort zone," within their religious communities, often missing a crucial aspect of their faith: genuine service to others and the active sharing their faith to all they encounter.... Usually with their genuine Christlike behavior and the mantra, "use words only when necessary". Some believe salvation is a one-time achievement, allowing them to rest easy, yet Jesus's command was clear—evangelize the entire world. This directive is not a passive noun but an active verb, calling for motivation and action: "Go everywhere in the world, and tell the Good News to everyone"! (Mark 16:15)

Understanding Our World: Dr. Matthew Kelly's Metaphor

Dr. Matthew Kelly once shared a metaphor to help grasp the vastness and diversity of our world. By envisioning the planet now arriving at 8 billion people, reframe it to a small town of 100 people. This then breakdowns down to: 57 people are from Asia, 21 are from Europe, nine are from Africa, eight are from North America, and five are from South America. Of the 100, 51 would be women and 49 men. Six people would control more than half of the world's wealth—a finding echoed by my friend Og Mandino in his book, *The University of Success*.

Global Realities and Challenges

Further analysis of this world-town reveals stark realities: one person is about to be born, one is about to die, and only seven have attended college. A major



surprise for most of us, only 33 are Christian while 67 are not; 80 live in substandard housing, and astonishingly, 92% have never sat on a commode. Thirty-one cannot read or write, 24 do not have electricity, 71 do not have internet access, and 39 survive on less than two dollars a day.

1/3 of the world is dying from lack of bread, another 1/3 of the world is dying from injustice, and the final third of the world is dying from overeating. This snapshot illustrates the immense challenge facing us as we strive to fulfill our charge to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all corners of the earth. Currently, only one-third of the world's population knows this message, leaving two-thirds unaware of its significance. The focus is not on denominational differences but on uniting as followers of the one Risen Jesus Christ.

The Call to New Evangelization

It is time for each of us to embrace the responsibility with enthusiasm (this word has Greek roots meaning "God within"). The mandate is clear: we must rise to the occasion and actively share the good news with everyone. This movement is now recognized as the New Evangelization—a call to action for all believers to spread faith, hope, and love throughout our world. "Jesus said to his followers, go everywhere in the world, and tell the good news to everyone"! (Mark 16:15)


